Oxford Presbyterian Church was organized in 1840 by Reverend Isaac Hadden. The charter members were:

Elders at the time of organization were Norman Stewart, Solomon Pigford, and Owen Pigford. The Clerk of the Session was Owen Pigford. They had been installed by Reverend Alexander Smith of Livingston, Alabama in 1835. Therefore, the church was in operation by 1835, a year after Lauderdale County was formed. The church more than likely fully organized in 1840, five years later.

The church was later removed to Lauderdale Springs, Mississippi. In accordance with appointment by Reverends G. W. Boggs and W. C. Emerson, the members of Oxford Church met at Lauderdale Springs Church on April 25, 1857 and organized with the officers of Oxford serving in their same capacity. Three years later, Oxford Church was reorganized with twenty three members in the same location as the first church, ten miles west of York, Alabama near the Mississippi-Alabama state line. The former officers served as elders with the addition of William New and William H. Pigford.

Delegates attended Presbytery, records were presented to that body and a Sunday School was organized. Reverend C. M. Hutton and Reverend Samuel J. Bingham, early ministers of Oxford Church, were among the most prominent ministers of the 19th century.

One of the most prominent meetings held at Oxford Church was the one hundredth anniversary, on May 11, 1940. Serving as minister at the time of this event was the Reverend James D. Carter. Most of the families of charter members were represented with very few exceptions.

During World War II eight of Oxford's young men served their country. One, W. C. Frazier, gave his life on December 15, 1943, somewhere in England.

The Oxford Presbyterian Church building was erected in 1900 in the same location as the old church. The pulpit has been vacant since and regular services are no longer held, At one time, Oxford Church was one of a group of five active churches Cuba, Coatopa, Elizabeth, Hadden, and Oxford.

OXFORD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

When Lauderdale County was first formed on December 23, 1833, the old territorial headquarters office of the Mississippi Territory was located near what is known today as Courthouse Hill. Courthouse Hill is located in close proximity to the Oxford Church. This general area was one of the first areas of Lauderdale County to become populated by white people due to the protection afforded by territorial headquarters.

The new arrivals paid little or no attention to the state line with Mississippi residents often voting in Alabama and Alabama residents voting in Mississippi.

Thus we have the setting for the constitution of the Oxford Church in 1840. No doubt the members held earlier meetings. It is known that the Presbyterians were in the area (Mississippi Territory) by 1824 as they established the first school in the area, a school for the Choctaw Indian children near the present location of the U. S. Naval Air Station.

The church experienced members from both the State of Alabama and the State of Mississippi.

One of the earliest families to become part of the church were the Pigfords from Hanover County, North Carolina.

THE PIGFORDS

The Pigfords who settled in the Oxford Church area were descendants of Lost Billie Pigford. The parents of Lost Billie were lost in a storm as their ship was approaching the coast of North Carolina. Lost Billie was saved and was raised by a Dutch Family who gave him the name Lost Billie.

Lost Billie married a Dutch girl and they lived in New Hanover County in North Carolina. Lost Billie died there in 1803. His children were:

1. William Pigford, Jr. - born in 1762. The name of his first wife is unknown. He lived in his father's household. He married second to Hannah? . In 1850 he was 88 years old. He was the father of Susan who married James Newton and a son, Solomon. William Pigford, Jr. remained in North Carolina.

2. Elizabeth - no information.

3. Martha (Patsy) - no information.

4. Daughter - name unknown.

5. John Edward - born 1778 and died April 14, 1863, buried in New Hanover County, North Carolina.

6. Margaret - no information.

7. Timothy = born about 1790, married Elizabeth Wells in Duplin County, North Carolina. Timothy died in Duplin County about 1823 before his last child and namesake was born. Elizabeth and the children re-moved to Lauderdale County, Mississippi and lived in the Toomsaba area. Elizabeth died in 1848 and is buried in the Pigford Cemetery near Toomsaba.

8. Solomon - born 1784 and died in Lauderdale County on May 26, 1857. He married Jerusha (Lucinda?). He is buried in Oxford Cemetery. Jerusha was in her son William's household in 1860 at the age of 75. Owen, a son, married his first cousin Sarah Marie, daughter of Jacob Pigford, and moved to Lauderdale County at the age of 54 years. He is probably buried in the Oxford Cemetery. He was in the area of Oxford Church by 1835.

9. Jacob - whose wife's name was Judith Ardette? was in Lauderdale County in 1850 at the age of 85 and is probably buried in the Oxford Cemetery. He was in the area of Oxford Church by 1835. One of his sons, Jacob Owen, married Mary McMillian and removed to Texas after the death of his father. He died in Texas on November 12, 1926. It was this man who homesteaded in Madison County, Texas and who carried the name of the old Oxford Cemetery to that location. Jacob Owen deeded land for a Presbyterian Church and cemetery there by the name of Oxford.

A number of Pigford families returned to North Carolina after being in Lauderdale County, Mississippi for a brief time.

While one is unable to find the graves of Jacob and Solomon, early settlers, in the Oxford Church Cemetery, they no doubt were early members of the church. If a son of Jacob, Jacob Owen, felt obliged to name a church in Texas after the Oxford Church, then we can rest assured that he, along with his father, were members of and held dear the memory of their old church.

One of the descendants of Jacob Pigford is Dan W. Brown, Exploration Manager for the New Zealand Petroleum Company, P. O. Box 586, Wellington, New Zealand.

Cornelia Pigford, daughter of Jacob Owen Pigford and granddaughter of Jacob Pigford, was Dan W. Brown's great-grandmother. Cornelia's mother was Mary McMillian. Jacob Owen Pigford is buried in Pearsall, Texas while his wife, Mary, is buried in Madisonville, Texas.

Cornelia married Washington Moody Mathis in Texas. W. M. Moody was a brother to Frederick Mathis who removed to Texas in 1858 from the Alamucha area of Lauderdale County. Cornelia and her husband Washington Moody were at one time sheep ranchers near Sonora, Texas.

The Pigfords, Mathis and Moody families all removed to Texas as a group in the late 1850's.

OXFORD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
Minutes of the Session

It is regretted that the first minutes of the Oxford Church burned for they would have told the real story of this little church in the wilderness at a time when the county was first being formed. There possibly was an original cemetery that contains the graves of these early settlers but it has been lost perhaps forever over a period of time.

Oxford Presbyterian Church can be recognized as one of the first, if not the first, churches in operation in the infant years of Lauderdale County.

The following pages contain the minutes of the Session of Oxford Presbyterian Church and membership lists from the years 1914 through 1931.

OXFORD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
MINUTES OF THE SESSION

November 8, 1914

In the year 1913, the dwelling of the Clerk of the Session, Mr. J. B. Pankey, burned thus destroying the old church records.

Hence, the need for reconstructing the history of Oxford Church, as best we could, from memory.

About the year 1837, the church was organized by Reverend Duncan A. Campbell of North Carolina.

The succession of pastors and supplies of the church have been approximately as follows: Duncan A. Campbell, W. B. Bingham, Robert H. Hall, C. M. Hutton, W. H. Smith, W. A. Mars, Going(?) B. Strickland, B. F. Peters, Chevalier(?), R. S. Lattimer, J. T. West, N. B. Doyle, W. H. White, and W. E. Smith.

The elders at the organization were Messrs. Owen Pigford, William H. Pigford and Norman Stewart.

The following also served as elder in the early days of the church: Hugh Campbell, Thomas J. Miller, Ed W. Morgan Thomas Clay, Dan McNeal, Albert Silliman, John W. Morgan, I. J. Bond, W. J. Barrett, J. B. Pankey, H. G. Danner, L. E. Cobb and R. N. Wilder.

The succession of deacons were as follows: John Dove, M. J. Dove, I. J. Bond, William H. Pigford, James (Jacob?) Pigford, R. N. Wilder, O. J. Wilder, William R. Nunnery, John D. Rhaly, Robert C. McElroy, William Eakens, James E. Bond and Frank P. Wilder.

April 12, 1914

The session met in the church. Present were Elder Hugh G. Danner and the pastor, Reverend William H. White.

Elder I. J. Bond was selected as principal representative and the other elders as alternate representatives to Presbytery to meet in the Cuba Presbyterian Church which will be the first service in the new church building.

Our church records having been burned in the burning of the house of our clerk of the session, Brother J. B. Pankey, efforts are being made to gather data from which to preface these minutes with a historical outline of the church from the organization.

The annual spring reports to Presbytery had been made and were adopted and directed to be sent up to Presbytery. See below.

These minutes were approved. Opened and closed with prayer. William H. White, Pastor, C. S.

August 28, 1914

The session met in the church during a protracted meeting. Present were Reverend William H. White, pastor, and Elders, I. J. Bond and W. J. Barrett.

The following persons were received into membership of the church on confession of faith in Christ; Annie Eliza Barrett and Sarah Louise Brynes.

Opened and closed with prayer. William H. White, Moderator

October 11, 1914

The session met in the church. Present were the pastor, and Elders I. J. Bond, W. J. Barrett and J. B. Pankey.

Previous public announcement had been made that on this day two additional elders and two additional deacons would be elected in the church, which was done.

The election resulted in the choice of Luther E. Cobb and Robert N. Wilder, as elders and James E. Bond and Frank P. Wilder as deacons, who having accepted the respective offices were ordained and installed before the congregation. The pastor had previously that day preached a sermon on church government.

At their request, letters were granted to Elder Ed W. Morgan and his wife, Mrs. Josephine Morgan.

Elder I. J. Bond was elected principal and L. E. Cobb alternate representative to the next meeting of Presbytery at Hadden Church.

Elder J. B. Pankey was elected principal and W. J. Barrett alternate representative to the next meeting of the Synod of Alabama at Birmingham, Alabama on November 10th. Opened and closed with prayer. William H. White, Moderator

January 10, 1915

The session met in the church. Present were Elders I. J. Bond, L. E. Cobb, R. N. Wilder and the pastor, William H. White.

Upon application a letter was granted to Mrs. Pearl Dove Griffin to be placed in the Second Presbyterian Church of Meridian; Mississippi.

After the morning sermon, the pastor read his resignation of the pastorate of the church to take effect on or before the 1st of July, 1915. Accordingly, the session authorized the calling of a congregational meeting which was done for the morning service of the 2nd sabbath of February to take action upon the above resignation.

Opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

February 14, 1915

The session met at the church. Present were Reverend William H. White and Elders I. J. Bond, L. E. Cobb and R. N. Wilder. At the request of Mrs. Bertha Barrett Allen for a letter to First Presbyterian Church of Meridian, Mississippi was granted, session was closed with prayer as there was no action taken on the resignation of the pastor, Reverend William H. White. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

June 13, 1915

Session met in the church. Present were the pastor, Reverend W. H. White, and Elders Bond, Cobb, Pankey and Wilder. Also present were Elders Dial and Elliott of Hadden Church. At his request Mr. John T. Tucker was granted a letter to any Presbyterian Church in Meridian, Mississippi.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

October 10, 1916

Session met in the church. Present were the pastor, Reverend J. S. Jennings, and Elders I. J. Bond, Cobb, Wilder, and Barrett. I. J. Bond was elected to represent us at Presbytery which convenes at Central Church. Session opened and closed with prayer. J. S. Jennings, Pastor R. N. Wilder, C. S.

April 9, 1916

Session met in the church. Present were the Pastor, J. S. Jennings, and Elders I. J. Bond, R. N. Wilder, Barrett and Cobb. Barrett was elected to represent us at Presbytery which will convene at York, Alabama on April 11th. J. S. Jennings, Pastor R. N. Wilder, C. S.

May 13, 1917

Session met in church. Elders present were I. J. Bond and R. N. Wilder. Session was opened with prayer by Reverend H. M. Jenkins. By request letters were granted to W. W. Davis to 4th Presbyterian Church, Meridian, Mississippi. Also letter to Mr. J. A. Morgan to Presbyterian Church at Lauderdale, Mississippi. Session closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 15, 1917

Session met in the church. Elders Barrett, Bond, Cobb, and Wilder were present. By their request, church letters were granted to J. Percy Barrett to Presbyterian Church at Dodge City, Kansas and to Mrs. E. M. Allen to 2nd Presbyterian Church, Meridian, Mississippi. Also church letters to H. G. Danner, Mrs.

Minnie Danner and Miss Susie Danner to the Presbyterian Church at Lauderdale, Mississippi. Session opened and closed with prayer by Reverend Patridge. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

March 3, 1918

Session met and granted church letter to Mrs. Iva Cobb to Central Presbyterian Church of Tuscaloosa Presbytery. Elders present were Bond, Cobb and Wilder. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

December 29, 1918

Session granted Robert D. Campbell letter to Lauderdale Presbyterian Church at Lauderdale, Mississippi. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 11, 1920

Session of Oxford Church met with Pastor W. E. Snipes, and Elders Barrett, Cobb, Bond and Wilder, present. Church letters were granted by their request to Mr. Joe Barefield, Mrs. Ada Barefield, Miss Annie M. Barefield to Cuba Presbyterian. Session closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

August 8, 1920

Session of Oxford church met. Present were the pastor and Elders Barrett, Bond, Cobb and Wilder. Letter granted to Miss Blanche Campbell to York Presbyterian Church. Also, letter granted to Mrs. Nettie M. Cobb to Central Presbyterian Church. Closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

October 8, 1922

Session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met with Reverend H. McDowell, Moderator. Elders present were I. J. Bond, L. E. Cobb, and R. N. Wilder. L. E. Cobb was chosen as a delegate to Presbytery and I. J. Bond as alternate. Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

March 11, 1923

Session at church, before morning worship. Present were Ruling Elders I. J. Bond, W. J. Barrett, L. E. Cobb and R. N. Wilder and Reverend Hervey McDowell, Moderator. The deacons were invited to sit with the session. It was ordered that the regular preaching day of Oxford Church be changed from the 2nd Sabbath of each month to the 4th Sabbath of each month, if it should work satisfactorily. Closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

April 5, 1923

Session met at the residence of Ruling Elder, R. N. Wilder. Opened with prayer. Present were Ruling Elders, I. J. Bond and R. N. Wilder and Reverend Hervey McDowell, Moderator. Elder L. E. Cobb was elected to represent the church at the Spring Meeting of Presbytery to be held at Uniontown April 10, at 7:30 PM. Elder W. J. Barrett will be the alternate. The following report (page missing)

July 28, 1925

Session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met to receive Louise Campbell Dial into the church. Present were Reverend Hervey McDowell, and Elders I. J. Bond, L. E. Cobb, and W. J. Barrett. Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 29, 1925

Session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met to receive Marcus McClain Bond, Ray Thaddeus Cobb, Luther Earl Cobb, Jr., Jennie Ola Cobb, James Russell Dial, Malcolm Wilder Bond, Margaret Hinton Gunter, Helen Miller Wilder, Daisy Grey Wilder and James Lee Gunter into the church. Present, were Reverend Hervey McDowell, pastor and L. E. Cobb and I. J. Bond, Elders. Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 30, 1925

Session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met to receive Jackson Honeycutt into the church. Present were Reverend Hervey McDowell, pastor and Elders, I. J. Bond and L. E. Cobb. Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

September 25, 1927

The session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met after the morning service. Elders Messrs. Robert Wilder, Luther Cobb and Evie Bond present. Reverend P. H. Biddle, moderator. Letters of W. J. Barrett and Henry Barrett were granted to Lauderdale Presbyterian Church.

Elder Luther Cobb was elected to attend Synod at Memphis, Tennessee.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 26, 1927

The session of Oxford Presbyterian Church met after the morning service. Elders Messrs. Luther Cobb and Evie Bond were present. Reverend P. H. Biddle, Moderator. Mrs. Estella Wedgeworth and Roy Cobb were received upon confession of faith in Jesus Christ.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

November 27, 1927

Session of Oxford Church met after the morning session. Elders Evie Bond and Luther Cobb were present and Reverend P. H. Biddle, Moderator. The letter of Mrs. Lydia Allen was granted to Toomsaba Church.

Session was opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S. March 25, 1928

Session of Oxford Church met after the morning services at the church. Elders Evie Bond, Luther Cobb and Robert Wilder. Moderator, Reverend P. H. Biddle. Mr. Robert Wilder was elected to attend Presbytery at Greensboro, Alabama. The report to Presbytery was approved.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

July 19, 1928

The session of Oxford Church met during the morning service. Elders Luther Cobb and Iva Bond and Moderator P. H. Biddle were present. Miss Willie Belle McElroy was received into the church on confession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

The session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

March 17, 1929

The session of Oxford Church met after the morning service. Elders present, Luther Cobb, I. J. Bond and R. N. Wilder and Moderator, Reverend P. H. Biddle.

Elder I. J. Bond was elected to the Spring Presbytery at Oxford Church.

The Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

Approved Presbytery, Oxford, Alabama, April 10, 1929. O. W. Wardlow Moderator

October 19, 1930

The session of Oxford Church met at the close of the afternoon sermon which was delivered by Reverend A. S. McClanrock.

The session in due form ordained Mr. Coleman Dial as an elder in Oxford Church. Visiting elders who assisted were Reverends J. M. Partridge and A. S. McClanrock and J. J. Wimberly of Cuba Church and J. T. Ross of York Church.

Elders of Oxford Church present were Eva Bond, Luther Cobb and R. N. Wilder, and Moderator, Reverend P. H. Biddle.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

August 19, 1931

The session of Oxford Church met during the evening service. Present were the moderator, Reverend P. H. Biddle and Elders, R. N. Wilder and Coleman Dial.

Coleman Dial, Jr. was received into the church on confession of faith in Jesus Christ.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.

August 21, 1931

The session of Oxford Church met during the afternoon service. Present were the moderator, Reverend P. H. Biddle and Elders, Coleman Dial, Iva Bond and Luther Cobb.

Cathalene Shelby was received into the church on confession of faith in Jesus Christ.

Mrs. Mary Kate Rhaley was received by letter from the Second Presbyterian Church of Meridian.

Session opened and closed with prayer. R. N. Wilder, C. S.
