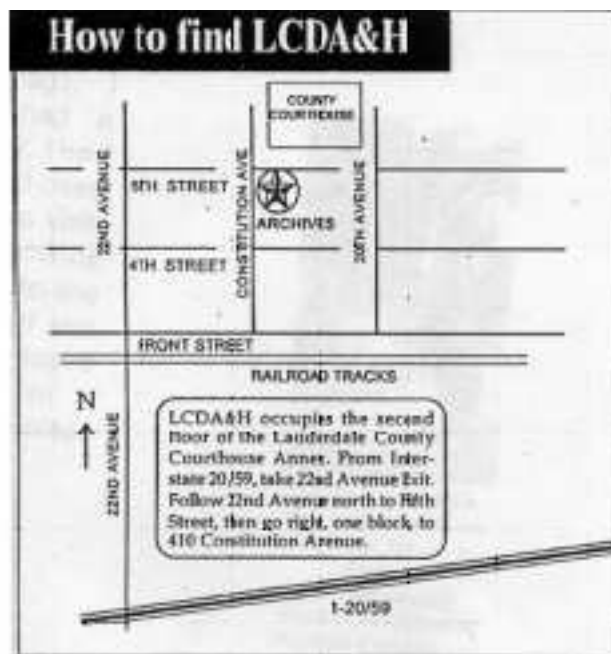

BOOK I
1848-1899

"April 26, 1848

At Mount Horeb Church, we, the undersigned believers, having been baptised upon the sign of our faith, do solomly come and agree to come together in a church capacity for the purpose of observing the laws of the gospel and the mutual benefit of each other and we do hereby pledge ourselves to assist one another in our Christian pilgrimage and to observe the originances of the gospel and so fulfill the law of Christ.

RECORD OF THE CHURCH

October Term 1838

Bro. BUrrell Stinson chosen office of Deacon, by Bros. B. F. Willis, William P. Carter, and M. Wolf.

Oct. Spec. Meeting Bro. Burrell Stinson ordained deacon.

Nov. 1848

Bro. M. Wolfe unanimously chosen a supply brother. Dismissed Sis. Gincy Anderson.

May 1849 Agreed to hold Communion 1st Sunday in July.

July 1849

Received Bro. M. Wolf as Regular Ordained Minister by letter.

Aug. 1849

B. Graham and Burrell Stinson chosen to represent church as delegates to Asso. Convention.
William Clark, Mod.

Oct. 1849

Received Giffered Whitehead by letter.
Received Siller Dearman and Amerilous Graham by experience.
M. Wolfe, Mod./ James O. Rigby, Clerk

July 1850

Chose James O. Rigby, M. Wolf, Benjamin Graham as Asso. delegates, with Burrell Stinson chosen in case of failure.

A complaint came from New Hope Church against Harber (Harbert?) Seavens for drinking. His case was referred until Sept. but he gave satisfaction.

Gilfred Whitehead called for letter of dismissal.

A letter from Long Creek Church requested five members to give council. Benjamin Graham, Jessee Bynum were sent them by moderator, M. Wolf.

Nov. 1850

Harbert Stevens charged with drunkenness and excluded. Choice of supply resulted in choice of M. Wolf, mod.

M. Wolf, Mod.

Dec. 1850

Dismissed Bithend(?) Dearman by letter. M. Wolfe, Mod.

Aug. 1851

Received Elizabeth Nicoless by experience. Association delegates chosen: M. Wolf, O. Rigby and B. Graham M. Wolf, Mod.

Nov. 1851

Received Mary Nicoless, Hiram Nicoless, Elijah Nicoless and Martin Cline by experience. M. Wolfe, Mod.

June 1852

Resolved by Burrel Stinson that feet washing be adopted. Carried. Bro. Stinson reported T. N. Wilkinson of unchristian conduct, to be referred until July for exclusion.

NOTE: At this point the church would be a Primitive Baptist Church. Aug. 1852

Chose M. Wolf, B. Graham as Association delegates, with James O. Rigby being alternate.

Nov. 1852

Complaint arose against Martin Cline for unchristian conduct and language. Referred until April and excluded.

Bro. Stinson charged that T. N. Wilkinson had been swindling and lying, and moved that Church call for members of 3 sister churches to aid us in council. Second by B. Graham. Three members, from Oakey Valley, three from New Hope, and three from Friendship were sent for. Also resolved that Wilkinson be cited at next conferences.

May 1853

Received Sealy Wolf and Acy Loftin by letter.

Case of T. N. Wilkinson brought up and referred to committee from three other churches: Oakey Valley: R. McLemore; J. Blackman, R. Ulmore New Hope: W. N. Jolley; J. O. Rigby; T. Robit Friendship: V. A. Evans, James Daniels, W. M. Bird

The committee, after considering all evidence did not consider T. N. Wilkinson worthy to be a member of the church and considered him guilty of unchristian conduct and language. Its report was read by James O. Rigby and it was adopted by the church.

R. Brown, Mod. B. Grayham, Clerk.

NOTE: The above R. McLemore was Richard McLemore, father of Meridian; the R. Ulmore was Richard Ulmore.

Oakey Valley Church was located where the Willow Ridge Apartments are now located on Highway 195 East from Meridian.

June 1853

A charge was brought up by M. Wolf by himself. Referred until next conference.

Dec. 1853

Received Silvy Oens (Owens?) by letter.

Feb. 1854

Received William Oens by letter.

March 1854

Received Levi Smith by experience and baptism.

May 1854

Restored Bro. H. Wooall (Woodall?)

Aug. 1854

Chose delegates to Asso.: M. Wolfe and Hiram Nichols with B. Grayham, alternate.

Jan. 1855

Hiram Nichols granted letter of dismissal.

"Removal of the church from (taped over) to the new one. Six miles east and located on the road leading from Marion to Enterprise and commenced service there on Saturday before the second Sabbath in Sept. 1856. Church Record commencing with the said meeting."

Sept. 1856

Sat in conference following Divine Service by Bro. Davis, T. B. Townsen and A. Yarbrough.

Miles Stone, Nancy Stone, Josiah Etheredge, Martha Etheredge, Elizabeth Fisher, Sarah Etheredge, were received by letter.

Rachell R. Black, Sister and Samuel R. McIver were received by experience.

Elected delegates to Asso.: Elder M. Wolf, Miles Stone, with B. Grayham, alternate. Asso. Letter was read and adopted.

Asso. requested the church will on the matter of missions. We say we are willing to pay Asso. for the mission subject according to the spirit of a resolution adopted by the Asso. at Fellowship Church in 1854.

Appointed Josiah Etheredge Church Clerk. Elder M. Wolf elected pastor.

M. Wolf, Mod./ B. Grayham, Clerk

Oct. 1856

Divine service by M. Wolf.

B. Wolf came forward with experience and was accepted. Sis. Farechald (Fairchild?) called for letter of dismissal.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

November 1856

Divine service by M. Wolf. Conference held with no new business.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

Dec. 1856

After divine services, W. P. Sone (Stone?) presented his letter and was received into fellowship.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

March 1857

Divine service by M. Wolf.

In conference, the Rules of Decorum was read and the 6th Article was struck out.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

April 1857

Conference held following divine service. Chose J. Etheredge and Miles Stone deacons with their ordination deferred until next conference. N, Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

May 1857

Divine service by A. Yarbrough. Deacons received Ordination by A. Yarbrough and M. Wolf.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

June 1857

Divine service by M. Wolf.

Nancy Roy (Ray?) received into the church and was baptized.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, CC

July 1857

Divine service by M. Wolfe

Elizabeth Bynum came forward by experience and was baptized.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

Aug. 1857

Divine service by Brethren R. Weatherford, Yarbrough and Wolfe. Nancy Wolfe came forward with experience and was baptized.

A complaint was brought up against Hiram Nickoles for drinking and was referred until next conference.

Chas. M. Wolf, J. Etheredge and Miles Stone delegates to next Asso. meeting with W.P. Stone alternating. Agreed to send 5 copies of minutes and \$1.50 for Asso. purposes.

Sept. 1857

After divine services John D. Rasberry presented letter of dismission and was given the right hand of fellowship.

Difference about Hiram Nickoles still referred.

Associational letter presented, read and adopted.

Hardy Yarbrough was chosen with Liberty Church to ordain him.

M. Wolf, Mod. ; J. Etheredge, Clerk

Oct. 1857

Divine services by M. Wolf.

Case of Hiram Nickoles and he was excluded.

M. Wolf, Mod. ; J. Etheredge, Clerk

Dec. 1857

Following divine service, Hardy Yarbrough consented to serve as pastor. Charge of Nancy Roy brought up for behaving in an unchristian manner and she was excluded.

H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Jan. 1858

Divine service by A. Yarbrough and H. Yarbrough.

Bro. Wolf rose and stated that there were reports out against Sis. Amaralious Jackson for dancing. She being present made satisfactory confession and was forgiven.

H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheridge, C.C.

Feb. 1858

Divine service. No new business.

H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

March 1858

Sarah Scarbrough presented a letter of dismission.

April 1858

After divine service Bethany Fisher presented her letter and received right hand of fellowship.

A committee of M. Wolf, B. Grayham and J. Etheredge appointed to reviewing and transcribing the old Church Records into a new one. H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

May 1858

At Conference following divine worship, a difference was found in regard to appointing a committee to transcribing the old church record.

The committee report was read and adopted and the committee was discharged.

Report of the committee:

"Dear Brethren,

We your committee to whom was referred the examination of your Church Record Book beg to leave to report that we have taken the matter into consideration and find many of church acts not recorded and we have digested from the Church Book such things as we thought would be of most importance, while passing over conferences and items that we thought would be of no benefit to ourselves nor to future generations, all of which is respectfully submitted.

June 1858

Conference following divine services; Rules of Decorum were amended, read and adopted.

Hardy Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

July 1858

No conference

Aug. 1858

Following divine service the conference chose delegates to the Asso. Chosen were Elder M. Wolf and J. D. Rasberry with M. Stone, alternate. Agreed to send \$2.15 with a request for 20 copies of minutes.

H. Yarbrough, Mod / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Sept. 1858

After service held by Bro. A. Yarbrough, H. Yarbrough and M. Wolf, the following people came forward by experience: William Waller, Nancy Waller, Collin Dunnam, Susan Stone and D. B. Kelley ans were baptized. Sis. Susan Bynum received by letter and Bro.

Joseph B. Wolfe called for a letter of dismissal. Bro. Martin Cline was restored with the right hand of fellowship being given by the church.

H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Oct. 1858 Divine service. No new business at conference.

Nov. 1858

Following divine service William Waller called for a letter of dismissal. Hardy Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheridge, C.C.

Dec. 1858 Divine service. No new church business.

Jan. 1859

Conference met after divine service. Unfavorable reports brought up against Bro. Samuel R. McEver(?) and he being present gave the church satisfaction. H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Feb. 1859

Church sat in conference following divine service. Bro. M. Stone called for letter of dismissal for Bro. John D. Rasberry but an objection to his having a letter came on account of his leaving this country in an unchristian like manner. It was requested that the clerk write to Bro. Rasberry the reasons why the request was not granted, and also to request an account of his conduct and give the church satisfaction for so doing before his request be granted.

The clerk then called for a letter of dismissal for Sis. Nancy Waller and it was granted.

March 1859

Divine service by M. Wolf and H. Yarborough. Conference brought forth no new business. H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

April 1859

Met in conference following divine service by M. Wolf. Read letter from John D. Rasberry which he wrote in a way of acknowledgement to the church and a request for dismissal. After consideration his letter of dismissal was sent. Sis. Amardory (?) Jackson was given letter of dismissal upon request. M. Wolfe, Mod. pro tem; J. Etheredge, C.C.

May 1859

Following divine services by M. Wolf and H. Yarbrough the church met in conference. Bro. Wolf suggested that a record be made of all the single sisters that have changed their name by marriage. Referred til next meeting. H. Yarbrough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

June 1859

After divine service by A. Yarbrough and M. Wolf conference was held. The church agreed to make a record of those who have changed their name by marriage. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

July 1859 No conference. Dismissed in peace and harmony.
H. Yarbrough, Mod./ J. Etheredge, C.C.

Aug. 1859

Divine services by M. Wolf and H. Yarbrough.

Felix Knight, L. B. Picket, S. D. Stone, John N(?). Alexander, Ida Creek, Felix Raybon, Adaline White Monroe, all came forward with an experience of hope in Christ and were received into the church by baptism.

John D. Rasberry and Amarelory(?) Jackson called for a letter of dismissal.

A colored brother belonging to Mr. Pendleton McDonald and Birts, a colored brother belonging to Mr. Whilock(?) and also received Sis. Elizabeth Creel was received by letter.

M. Wolf, Miles Stone, were appointed Asso. delegates with W. P. Stone alternate. Agreed to send \$2.50 for associational purposes and requested 25 copies of Asso. minutes. The Associational letter was read and approved.

The Asso. last year requested us to express whether we approve the action of last meeting in becoming auxiliary to the Gen. Asso. of Southeastern Mississippi. The church agreed to oppose becoming auxiliary to that Association. H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Sept. 1859

Church conference following sermon by M. Wolf. Rules of Decorum were read, then dismissed in peace and harmony.

M. Wolf, Mod. pro tem / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Oct. 1859

After divine service conference met. Bro. John Watson and wife Nancy Watson and Malissa Grayham presented their letters and

the right hand of fellowship was given by the church. Agreed to make a call for a supply for the ensuing year at next conference. H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Nov. 1859

Conference held following divine service. Call for supply for coming year taken up and was still referred. H. Yarborough, Mod./ J. Etheredge, C. C.

Dec. 1859

Church sat in conference following divine service. Elder M. Wolf was chosen supply and moderator with Bro. J. Etheredge made church clerk. Both being present, they agreed to serve. A charge of unchristian conduct was brought up against Sis. Nancy Wolf and the sister was excluded. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

Jan. 1860

Bro. William P. Stone called for a letter of dismissal.
M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

Feb. 1860

Following divine service conference was held. Charge brought up against Bro. Collin Dunnam for unchristian conduct. He was not present and the clerk was requested to write him a letter informing him of this action and requesting him to come to the next conference to the difficulty against him. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

March 1860

Divine service and conference. Collin Dunnam not present so citation against him was deferred. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

April 1860 All in peace and harmony.

May 1860

Met in conference following divine service. After consideration it was moved and seconded that Collin Dunnam be excluded for drinking, unchristian conduct and non-attendance. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

June 1860

Conference met following divine service. No new business. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

July 1860

Following divine service, Elder M. Wolf and Miles Stone chosen delegates to Asso. meeting with F. Knight being alternate. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

August 1860

Following service, Associational letter was read and adopted.

Agreed to sent \$3.25 for Associational purposes with 25 copies of minutes.

Going to choice of supply for coming year, Hardy Yarborough was unanimously elected and the clerk was requested to inform Bro. Yarborough by letter. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge

September 1860 No conference. All in peace and harmony.

October 1860

At conference following divine services no new business transacted. M. Wolf, Mod./ J. Etheredge, C.C.

November 1860

Divine services. The following sisters presented letters of dismissal: Nancy Jane Elizabeth Walker and Olif Rayburn; and were cordially received into the church.

R. H. Woodal stated that he had been drunk and was guilty of unchristian conduct. After his satisfactory confession was received by the church.

Pastor M. Wolf and Clerk J. Etheredge both being present agreed to serve the church to the best of their ability.

Church agreed to adopt a rule in the Decorum that no male member be absent himself from his seat in conference without permission from the church. Agreed to strike out the 8th Article wherein it states that every male member staying away more than 2 consecutive meetings shall state to this church his reasons. M. Wolf, Mod./ J. Etheredge, Clerk

December 1860

Church met in conference following divine services. Sister churches Union and Ebenezer presented letters and delegates requesting a quarterly correspondence with us and it was moved that their request be granted. J. Etheredge and F. Knight volunteered to be delegates to Union Church and M. Stone and Ira Creel volunteered to set with Ebenezer Church in their next Quarterly meeting.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

January 1861 No conference; all in peace.

February 1861 No conference; all in peace.

March 1861

At conference after divine service, L. B. Pickett and S. R. McLure were chosen correspondents to Union Church and both agreed to serve. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

April 1861 No conference; all in peace and harmony.

May 1861

Divine service. In conference, complaint against Bro. R. H. Woodal was brought up about drinking and some unchristian conduct. After consideration it was agreed to cite him to next conference by letter.

J. Etheredge and M. Stone agreed to be delegates to Ebenezer Church next Quarterly conference.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

June 1861

Conference after divine services. Correspondence received from Union Church delegate Isaac Moore and William Brunson, and from Ebenezer Church A. M. Johnson. M. Stone and F. G. Rayburn volunteered to correspond with Union Church on their next Conference.

Reference made to the citing R. H. Woodal for drunkenness for the purpose of giving the church satisfaction for non-attendance. With his failure to appear his case was referred to next conference.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

July 1861

Divine service. In conference a call was made for references regarding R. H. Woodal for drinking and disorderly conduct and non-attendance. After giving him due time to reform himself and his failing to do so, it was moved to exclude R. H. Woodal from our church.

Bro. M. Wolf called for a letter of dismissal for himself and wife, which was granted.

A new pastor, Bro. John Brunson, was called, requesting Union Church to ordain him to the field of labor. Bro. J. Etheredge to continue as Church Clerk.

Delegates to Asso. chosen: F. Knight and Ira Creel with R. Grayham alternate. Sent \$2.00 to Asso. with request for 20 copies

of minutes. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

August 1861

At conference Associational letter was read and adopted.

A. Yarborough, Mod.pro tem / J. Etheredge

Sept. 1861

After divine services, conference was held. Letter from Union Church was read by John E. Brunson, in answer to our request for them to ordain Bro. John E. Brunson, which stated that this church was not ready for ordination and our request was not granted.

Another call for a pastor was made to Elder H. Yarborough, with Brethren M. Stone and J. Etheredge being appointed to bear him a letter to inform him and to get an answer whether he would serve or not.

Oct. 1861

Services and conference held. NO new business.

John E. Brunson, mod. pro tem; J. Etheredge, C.C.

Nov. 1861 No conference

Dec. 1861

At conference following divine services agreed to send volunteers to correspond with UNION Church with results that Brethren J. Etheredge and M. Stone agreed to go. Bro. S. Smith reported that he had been kindly received by Ebenezer Church.

Elder H. Yarborough was present and agreed to serve as a supply in the ensuing year. H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.Clerk

Jan. 1862

Divine service. No new business transacted.

M. Wolf, Mod.pro tem / J. Etheredge, C. C.

Feb. 1862

Following divine service a complaint was brought against Bro. F. G. Rayburn for non-attendance and some unchristianlike conduct. M. Stone and J. Etheredge appointed to see him to inquire the reasons and to cite him to our next conference.

J. Etheredge and F. Knight volunteered to correspond with Ebenezer Church at their next conference.

H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

March 1862

Divine service. Bros. F. Knight and Ira Creel volunteered to attend Union Church at their next conference.

M. Wolfe, Mod.pro tem / J. Etheredge, C.C.

April 1862

Sat in conference after divine service. In difference to Bro. F. G. Rayburn, Bro. Rayburn was present and made satisfactory confessions to the church.

Charge was brought against D. B. Kelly for false statements. John Watson and F. Knight were appointed a committee to cite said Kelly to our next conference. M. Wolf, Mod.pro tern/ J. Etheredge, C. C.

May 1862

Following service, case of Burton Kelly was brought up. Kelly not being present, the committee was discharged and the case still referred. H. Yarborough, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clerk

June 1862

Conference following divine service. Simpkin Smith and Isaac Banyard reported that they were cordially received at Ebenezer Church.

After due investigation, D. B. Kelly was excluded from Church. F. G. Rayburn and J. Etheredge consented to go to Union Church conference. M. Stone, Mod. pro tem / J. Etheredge

July 1862

Conference following divine services. A grievance was made concerning the excluding of D.B. Kelly at last conference. It was moved that the church reconsider the matter and give him a new hearing at the next conference.

Chose M. Wolf and J. Etheredge as pastor and clerk for the coming year.

Chose J. Etheredge and John Watson delegates to next Asso. meeting with J. B. Pickett being alternate.

M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, Clk.

August 1862

Church sat in conference following divine service. Burton Kelly not present, his case was referred to next conference. Letter to Asso. read and adopted. M. Wolf, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

Sept. 1862 No conference.

November 1863

Conference held after divine services. Complaint brought against Bro. F. G. Rayburn for non-attendance. F. Knight and J. Etheredge chosen to cite Bro. Rayburn to next Conference.

J. E. Brunson, Mod. : J. Etheredge, C. C.

December 1863 No conference.

January 1864

Divine services. Sis. Sealy Wolf was presented a letter of dismissal. Reference in regard to appointing a committee to cite Bro. F. G. Rayburn to conference for non-attendance. Following the committee report F. G. Rayburn was excluded from Church.

J. E. Brunson, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

February 1864

Service held by J. E. Brunson. No new business in conference. J. E. Brunson, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C. C.

March 1864

After preaching Sister Elizabeth Creel applied for a letter of dismissal, which was granted.

M. Stone, Mod. pro tem / J. Etheredge, C.C.

April, May, June, July, August, September, October, 1864

No church conferences were held (These were the months following Gen. Sherman's raid in Lauderdale County, which may have had an effect on the church. These were hard times in the land.)

November 1864

Church met in conference following services by J. E. Brunson.

A complaint was brought against Sister Nancy J. E. Waller for unchristian conduct. A committee was appointed to inquire into the matter and to cite the said sister to next conference.

Sister Elizabeth Whitlock requested a letter of dismissal.

J. E. Brunson, Mod. / J. Etheredge, C.C.

December 1864 No conference was held

NO CONFERENCE WAS HELD AGAIN UNTIL JULY, 1865.

July 1865

Divine service held by Bro. James ? faded out ? . Charge against Sis. Nancy J. E. Waller for unchristian conduct and a committee was sent to cite her to next conference to defend herself. Conference chose H. Yarborough as pastor and J. Etheredge again chosen Church Clerk.

October 1862
