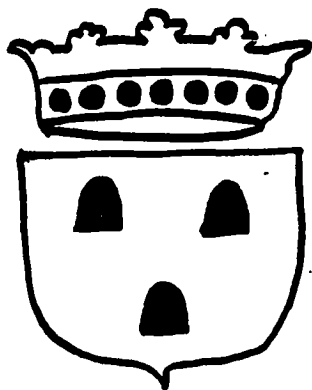

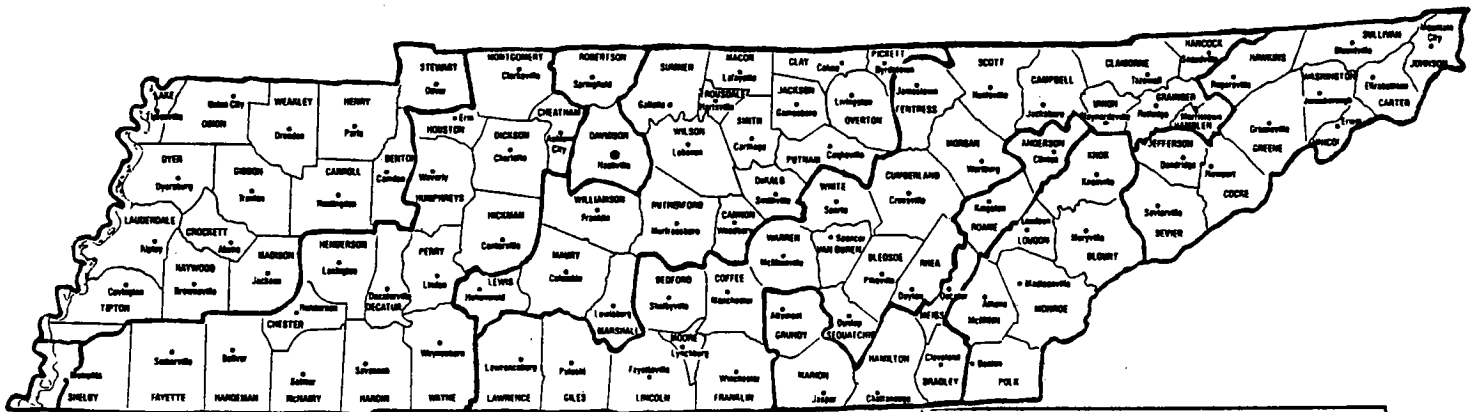
There are four research areas in the Nashville area which should be of interest to us. The Tennessee State Library and Archives, 403 Seventh Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee 37243-0312. Hours 8-4:30 Monday through Friday. Telephone 1-615-741-2764. This facility is within walking distance of the Hermitage Hotel.

Ben West Library-Downtown, 222 8th Avenue North and Union St., Nashville, TN 37203-3585. The Nashville Room, on the second floor, has many books and periodicals on Nashville and Middle Tennessee history. They have microfilm and microfilm readers, xerox machines, open stacks, Confederate land grants, wills, veterans records, and census books 1820-1870. Hours-Monday through Thursday 9-5 and Saturday 9-5.

Division of Vital Statistics, C-3-323 Cordell Hull Bldg., 5th and Gay, Nashville, Tennessee 37247. They have marriage records, birth records, and death records for the entire state of Tennessee. Telephone 1-615-741-1763. Hours-Monday through Friday 8-4.

Metro Archives, 1113 Elm Hill Pike, Nashville, Tennessee 37210. Telephone 1-615-862-5880. This is not near the Hermitage Hotel like the other three, but would not take long to go by automobile. The Archives has marriage records going back to 1780, deeds, wills etc. They have xerox machines, microfilm reader, printers, etc. Hours-Monday through Friday 8-4.

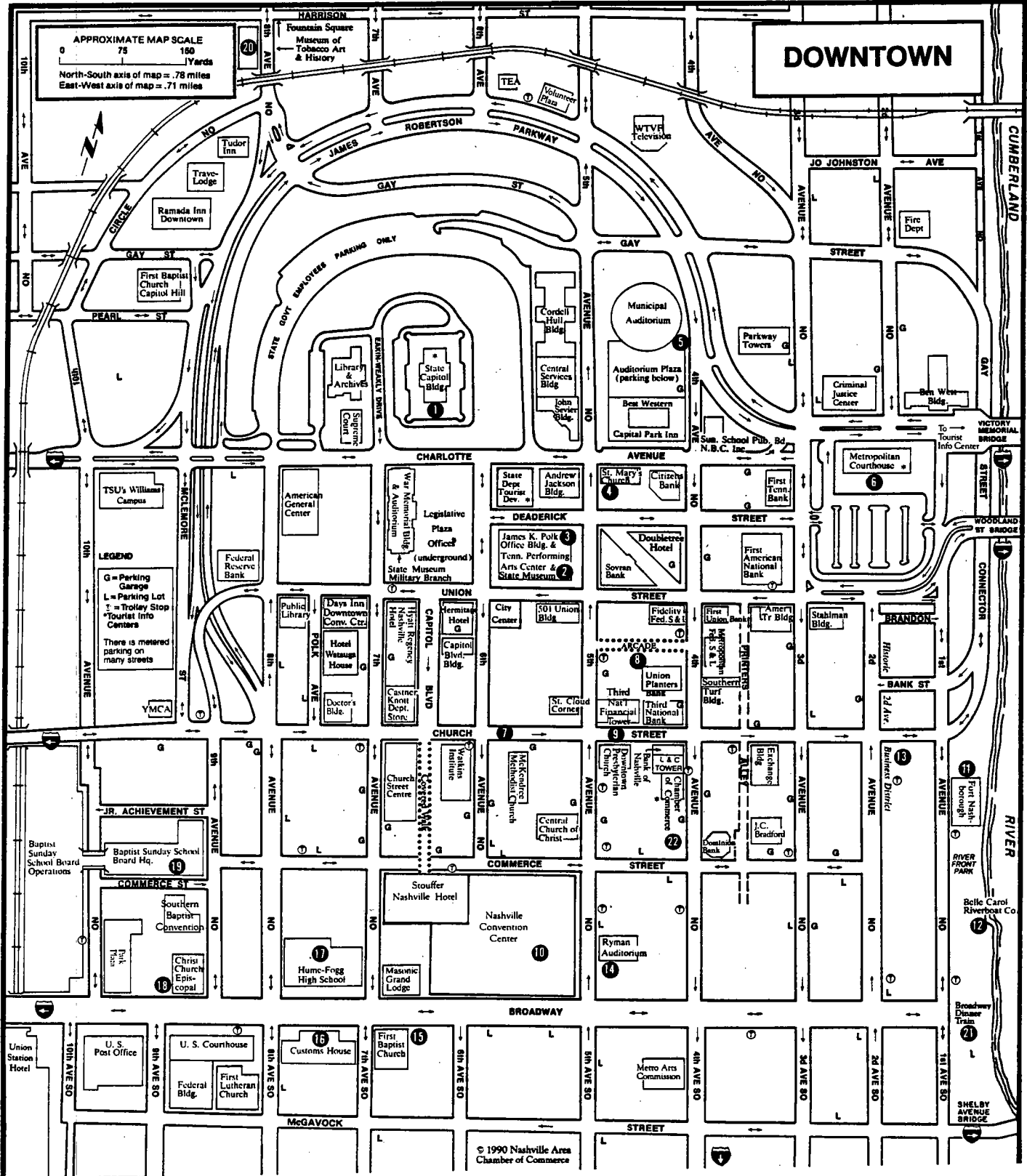

# Downtown Nashville Key Buildings & Points of Interest

Nashville was first settled in 1779-80. During the 210 years that have passed, Nashville has evolved from a settlement to a town to a cosmopolitan city. With a population of a little more than a half million, Nashville is now one of the oldest and largest cities in the South. While progress and change have moved Nashville forward over the years, much that is historically and architecturally significant has been retained, blending the old and new in a pleasing and attractive way. We invite you to look around and see for yourself. Following is a description of some of the interesting places in the downtown area. Those marked with an asterisk (\*) are on the National Register of Historic Places. Numbers are keyed to map locations on the reverse side.

**TOURING DOWNTOWN:** A leisurely stroll through the downtown area will take you back in time to the earlier era of many of Nashville's historic buildings. The Metropolitan Historical Commission, 701 Broadway, produces a walking tour guide which may be obtained at their offices or at the information booth in the Chamber of Commerce. For those who prefer a more leisurely pace, Nashville has a unique way to tour downtown--by old-fashioned trolleys. Main trolley stops are marked on the map on the reverse side. Trolley ride: 25 cents.

**1. TENNESSEE STATE CAPITOL.\*** Designed by William Strickland, the State Capitol is considered by many to be his masterpiece. Strickland, a noted Philadelphia architect, had worked on plans for the U.S. Capitol in Washington before coming to Nashville. He became so involved with his work on the Capitol that he asked to be interred within the walls of his crowning achievement. The building, Greek Revival in style, was begun in 1845 and completed in 1859. Chambers of the state Senate and House of Representatives and the Governor's office are inside. The Tennessee State Capitol is one of the oldest functioning antebellum capitols in the country. On the grounds are the tomb of President James K. Polk and the graves of Andrew Jackson, Sgt. Alvin York and Sam Davis, hero of the Confederacy. Open 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Mon.-Fri.; 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Sat.; 1-5 p.m. Sun. Free tours. Groups should call in advance. 741-0830 (Education Dept.) ☒

**2. TENNESSEE STATE MUSEUM.** Located in the Polk Cultural Center, the museum highlights Tennessee history. "Life in Tennessee" is the theme of exhibits beginning 15,000 years ago and going through the early part of the 1900s. The exhibit includes an expansive collection of prehistoric Indian and Civil War artifacts. Also included is an art gallery with varying exhibits. The museum is open 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Mon.-Sat.; 1-5 p.m. on Sun. Admission: free. 741-2692. ☒

**MILITARY BRANCH.** A military history museum illustrating Tennessee's role in modern wars (Spanish American to World War II). Located in the stately War Memorial Building, which was built in 1925 as a tribute to Tennesseans who lost their lives in World War I. Vietnam Memorial is also located on the grounds. The museum is open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Mon.-Sat.; 1-4 p.m. on Sun., except holidays. Admission: free. 741-2692. ☒

**3. TENNESSEE PERFORMING ARTS CENTER.** It is one of the finest facilities of its kind in the Southeast. Inside is a 2,442-seat concert hall, a 1,056-seat drama theater and a 300-seat multi-form theater. The center is at the base of an 18-story State of Tennessee office building. Events in the center include performances by Broadway touring companies, orchestras from around the world and a wide variety of popular artists and family-oriented events. Call the box office for further information. 741-2787. Headsets for the hearing impaired available. ☒

**4. ST. MARY'S CHURCH.\*** Built between 1844 and 1847, this building was designed by Adolphus Heiman. Like the Capitol, it is Greek Revival. St. Mary's is the oldest surviving church building in Nashville and the first Catholic Cathedral in Tennessee. Regular services are held.

**5. MUNICIPAL AUDITORIUM.** Site of a great deal of indoor entertainment in Nashville such as concerts, ice hockey, ice shows, rodeos and circuses. The auditorium seats 9,600. The main entrance is on Fourth Ave. North. Also used for conventions and trade shows, the exhibition floor contains 63,000 square feet of space. Entrance for the exhibition level is usually off Gay Street. Box office phone 259-6461. ☒

**6. METROPOLITAN COURTHOUSE.** This 1937 building, blending neo-classical and art deco design, is the fourth courthouse to be located on the site since 1783. Large murals just inside the bronze doors represent industry, agriculture, commerce and statesmanship. The building houses the Mayor's office, Metro Council chambers and other local government offices and courts.

**7. CHURCH STREET.** Under the progressive leadership of Metropolitan Government, the serpentine section from Fourth to Eighth avenues was landscaped and redone with brick cobblestoned streets and sidewalks creating a pleasant atmosphere for a stroll. Retail offerings on Church Street range from a major department store to unique specialty shops. An exciting addition is Church Street Centre, a glass-enclosed mall with 75 retail shops, food court with live entertainment, restaurants and a night club, which connects Church Street to the Convention Center.

**8. THE NASHVILLE ARCADE.\*** This two-tiered "shopping mall" opened in 1903 as a copy of one in Milan, Italy. Only four structures of this type still exist in the United States. A mixture of modest specialty and service shops occupy the arcade, and the aroma of freshly baked cookies, popcorn and roasted nuts is as familiar today as it was at the turn of the century.

**9. DOWNTOWN PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.\*** This very unusual church, completed in 1851, is another Nashville landmark by William Strickland. The style is Egyptian Revival as noted by the lotus columns, entrance forms and towers. The interior is colorful and striking. Wednesday noon and Sunday services are held. Docents on duty during the summer.

**10. NASHVILLE CONVENTION CENTER.** Celebrating their fourth year in operation, the new Convention Center is located in the heart of the city. The facilities include 118,675 square feet of exhibit space, an 11,050 square foot ballroom, 25 meeting rooms and a large area for registration and pre-function gatherings. 742-2000. ☒

**11. FORT NASHBOROUGH.** It was here on Christmas Eve, 1779, that James Robertson and his group of North Carolinians crossed the Cumberland River and founded Nashville. The present fort, built in the 1930s, marks the general site of the first settlement. In April, 1780, a second group led by John Donelson arrived by boat to link up with the others. Among them was young Rachel Donelson, who later became the wife of Andrew Jackson. The fort has an interpretive program with guides in costume telling the story of the settlement. Open 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Tues.-Sat.; closed Sun., Mon. and all legal holidays. Admission: \$2 adults; \$1 children. Advance notice for groups. 255-8192.

**12. BELLE CAROL RIVERBOAT CO.** From the Riverfront Park dock, near Fort Nashborough (First Avenue South), the 400-passenger Music City Queen and the 250-passenger Captain Ann offer daytime/sightseeing and dinner/entertainment cruises. Contact the Belle Carol Riverboat Co. for exact hours of operation and prices. 244-3430.

**13. HISTORIC SECOND AVENUE DISTRICT.\*** This row of commercial buildings extends from Broadway to Union Street. Built primarily in the 1870s and 1880s, the structures are noted for their cast-iron and masonry facades, full-block depth and window and roof-line details. Long a warehouse district, most of these handsome buildings have been converted into offices, unique shops, chic bistros, clubs and apartments. The area is spotlighted in late September each year when Historic Nashville, Inc. sponsors the Market Street Festival with Tennessee crafts, food, games, historic tram tours, music and entertainment.

**14. RYMAN AUDITORIUM.\*** Home of the Grand Ole Opry from 1943 through March 1974. The structure was built in 1891 for religious meetings and named the Union Gospel Tabernacle. The red brick building was renamed Ryman Auditorium in 1905 to honor steamboat captain Tom Ryman, the building's chief contributor. Down through the years some of the world's greatest musicians, actors and dancers played one night stands at the Ryman. But it is most famous for its role as the home of the Grand Ole Opry, a role which earned it the nickname, "Mother Church of Country Music."

Although the Opry has since moved to its new home at Opryland USA, self-guided tours are still given at the Ryman. Open daily 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., except Thanksgiving and Christmas Days. Admission: \$2 adults; \$1 children (6-12); under 6 free. 254-1445.

**15. FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH.** The stained glass windows by artist Goode Davis are impressive in their beauty. The 1880s Victorian Gothic tower with its copper-clad spire was retained and merged with a contemporary sanctuary and educational facilities when the original church was torn down and rebuilt in 1970. Sunday services held.

**16. CUSTOMS HOUSE.\*** The cornerstone for this castle-like building was laid in 1877 when President Rutherford B. Hayes visited Nashville. Construction of the central portion actually was accomplished between 1875 and 1882, with compatible additions made after the turn of the century. Notice the handcarved stone detailing and the clock tower. The Customs House is now being leased for office space.

**17. HUME-FOGG HIGH SCHOOL.\*** Its best-known graduate is Nashville's and Hollywood's Dinah Shore. The Tudor Gothic building, constructed between 1912 and 1916, was the first public high school in Nashville.

**18. CHRIST CHURCH EPISCOPAL.** The interior is truly beautiful reflecting the work of a now-vanished breed of skilled craftsmen. Note the Tiffany window and other lovely examples of stained glass and carved wood when you go inside. The church is one of Nashville's purest examples of Victorian Gothic architecture. Open 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Mon.-Fri.; Sunday services held.

**19. BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD.** One of the world's largest publishers of religious material, the Sunday School Board is the publishing agency of the Southern Baptist Convention. Free tours including the distribution center where 160 million pieces of literature are processed annually. Founder's Room, Van Ness Auditorium and memorabilia are on display. Open 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Mon.-Fri., except holidays. 251-2796.

**20. MUSEUM OF TOBACCO ART AND HISTORY.** Valuable collection presenting the history of tobacco through exhibits of antique pipes, snuff containers, cigar store figures and advertising art from around the world. Open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Tues.-Sat., closed Sun.-Mon. and major holidays. Admission: free. 242-9218. ☒

**21. BROADWAY DINNER TRAIN.** Downtown's newest attraction takes visitors back in time to the days of the old-fashioned passenger train. Ride the rails on a 35 mile round-trip from downtown to Old Hickory while enjoying a four course dinner. Train departs from Riverfront Park at 7 p.m.; boarding at 6 p.m. 254-8000

## Woman Painfully Injured In Wagon- Truck Crash Sun.

Mrs. Wayland Dement In  
Dickson Memorial Hos-  
pital, Suffering From  
Bruised Leg

### MANY OTHERS HURT

Members of Families Way-

ment in Wagon

One woman was injured very painfully and between 10 and 15 others suffered lesser hurts, about 7:30 o'clock last evening when a Chevrolet truck, driven by Frank Bishop of Cardwell, Mo., crashed into the rear of a wagon, driven by Ethelbert Dement, of route six, just east of the Big Slough ditch bridge on Highway 25, six miles east of Paragould. Mr. Bishop said the lights of an approaching vehicle blinded him and he was unable to see the wagon, which is said to have carried no light. Both the wagon and the truck were going west.

Mrs. Wayland Dement, who with her husband and three children and Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbert Dement and their seven children were en route to the Big Island church, is in the Dickson Memorial hospital suffering from painful bruises to her right hip and right leg received when she was thrown from the wagon. Her husband was thrown on the radiator of the truck and sustained injuries to his back. Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbert Dement escaped with lesser hurts.

Verla, 12, James, 10, Gordon, nine, Mildred, seven, Delbert, five, Chancy, four, and Ula Jean, eight months, children of Mr. and Mrs. Ethelbert Dement, escaped with minor injuries. Three children of Mr. and Mrs. Wayland Dement, Zane and Wayne, six-year-old twins, and Darrell, four, escaped with minor injuries. Marcus Bishop, who was riding in the truck with his brother, suffered a slight cut on his forehead. The driver of the vehicle escaped injury.

Both the truck and the wagon were badly damaged in the crash and one of the mules also was reported to have been injured.

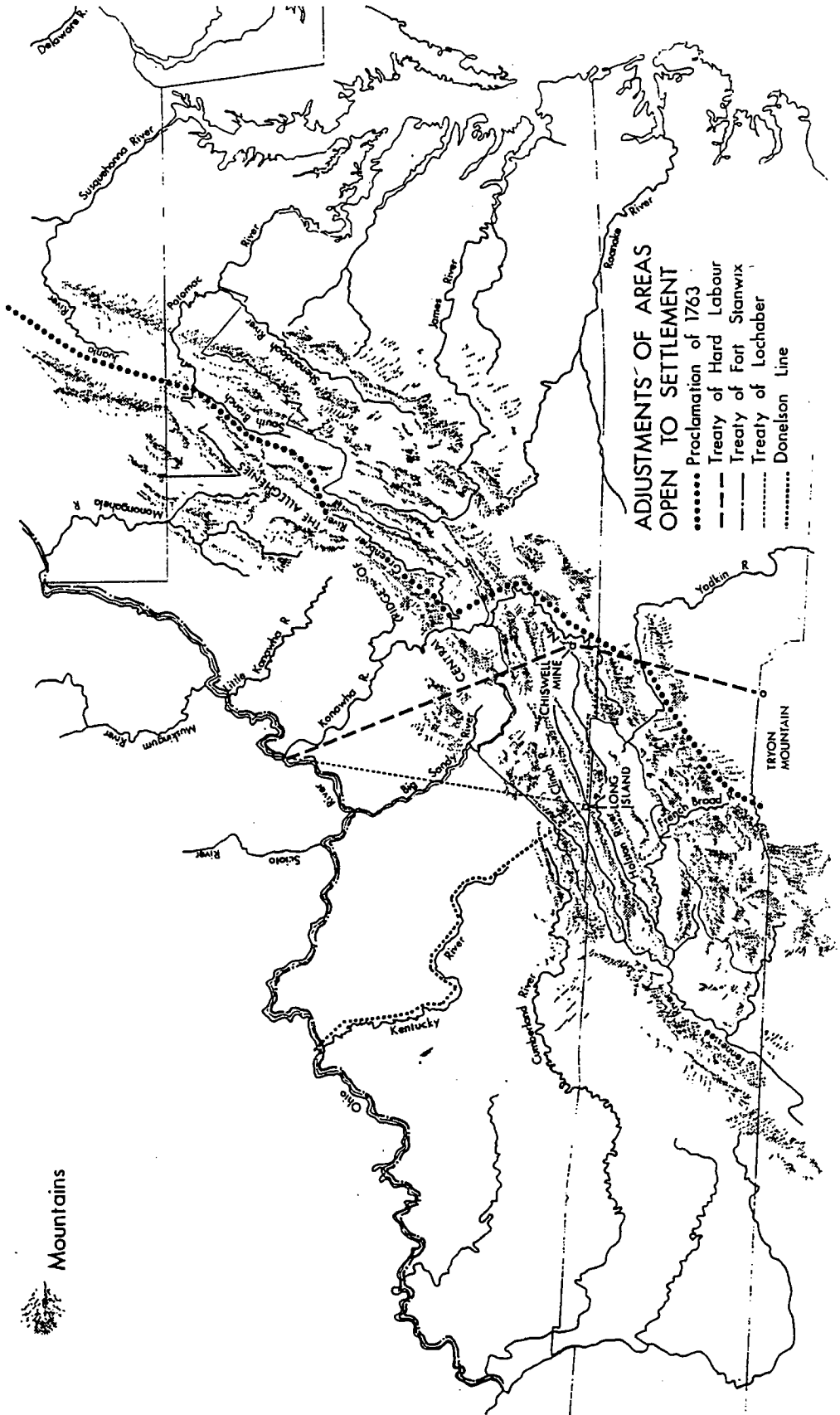

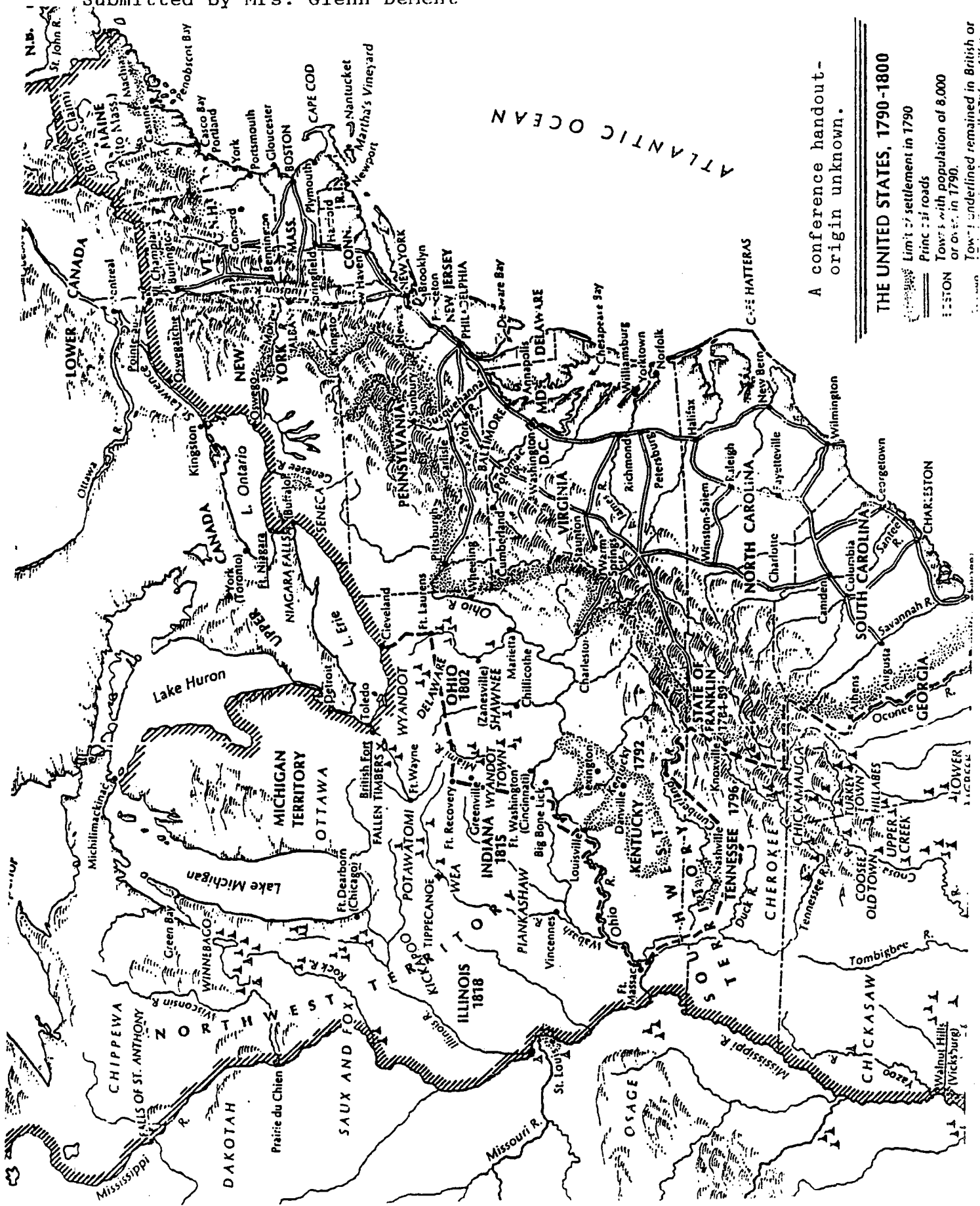

PORTRAIT and BIOGRAPHICAL ALBUM of Whiteside County Illinois, Chicago, Chapman Brothers 1883-Page 930- Fulton Illinois

In 1848, the town was impeded in its growth on account of the cholera. The first school opened in the town was by James McCoy, in the winter of 1840.

When the settlers first came in, there were quite a number of the Winnebago, Pottawatomie and Fox Indians loitering about, who had not yet gone to their reservations beyond the Mississippi. They made themselves at home among the settlers, pitching their tepees wherever they pleased. They were friendly, however, and made no disturbance. A favorite amusement with the settlers was to hire the Indians to dance for them.

The Aborigines must have had a large town here at one time, the location being selected on account of its favorable river crossing. There were deep paths worn into the ground leading from the east to the river. There were also primitive smelting furnaces found here, and upon their being dug out, quantities of lead and lead ore was discovered, together with Indian relics and tools. What uses they put the lead to is not known. The ore was taken from the bluffs in the northeastern part of the town. From the tumulated appearance of the ground, they must have also planted and raised corn here to a considerable extent.

The first saw-mill put in operation in the town was by Price and Todd in 1853. It was called TODD and DEMENT'S MILL. There was a small water-power mill started up on the Cat-tail some year before this, but it did not pay and was abandoned. The DEMENT MILL afterwards passed into the hands of Culbertson, Smith and Co. The lumber business continued to increase until it became an important factor in the growth of Fulton.

In 1851 quite an impetus was given to the growth of Fulton by the railroad project which had for its object the connection of Fulton with the lakes by rail. This project was conceived by Judge James McCoy, one of Fulton's oldest and most prominent citizens. After passing through many complications, this road was completed to Fulton.

Pending the construction of this road, CHARLES DEMENT conceived the project of erecting in Fulton the largest hotel west of Chicago, This hotel call the DEMENT HOUSE was completed in 1855, at a cost of \$100,000, and furnished with goods from New York at a cost of \$40,000. The building is 100 by 110 feet, and five stories high. The walls were built of stone taken from the Fulton quarries. It was finished with all the improvements known at that time, elegantly furnished and thoroughly appointed throughout. For a time it was crowded with guests, and it seemed that another hotel was necessary to meet the demand of the city. But the action of the railroad companies changed all this and in 1857, this grand hotel closed, and with it many other enterprises connected with the city.

In 1855, business matters were so prosperous that it was thought best to have the town incorporated. A meeting was held for the election of officers in April. William C. Green, CHARLES DEMENT, Onser Caswell, Wilson S. Wright, and James Briggs were

elected Trustees. William C. Green was elected President of the Board; Benj. S. Gerrish, Clerk; and Charles N. Wheeler, Treasurer.

The village was platted in 1856.

Dear Marilyn Holmes;

I write this with mixed emotions of excitement and guilt, for in a sense, I may be dropping a bomb shell. There is exciting news of research results to share, yet it gives me a sense of guilt when I stop to think of all the changes it can represent on charts that relate to George Dement of Maryland. In that sense, it is more a bomb shell than a NEWS FLASH.

Apparently, Mary Timothy was the first of the three wives that George Dement (2), had during his life time. The approximate date of this marriage has been estimated from various sources of previous research. To my knowledge, any type of official marriage record is still unavailable. Glenna Carlson's ancestry has worked on this for several generations and she has given us all, a lot of assistance, from her records. Again, the births of the children of George Dement (2) have been estimated, to some degree. The six minor children lumped as minors in the Will of 1728, makes an unresolved story.

The enclosed copy of the certification on the back of a property transfer in Charles County, Maryland in 1712, documents that Mary Timothy was still living in 1712, as well as establishing that her father was William Thymothy (Timothy). From this, she would have been the Mother of any and all children born in 1712 and/or before.

My William Dement (3) was both mentioned as a property recipient and as an executor of the Will of 1728. This would indicate he was at least 18 years of age in 1728, or in other words, he was born by 1710, if not earlier. This makes Mary Timothy, my line ancestor, as well as all the other children listed by name, in that Will, were her children.

We have only her name and mark on the document. We have no idea when she died.

Now, here is another interesting development. The Estate Settlement for Benjamin Ward, in March of 1724, states that it is to be divided between the Executor, Elizabeth Dement and 8 children, 7 of which were minors. There for, it was about 1724 before she could have married George Dement and when he died in 1728, they were married a short time. I doubt any children were born during that period, unless Benoni was actually born in 1728, as indicated in DTTA.

A date of documentation for Jemina Capshaw, wife number 2, is yet to be found. She is listed in an older publication of Virkus, but there is no date. I am still at work on it as I feel she may have been the Mother of some of the six minor children.

In 1988/89 I put together and submitted an application to National Society Colonial Dames 17th Century on George Dement and it was accepted as a supplemental membership. I did want others to be able to use this line, if they so desired. For some forgotten logic, I took a good long look at Elizabeth Ward whoes connection was only through the Will and it was obvious she was very, very incorrect.

In January of this year, I requested a search for Mary Timothy, in Maryland State Archives. It took a long time, but it has paid off. The variety of unique spellings of this Dement name in the early records is simply amazing. I think that accounts for the reason this little jewel of documentation has been over looked for all these many generations.

Now, I can get my Colonial Dames records corrected, so any one who wishes may enjoy it. The National President will be in Golden, Colorado for our regional meeting 18 August.

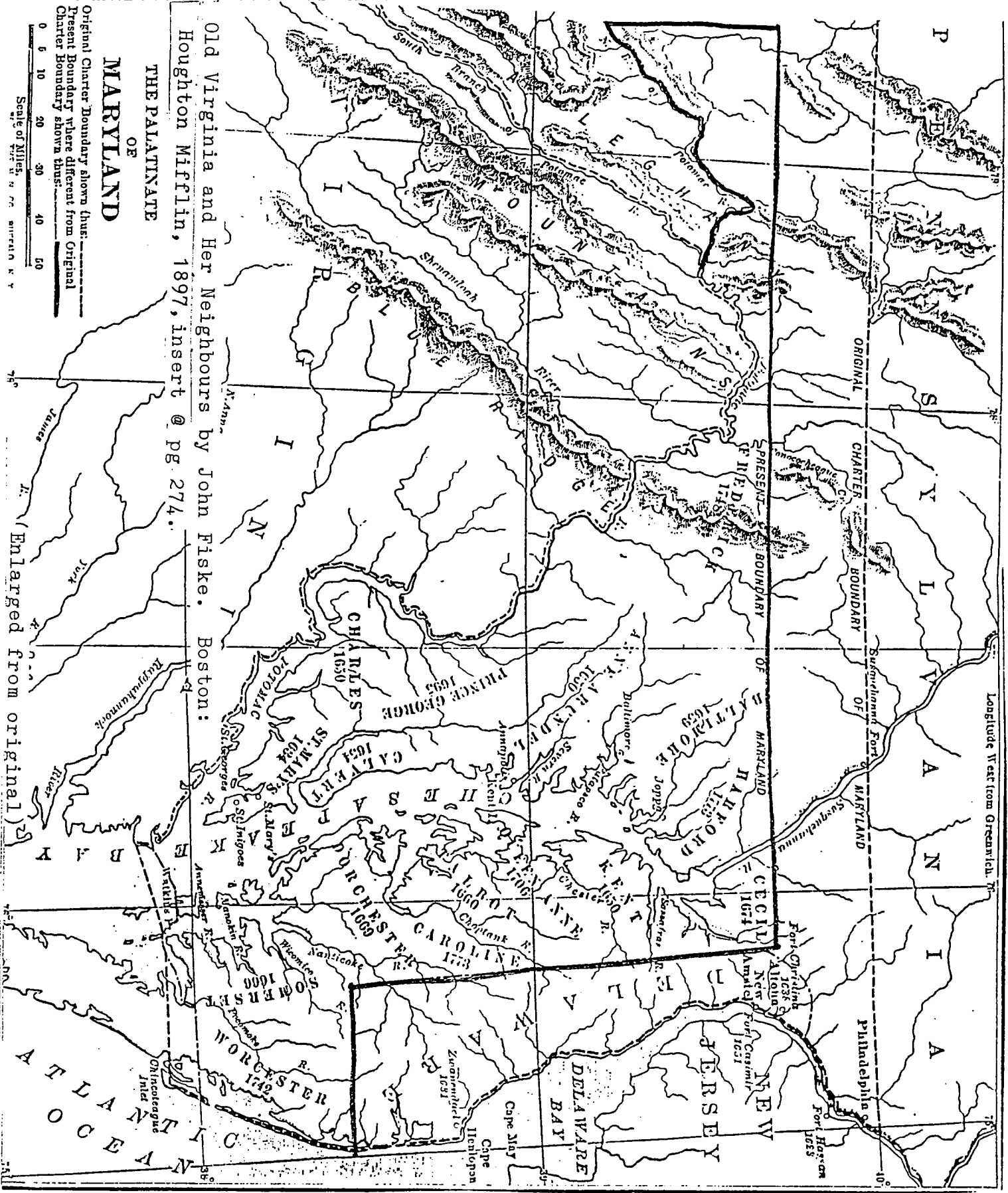

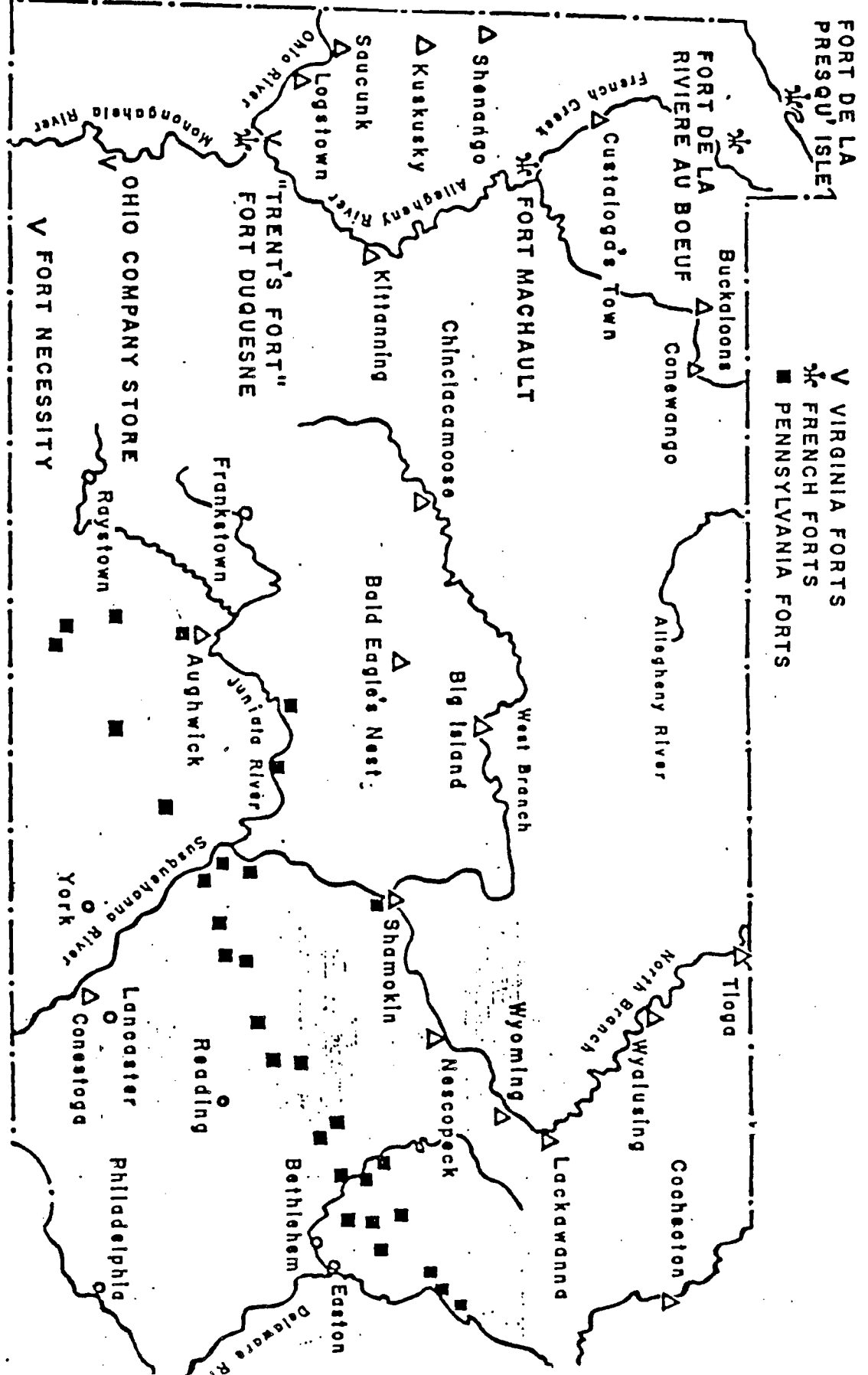

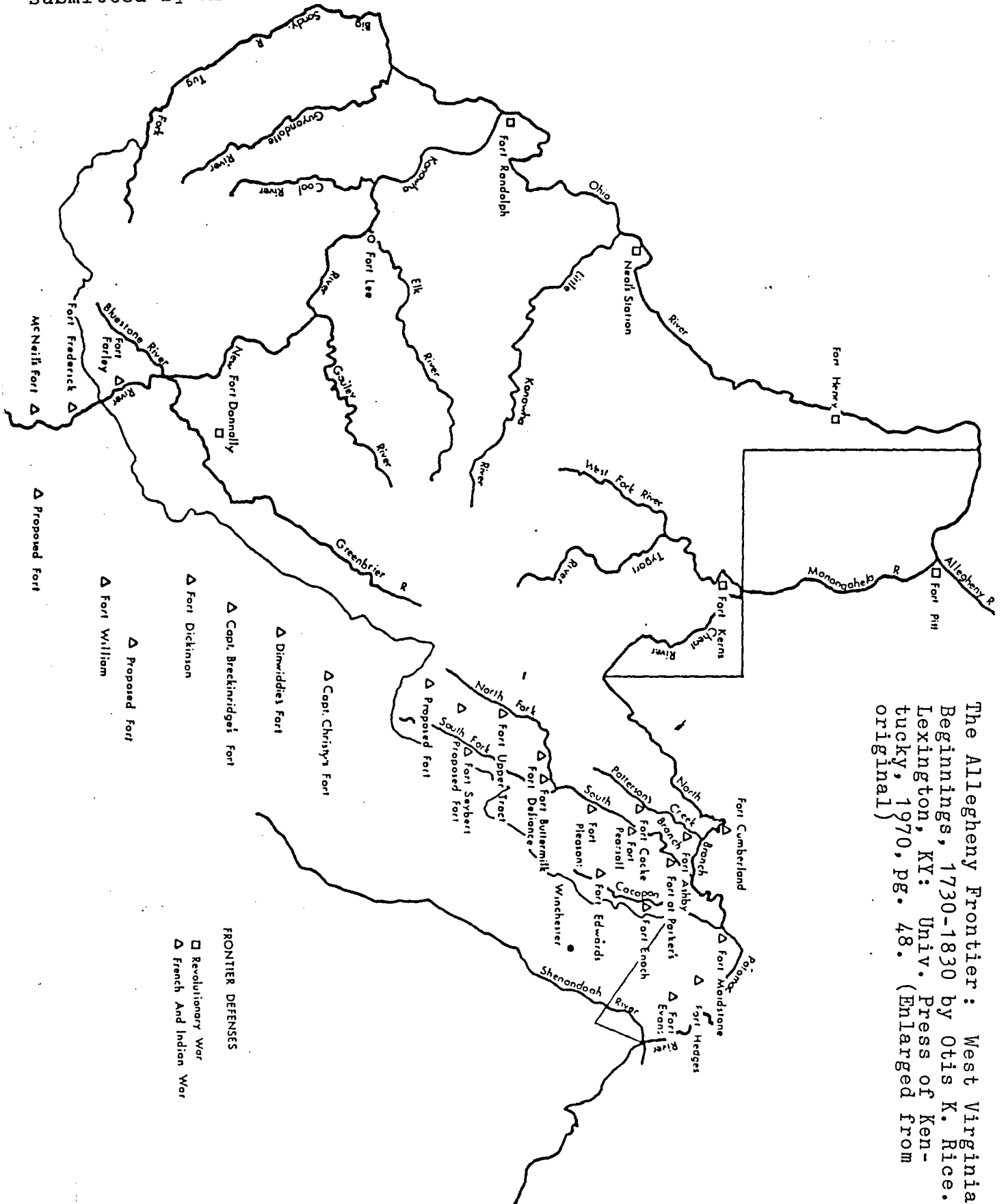

When a man has a grandson or a nephew, named after him, having the same given names and surnames, then that grandson or nephew is a II or (2nd). A good example of this is found in the Ford Motor Co. family. The founder was Henry Ford, Sr., and his grandson Henry II.

A son following a Junior or a II and having the same given names would be a III (3rd.). This is the accepted rule in genealogy.

### *Hard up settlers didn't pick up mail*

Have you read an old newspaper and come across a list of people who had letters at the post office and wondered where they were and why they didn't pick up their mail? Perhaps the reason was money.

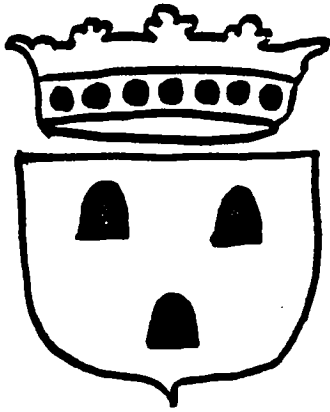
Before 1845 the postage was paid by the receiver when he came to town. In those times hard cash was rare and even a penny was dear. Rather than thinking your ancestor had died or moved, consider his finances. Perhaps he just didn't have money to pay the postage.

Information found in the 1897 *History of Peru Twp.* regarding postage rates follows. Postage on a newspaper for one year in 1897 was 75 cents; postage on letters, until 1845, was, for a distance not exceeding 30 miles, 6¼ cents; over 30 and not exceeding 80 miles, 10 cents; over 80 and not exceeding 150 miles, 12½ cents; over 150 and not exceeding 400 miles, 18¾ cents; over 400 and not exceeding 500 miles, 20 cents; and 25 cents for all distances over 500 miles — the postage paid by the receiver.

In 1845 a partial reduction was made by Congress, and in July 1851, letter postage was reduced to 3 cents per half ounce for all distances. Three-cent stamps and a three-cent coin for convenience in prepaying postage was at that time ordered by Congress. — *Kishwaukee Genealogists, Vol. II:6, from Delaware Co. OH Newsletter*

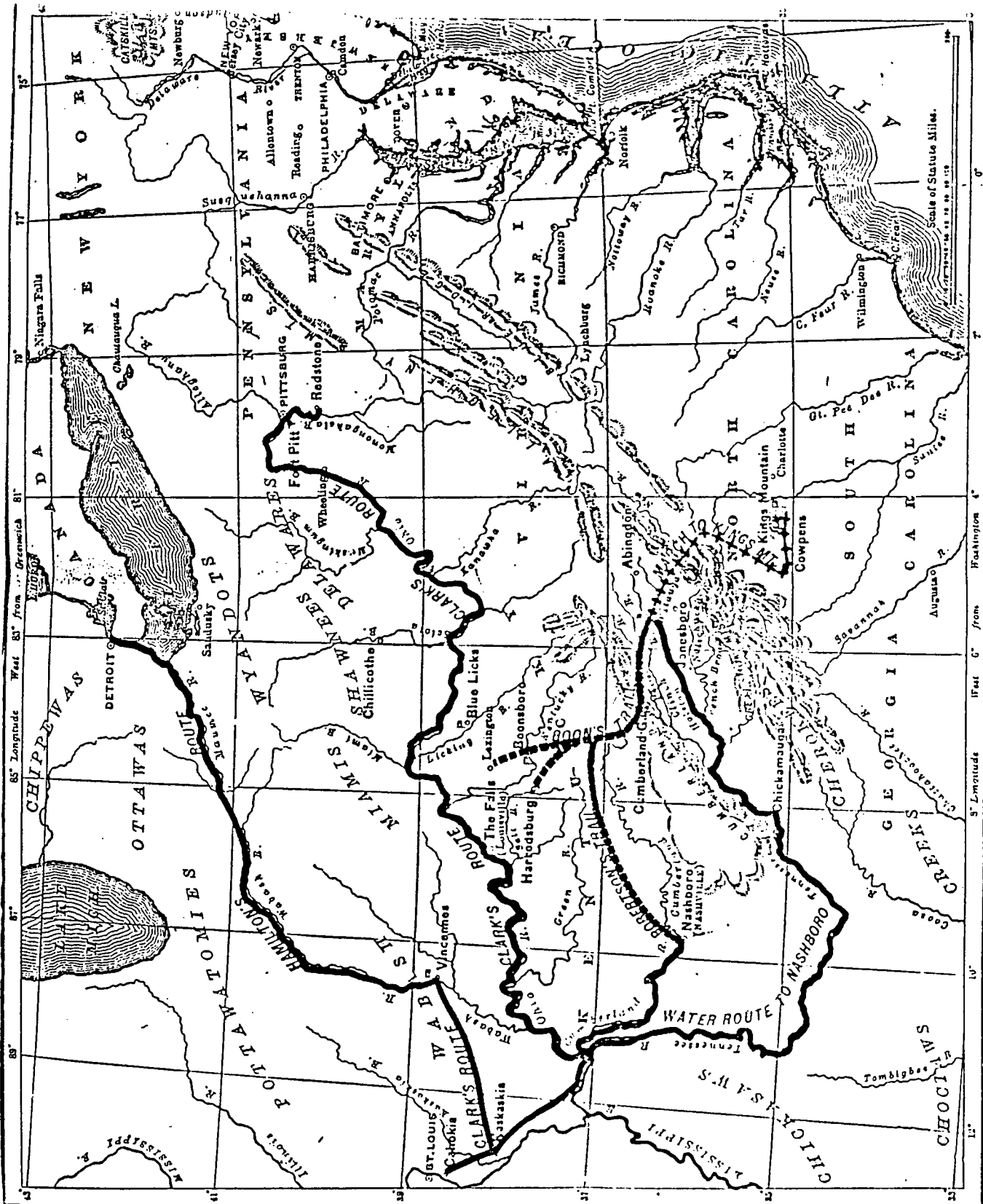

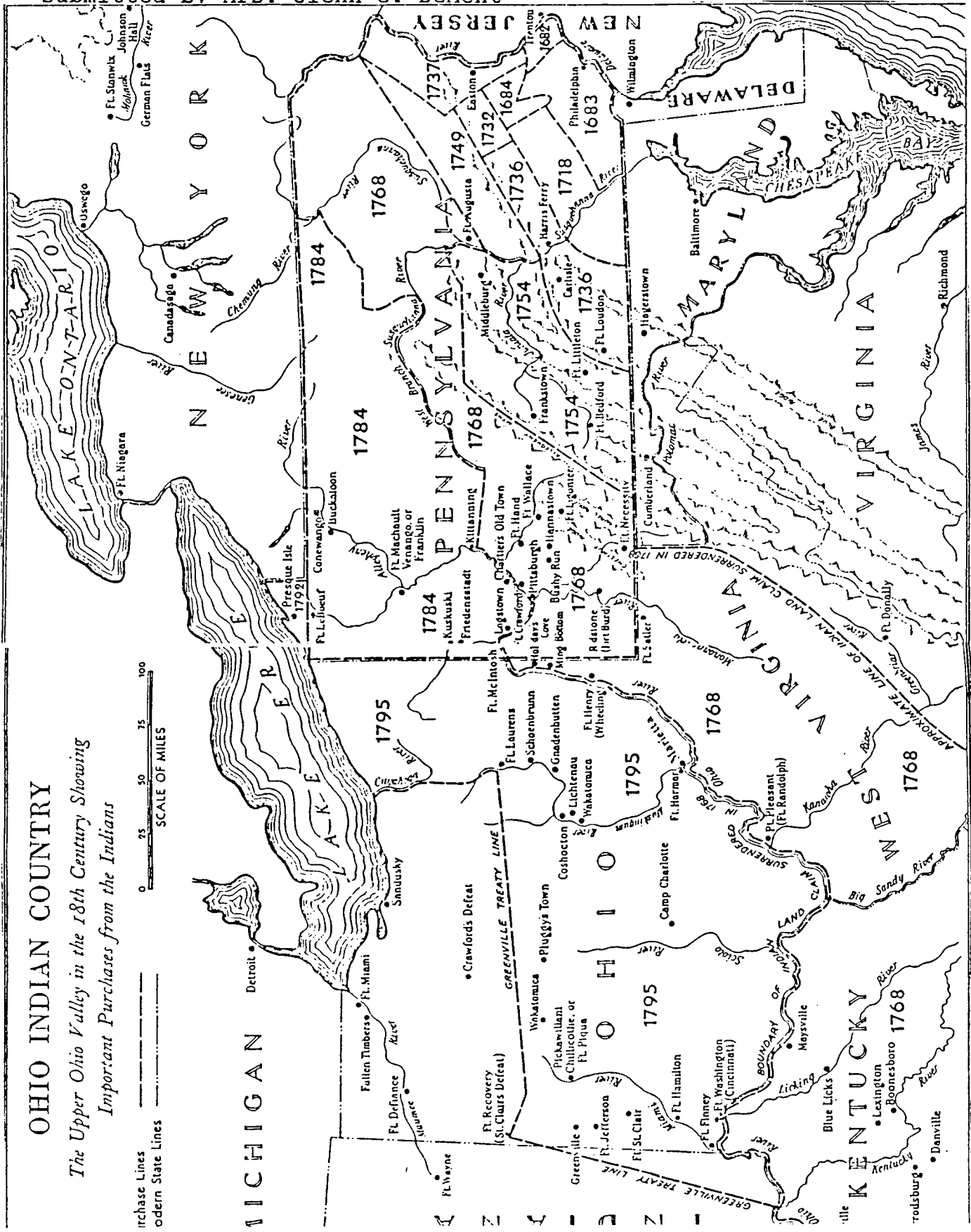

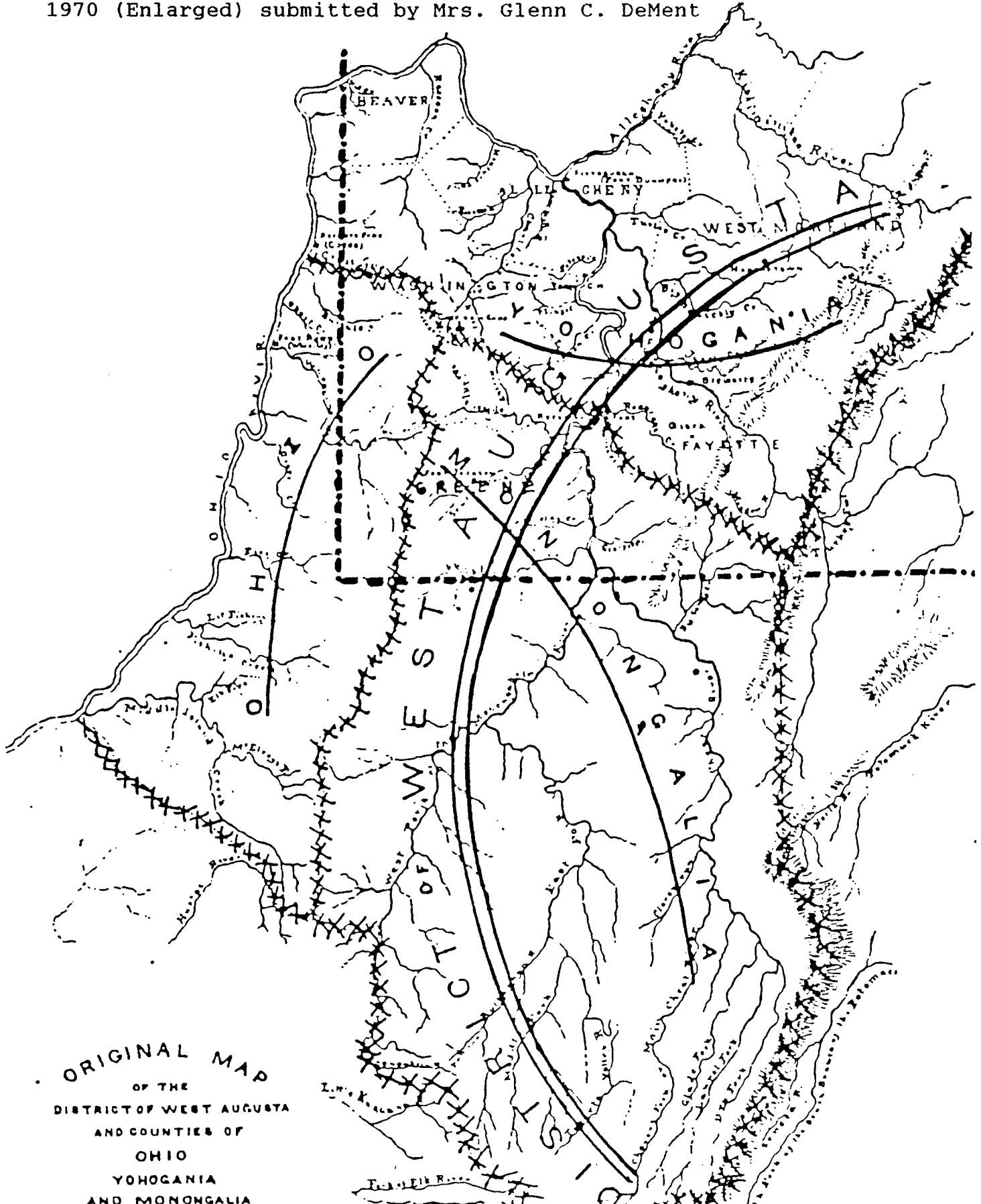

OLDEST WOMAN IN WINFIELD ENJOYS AN ANNIVERSARY

Mrs. Nancy Harcourt is still active at age of 95.

Mrs. Harcourt was born in Logan Co. Illinois, February 17, 1836 to Joseph and Margaret (Riddle) Dement. When she was 22 years old, she was united in marriage with John M. Harcourt. The wedding occurred 18 November, 1858 in Logan Co. Illinois.

In the year 1870, twelve years after their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Harcourt came to Kansas and settled on a farm near Rock, Kansas. Their coming preceded the incorporation of Winfield by three years, while Cowley County was organized in the same year the Harcourt family came to Kansas.

For 23 years the Harcourts lived on their homestead near Rock until September 16, 1893 when they moved to Winfield. John Marion Harcourt was born 16 July, 1836 in Austin, Indiana to John and Marietta (Heady) Harcourt John died 24 February 1916. When Nancy became a widow, she made her home with her son, George Alonso Harcourt.

Mr. and Mrs. Harcourt were the parents of seven children, three of whom are still living in 1931. They are George Harcourt, Winfield, Kansas, Harvey Harcourt of Branson, Missouri and Mrs. Elsie Fink of San Diego, California.

Mrs. Nancy Riddle Dement Harcourt died in Winfield, Kansas on November 24, 1931.

The following article is submitted by Mrs. EVERETT P. TOMLINSON of Chatham, MA of a death notice of her great-uncle RICHARD ASHBURY DEMENT. Richard was the son of Richard Dement and his second wife, Sarah Ashbury, and grandson of William and Elizabeth (Bryan) Dement. I submit this article as she sent it to me because Mrs. Tomlinson told me that the writing at the top is her grandmother, Nellie Compton Jenkins' handwriting.

The following extract of a letter from Lieut. CLAIRBORNE, of company C of the Mounted Rifles, addressed to Mr. R. Dement, father of a young townsman of ours, who, at only 17 years of age, volunteered under the lamented Walker in the Mexican war, renders but too probable, we fear, the loss of the brave youth. There is a hope left, however, that his life has been spared, which we sincerely trust may be realized.

CITY OF MEXICO, JANUARY 12, 1848.

I wish that I had it in my power to give you some information concerning your son. My own hopes, that he had fallen into the hands of the enemy unhurt, were derived from Santa Anna's own account of the battle, in which he stated he had taken some prisoners. If this is true we have never had any news from them whatever, but I doubt now very much whether he took any prisoners, and it is little likely that he took any of Walker's company, for they were men who did not know how to yield, and among the most courageous and gallant was Richard A. Dement. I have seen him in action, and he was by my side at La Hoya; he would not even take cover there. Walker esteemed him very highly, as did myself also; nor do I believe there was one man his superior in the company. I take pleasure in stating this, now that he may be gone forever. And if it is any consolation for you to hear me say it, he was in a word popular, modest, cleanly in his habits as a soldier; always on duty, having a warm heart, in which there was not a drop of coward blood.

Jim W. Dement, Jackson Mississippi sent the following article from "Genealogical Guide To The Early Settlers Of America" by Henry Whittemore, Gen. Publishing Co. Baltimore, Md. 1967, page 143.

DEMING, DEMON or DEMENT:—John Deming, of Wethersfield, 1635, one of the chief settlers, representative very often from 1649 to 61, named in the charter of 1662, married Honour, daughter of Richard Treat, had John, born September 9, 1638; and others. His will of June 26, 1690, with probate 1705, names sons John, Jonathan, 1639; Samuel, 1646; David, Ebenezer; and five daughters, wives of John Morgan (whose name was probably Rachel); of Richard Beckley; of Thomas Hurlbut (whose name was Mary); of Thomas Wright, and probably Sarah, wife of Samuel Moody, beside some grand-children.

THOMAS DEMING, of Wethersfield, perhaps brother of first John, married July 24, 1645, Mary Sheaffe, was of Farmington, and removed to Southampton, L. I., thence to Easthampton, where posterity is still living. Sometimes in the records the name is Demon or Dement, and the affinity is exceedingly difficult to be traced with exactness. Eight of this name had, in 1828, been graduated at New England colleges.

The first constables were special, trusted men, chosen by the king to guard his stable, and armaments. In France, the constable was second in power to the king, serving as commander-in chief of the army and judge in matters of chivalry.

American constables were appointed and later elected to regulate sales of bread, wine, and wood, survey land, announce marriages and execute warrants. In Tennessee, the constable was the town's lone lawman up until the early 1900's!

# Searchers Limited By State Genealogists Face Barriers To Data

As an amateur genealogist, Deborah Lydon of Houston has tracked her father's family history back 200 years with the help of census records and death records from several states.

But her search for records of her mother-in-law's ancestors stopped last week before it even began when St. Louis officials refused to allow her to search an index to the death records kept by the city health and hospitals department.

The roadblock Lydon ran into has vexed amateur genealogists for about three years. Unless amateur researchers can provide a name and an approximate date of death of the person whose records they are searching for, it is all but impossible for them to obtain official death information from vital records kept by the state and individual counties.

Lydon had sought access to a "death card index," which state and city officials say can only be used by professional heir tracers and newspaper reporters. Until about three years ago, city workers often allowed amateur genealogists to look at the index. But state health officials told city workers

that they shouldn't allow amateur researchers access to the index.

The state gave the order to the city amid a dispute over the state's attempt to limit access to death records by newspaper reporters and professional heir researchers.

Two heir-researching firms and the Pulitzer Publishing Co., which publishes the Post-Dispatch, filed a suit in February 1988 that challenged the state's restrictions.

St. Louis Circuit Judge Robert G. Dowd Jr. ruled in January 1989 that newspaper reporters and heir researchers had the right to examine and obtain copies of death certificates.

But the ruling did not directly address whether the general public should have access to records. After Dowd's ruling, the state opened the death card index to newspaper reporters and professional researchers, but not to amateur genealogists.

The city's vital records office will provide copies of death certificates to a family member if he or she knows the name and approximate date of death of the ancestor. But Lydon said

that many amateur genealogists don't always have that information and would prefer to be able to look through the index that lists all deaths alphabetically by year.

"If I could look through the card index, I could go year by year searching for a particular family member," Lydon said. "What's so important about the death records is that they often list the names of parents, which helps you go back another generation."

"They also sometimes tell you the cemetery or church that the person was buried from, which gives you another lead. By restricting the card index, they've totally closed off a whole avenue of research for genealogical purposes."

The St. Louis Genealogical Society gets many complaints about blocked access to records, said Herman Radloff, a volunteer with the society.

"We tell them to try to circumvent the problem by looking at other sources, such as back issues of newspapers," he said.

The state is revising its rules on access to death records but plans to retain limits on access by amateur researchers, said Gary Shipley, chief of the state's bureau of vital records. The state is concerned about the death records being misused for commercial purposes or impersonations.

### CLARK COUNTY'S HISTORIC FIRSTS

#### Springfield's First Cemetery

On Columbia Street between Center Street and Wittenberg Ave. is the first burial grounds in Springfield, the resting of the city's pioneer citizens and soldiers. This "Old Cemetery," as it has been known is a hallowed spot which should be revered by all of us, as here all Springfield's dead until 1845 were laid to rest. Facts about the "Old Cemetery" and the dead buried there are meager and most difficult to uncover from the few records found. Springfield is indebted to George S. Dial of this city for the facts he unearthed and recorded in a most interesting and instructive paper read by him at the annual meeting of the Clark County Historical Society Sept. 9, 1926. I am quoting from this valuable paper:

"Columbia Street Cemetery dates back to 1803, for early accounts say that Mrs. James Demint was the fourth person to be buried there in the year named. However, the cemetery was not surveyed, laid out, and dedicated as a cemetery until 1814 and when James Demint laid addition to the village of Springfield which was know as Demint's Addition West of Mill Run. It was the only cemetery in Springfield until Greenmount Cemetery was bought in 1845.

There is no plat of this cemetery, and no burial permits are recorded in the City Building and no records anywhere that can be found, of the people buried there. All that is known about this cemetery is contained in the inscriptions on the monuments and in traditions and personal recollections. There are about 160 monuments of which 25 are totally illegible, and many others are being affected by time and exposure, as they are nearly all of sandstone or limestone and not durable. It will be of interest to tell of some of the early pioneers buried there.

"(1) James Demint, the founder of Springfield, died in Urbana in 1817. His home at the time of his death was in New Boston, this county. His first wife had been buried there in 1803 and Nancy Demint, his second wife, who survived him, also was buried there at an unknown date, thus making three graves of this family of founders of Springfield, who are buried there: but not many knoweth where, for none of their graves are marked by any tombstone and even tradition does not give any hint of their possible location.

"(2) John Daugherty, the surveyor who laid out the town plat. He was a colonel in the War of 1812 and was elected Clark County's first auditor in 1818.

"(3) Mrs. Griffith Foos, his first wife, has a tombstone still in a good state of preservation.

"(4) Maddox Fisher was buried in 1836 in Columbia Street Cemetery but no one knows where, for no monument marks his grave.

"(5) Dr. William A. Needham, the father of medicine in Clark County, came from Vermont to here in 1814, died in 1832, and was buried in Columbia Street Cemetery. No monument marks his grave.

"(6) General Charles Anthony died in 1862. He and his wife and children are buried here and have a large monument in a good state of preservation.

Seven Revolutionary soldiers have been buried in Columbia Street Cemetery, two of whom have been removed to other cemeteries. The shrine of their memory and the gallant deeds.

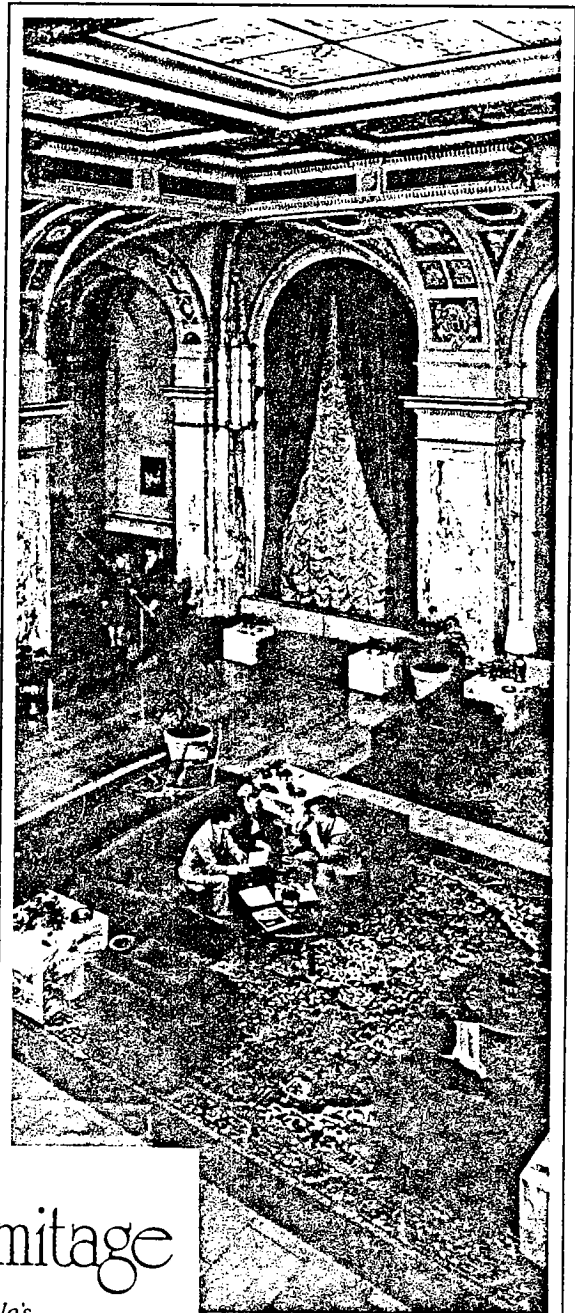
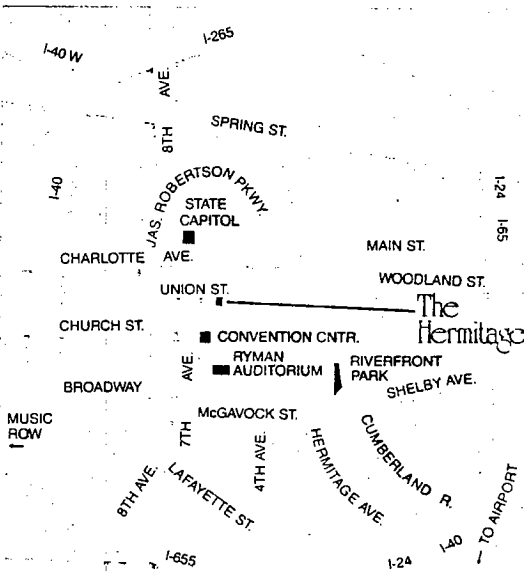
