

## FOREWORD

The information on this schedule 4, Production of Agriculture was taken from photo copies of the actual census furnished LCDA & H, Inc. by Mrs. Elaine Smith, 59201 Merrimac Lane, Elkhart, Indiana 46517. The information taken from these photo copies were then checked against the microfilm copy of the census at the Meridian Public Library.

There were no numbers on some of the pages so this publication commences on the first page and takes the information page by page until the end. One page of the census record is compiled on two (2) pages in this publication thus the first two (2) pages are labeled 1-A and 1-B.

Each page of the census lists 41 entries and are so listed in this publication, some of which was unreadable.

While some of the pages reflect a date after June 1, 1850, the census was taken on the amount of the various produce and property for the year ending June 1, 1850.
