Dear Jim,

Thank you very much for your letter on the Rawsons and the whites. You know how hard they are to trace. I think we were so poor that we didn't leave much of a record in Landerdick County.

You had Charles and Genny Henderson Rawson as brothers which is correct; but you had "Charles" as the name of the father also and I have "William".

It was William Rawson who married "E" or "Elizabeth" Henderson, I think. Anyway I have made some copies of my records for you to look over. My understanding is that William and "Elizabeth"'s two sons Charles and Genny Henderson married sisters, Mary and Charlotte Burkhalter, daus. of Elias Burkhalter and Winifred Webb.

Our earliest ancestor, who is known to have carried our coat of arms, was Richard Rawson of Frystone, England, about 1380.

The first Rawson in this country was Edward Rawson, named for Sir Edward Rawson, who lived in the reign of one of the Marys. Edward was born in Hillington, Somersetshire, England, April 16, 1615. He married Rachel Perre in England and came to New England in 1636, settling into Newbury in the colony of Massachusetts Bay. He held various public offices and was elected secretary of the Colony from 1649 and annually until 1686. He was granted more than 2500 acres of land and built a house on the Boston Common on what became Rawson Lane. He and Rachel had 12 children, 5 of whom returned to England. Their ^{seventh} ~~eighth~~ child was William².

William² Rawson was born May 21, 1651, and married Ann Glover July 31, 1673. They had 20 children, 15 of whom died young. Their ~~eighth~~ child William² became a prominent merchant and importer of foreign goods. Their ~~eighth~~ child was William³.

William³ Rawson was born Dec. 8, 1682, and he married Sarah Crosby of Billerica, Massachusetts, in 1710, and settled in Mendon, Mass. He graduated from Harvard College, was selectman, Town Clerk, and taught school in Mendon. Their oldest son was William⁴.

William⁴ Rawson was born Feb. 20, 1711, and married Margaret Cook of Uxbridge, May 13, 1731. William⁴ was a distinguished lawyer in Mendon, Town Treasurer in 1739, chosen Town Clerk Mar. 2, 1740. They had 8 children, including a son named William who was killed in the French War in 1756 at the age of 22. We descended from the seventh child.

Jonathan⁵ Rawson was born March 15, 1749, married Bathsheba Tracy of Preston, Connecticut, was a saddler, and took the "King's Road" from Massachusetts to Wyoming, Pennsylvania, about 1771. From here on the records get sketchy, but I'll give you what I have so far. Jonathan⁵ and Bathsheba had 6 children, including -

William⁶ Rawson, born about 1774 in Pennsylvania. He married Luansa Swift first, Betsey Osborne second. He had 6 children, but I don't know by which wife, including William⁷, John⁷, and Charles⁷ Rawson. I believe these three sons took the "Great Road" that led from Philadelphia towards Kentucky. I have established that we came from Kentucky to Tennessee, and I found these three brothers in Tennessee and Mississippi between 1816 and 1822. Their mother or stepmother, Betsey, showed up on the 1830 Hinds County, Miss. Census with William⁷ and John⁷ in 1830. Since William⁷ first showed up in 1822 as the head of household, I believe he is our great-great-great grandfather.

William⁷ Rawson was probably born about 1793, possibly in Kentucky, because his wife, E. Rawson, was born in Kentucky. I believe he had the following children - all the early Mississippi Rawsons I have traced so far:

- 1) James⁸ Rawson married Eliza Jane Foes in Hinds County, Miss. in 1830 or 1832. Census information says he was born in Tennessee, probably around 1811. He homesteaded in Hinds County in 1832, moved to Lauderdale County, Ms. after 1836, and probably moved to Leake County, Ms. between 1848 and 1853. He and Eliza Jane had at least the following, probably more:

James⁹ Rawson, born 1830, married Rebecca Kerlow in 1863 in Leake County

Nancy⁹ Rawson, born 1831, married John Wheeler in 1848 in Leake County

William⁹ Rawson, born 1842, married Mary Faulkner in Leake County

Elizabeth Jane⁹ Rawson, born 1843, married Charles L. Rawson July 8, 1860

- 2) George⁸ Rawson was born in 1812 in Tennessee, married Elizabeth —, homesteaded next to James⁸ north of Bolivar, Ms. in 1833, moved to Lauderdale County, Ms. in 1835. They had

Robert J.⁹ Rawson, born 1838, married Fannie Ethridge in 1871

John C.⁹ Rawson, born 1840, died of wounds received at Gettysburg, July 11, 1863

Elizabeth⁹ Rawson, born 1841, married R. S. Stokes in Lauderdale, Co., Aug. 14, 1858

Charles⁹ Rawson, born 1843 - I have found nothing else on him yet

Martha⁹ Rawson, born 1846, married W. A. Edgar Oct. 1, 1865

- 3) Amelia⁸ Rawson married Joseph Crider in Madison County, Ms. Mar. 13, 1834, and they moved to Leake County in 1836. Owned lots in the town of Thomastown and land in the county. No descendants have been found yet.

- 4) Jeremiah⁸ Rawson was born in Tennessee in 1813, and married Harriet Sivils in Madison County in 1836. He homesteaded in Madison County between Bolton and Flora, 8 miles north of James⁸ and George⁸ in 1833. He was bondsman at Amelia⁸'s wedding to Joseph Crides. Jeremiah⁸ moved to Leake County in 1836, was my great-great grandfather, and had:
- Jerry⁷ Rawson, Jr., born 1842, married Francis J. Dollar in Leake County
 - Eliza Jane⁷ Rawson, born 1847, married William L. Parker " " "
 - Bluford Wyatt⁷ Rawson, born 1858, married Nancy J. Mills " " "
 - Mary⁷ Rawson, born about 1847, never married
 - Lucinda⁹ Rawson, born 1839, married John Henry Cochraft in Leake County
 - Martha Ann⁹ Rawson, born 1850, married H. V. Jones, Jr. " " "
 - Ellen E.⁹ Rawson, born 1863, married Jeff D. Faulkner " " "
 - William Cornelius⁷ Rawson, born 1867, married Nellie Moore (my great grandparents)

5) Bluford S.⁸ Rawson, married Lucinda Beach in 1837 in Leake County. No other traces have been found of Bluford.

6) Charles⁸ Rawson, born 1815 in Tennessee, married Mary Burkhalter of Alabama. He first appears on public record when he and George⁸ purchased land together in Lauderdale County in 1836. Charles⁸ was a plantation owner and merchant in Marion, Ms., the county seat in those days. He started Rawsonville, and was postmaster there for many years. He and Mary had 12 children, as follows:

- Harriet E.⁹ Rawson, born 1844, died 1856. Charles⁸ started Rawson Cemetery for her
- Winford⁹ Rawson, born 1846, married _____ Brown, had 6 children
- Martha J. Rawson, born 1848 - know nothing else yet

Elias H.⁹ Rawson, born 12-4-1852, married Lula Culpepper, had 11 children
 Flemming⁹ Rawson, born 1853, married Rosie Warbington in 1873, had 2 children
 Charlotte⁹ Rawson, born 1854, married — Warbington, had 3 children
 Mary A.⁹ Rawson, born 1856, have no other information yet
 Francis Marin⁹ Rawson, born 1859, married Sara Annie —, had 6 children
 Palestine Olney⁹ Rawson, born 1862, married Charles Brewer, moved to Texas, 11 children
 James Owen⁹ Rawson, born 1870, married Mattie Harper, had 2 children

7) Henry Henderson⁸ Rawson was born in 1822 and married Charlotte Burkhalter, sister to Charles⁸' wife, Mary. They were daughters of Elias Burkhalter and Winniford Webb. Henry⁸ and Charlotte were your great-great-grandparents and had in Lauderdale County the following:

James Ray⁹ Rawson, born 1850, married Zella D. — (your great-grandparents)

George William⁹ (or Washington) Rawson, born 1855, married Amanda Taylor,

Eliza M.⁹ Rawson, born 1858, married R. Y. Wilson Mar. 20, 1881

Charles J.⁹ Rawson, born 1860, never married

Ann⁹ Rawson, born 1865, married E. Culpepper Mar. 22, 1883

Elias Marin⁹ Rawson, born 1867; married Lovie Tackey, July 21, 1892

Note: Although census records say Henry⁸ was born in Alabama, I doubt it. He named his first three sons after the other 3 Lauderdale County Rawsons; married Charles⁸' sister, and became guardian of Charles⁸' estate for 3 months when he was incapacitated for a while in 1850. Henry⁸ was a corporal in the cavalry during the Civil War, and was captured when Vicksburg surrendered to Grant July 4, 1863. He was released after signing an oath not to take up arms again Sept. 22, 1863. I have not yet found where Henry⁸ and Charlotte are buried, but other family members believe they were buried in the Rawson Cemetery in Lauderdale County and their headstones have disappeared.

Dear Mr. Booker:

Please forgive my not having answered you sooner. I am responsible for the Battle Management for the ground-based components of President Reagan's "Star Wars" program and have had to spend at least half of my time in Washington and on the road. My genealogical research has really had to take a back seat. There was quite a lapse between the time I submitted my inquiry to the paper and the time it was published. I appreciate very much your replying to me.

Benjamin Franklin Ponds who married Martha Penelope Welch Jan. 31, 1884, was my grandfather. He was the oldest surviving child of Sarah Baskin and Miles Washington Pond. Sarah Baskin was the daughter of John and Nancy Horton Baskin. Nancy died 18 April 1873 and John remarried. Mary A. was a second wife. I believe she was a Rainer.

I have been researching these families for about twenty years. Several years ago I corresponded with Myra Booker. You must be related to her. A Mr. Joe C. Baskin who lives in Cuba, AL, took me to a graveyard at Rosser called Cooty Cemetery where John and Nancy Baskin are buried. He also showed me an old home place which John Baskin had built when he first came to Alabama from South Carolina. It is falling in. He said a hunting club had the property, I think. There was another land owner there who had disappeared to South America under strange circumstances. It is all very confusing!

I have traced the Baskins back to Andrew Baskin who was a well-known Revolutionary Patriot in South Carolina. The female descendants of the family are eligible for DAR with both Andrew Baskin and William Horton which I have used. You may be interested in the SAR. Any of you are welcome to use my papers if you wish.

There was a Pond family which came to Sumter County before 1850 from Anson County, North Carolina. The father was Samuel Pond. One of his sons became a minister. I believe that Samuel was an older brother to my Miles Washington Pond and that Miles probably met Sarah while visiting or living with his brother. I have seen a reference to the Allens as also coming from Anson County, North Carolina in an old newspaper from that area. Perhaps Robert I. Allen was from the same place as Miles Washington Pond.

Again, I appreciate very much your responding to the ad and the trouble you went to to give me this information some of which I didn't have. I am enclosing a chart of the descendants of Andrew Baskin.

If I have any data you could use, let me know.

Dear Dr. Kobler:

SARAH BASKIN was also my great-grandmother. My father was Otis Andrew Booker, and his mother was Etta Allen, daughter of Sarah Baskin Ponds Allen and Robert Isiah Allen, second husband of Sarah Baskin. I have alot of information on the Allens if you are interested, which I do not think you would be, and some information of the Baskins. I am enclosing a sample of the Baskin materials that I have. I also have some material on the Rainers mentioned in your letter (second wife of John Baskin).

You may be interested to know that Robert I. Allen was born in the northwest area of Choctaw County, AL, known as Halsell or Enock or Kinterbish. He enlisted in the Confederate Army in Company F, Alabama Regiment, in 1862, in Choctaw County, AL. He was released from a prison camp at Rock Island in Illinois at the close of the war. Unlike Miles Washington Ponds, he made it back home after the war. I understand that Miles Washington Ponds was killed by a sniper bullet at Pineapple, AL, while on the way home after the war and that he was buried there. To the best of my knowledge, Robert and Sarah lived very close to the Mississippi-Alabama line in Lauderdale County, MS, very close to Cuba, AL and between Cuba and Alamutcha, MS. I have some records of where Sarah was a member of Salem Baptist Church in Alamutcha and I went to their 150th anniversary a couple of months ago. My grandparents on my mother's side went there also (Rawson) and her mother's mother and family (White).

I know that you have written back and forth some to Jim Dawson, who is now executive director of the Lauderdale County Department of Archives and History, because I have a copy of one of your letters. Since he is of the line of Manola Allen, daughter of Sarah also, and since he lived in Whynot, he has a good bit of information of Allens, Baskins, Ponds and Dawsons. You may write him at Rt. 6, Box 115, Meridian, MS 39301.

Also, my sister, Tillie Gunn of 323 South 34th Avenue in Hattiesburg, MS 39401, works alot on this and has everything that I do and more.

You mentioned Myra Booker in your letter, she is my aunt, the only girl in the William Andrew and Etta Allen Booker family. Aunt Myra is around 84 and still lives at Whynot. I have tried to get some additional information from her but she can't remember much. I did get a picture which I am enclosing a copy of for you.

Thank you very much for the print out on the Baskins. I have often thought about a P.C. for some of my records. I certainly need one. Did you write the program or is there a canned software product for genealogical research? I know my wife would appreciate a computer in place of my current system of books, papers and junk.
