

Assignment: To advance the lineage from Joshua Thomas, born c1799 in SC, in Kemper Co, MS in 1860 and 1870, in Green Co., AL in 1830. His wife is stated to have been Polly Roaden. He is believed to be connected with Josiah, Joshua, and Jeremiah Thomas of Edgefield County/District, SC.



in SC, d. 17 July 1906 in Kemper Co., MS. Buried in the same cemetery near Dekalb, MS, is a P. L. Blair, b. Edgefield Dist., SC, d. 17 Aug 1849, aged 52 years, 3 months. Kemper County, MS.

<u>Information</u>: Edgefield County was formed in 1785 as a county of Ninety Six District. While Edgefield County has not suffered a major loss of records, an apparent first deed book is missing, and some county court minutes are missing. The common pleas judgment rolls (civil suits) are extant, but they are being processed at the South Carolina Archives' records center and will probably not be available for research for some months.

<u>Strategy</u>: To check deeds, probate records, equity records, and other records available.

First, I searched the Edgefield grantor (seller) deed index for a possible "exit" deed for Joshua Thomas. I did not find any deeds to or from him there. Therefore, he probably left Edgefield District without having owned any land. I did not find his name on the 1820 census in South Carolina; therefore, he probably was not head of a household by that time. If he did not marry until after the taking of the 1820 census and he were living in Alabama by 1830, his name will probably not appear on a census in South Carolina. Since we find no deeds for him, his name might not appear in any record in South Carolina. However, if his father or mother died in Edgefield District, leaving a will or estates papers, we might find his name and advance in the lineage in that way.

I searched the following estate files for the surname Thomas in Edgefield County records, which are within the appropriate time period (on microfilm at SC Archives):

Charles Thomas 28:999
James Thomas 28:1015
William Thomas 30:1059

Elizabeth Thomas 45:1937 James Thomas 46:1947

I did not find any mention of a Joshua Thomas in any of these records. I also searched the estate of the only Roden/Rhoden listed, being Edward Roden 25:902. No heirs at listed in the estate file.

I also searched the abstracts of Edgefield County wills (see copy of index pages enclosed -- no Blair entries at all) and I do not find any of the Thomas or Roden/Rhoden names in which we are interested.

Ms. Barbara Langdon has done us a great service by compiling and publishing a volume of marriage references from the probate records and the equity records. It is titled Edgefield County Marriages 1769-1880 Implied in Edgefield County, 8. C., Probate Records. I enclose copies of the male entries for Thomas, Blair, and Roden/-Rhoden. We do not find any of the names in which are you interested—at least you are not interested in them thus far.

I did find one Roden deed, which I deemed worth copying for you:

Edgefield County Deed Book 35, pages 50-51 [copy enclosed from LDS microfilm renumbered ED 98 at SC Archives]:

George Roden and Sarah Roden of Edgefield District for \$50 to Hezekiah Almon of Orangeburg District, 100 acres in the District of Edgefield on South Edisto River and a branch of the same, dated ____ Jan 1817. George Roden (mark) (Seal), Sarah Roden (X) (Seal), Wit: Catey Dozier, John M. Dozier. Proved by the oath of John M. Dozier 15 Jan 1817 before Francis Dozier, J. Q. Recorded 4 March 1818.

I enclose a page from the index to War of 1812 pension applications for Rhoden. I notice that both Rhodens had South Carolina service. These records would have to be obtained from the National Archives in Washington.

I found no equity suits involving these families. Edgefield had its own equity court (separated from Ninety Six District, which court sat at Abbeville) beginning in 1811.

It could be that the parents of Joshua Thomas and his wife both removed from Edgefield District. Perhaps there are records in Green County, Alabama, to help. There are over 300 small volumes by Pauline J. Gandrud on various Alabama records which should be in one of the libraries in Houston (perhaps the Clayton Library) and it might pay you to search them, especially those volumes involving Green County, Alabama, records.

Now, to the Blairs. There is only one estate file for a Blair in the appropriate time period. I copied it so we can have a base from which to work. It seems likely that your Hayes Blair would be related to the P. L. Blair from Edgefield District who is buried in

the same cemetery. Perhaps that was his father. At any rate, this is the best indication of an Edgefield connection thus far.

Martin, T. H. Nixon, John Parks, Terrel Goff, Emberson Bussey, Clem Jennings, John Crawford, Thos H. Howle Senr, Robt Crawford.

Inventory made 2 Dec 1829 by John Tompkins, Richard Hardy, Abiah Morgan (A), Joseph Jennings.

Admn bond: Sarah Blair (X), and Thomas H. Nixon., admrs, 23 Nov 1829; James Tomkins, Alexander Sharpton, securities.

Settlement 29 May 1843 shows widows thirds, and 8 distributees [not named].

Sarah Blair and Thomas H. Nixon applied for admn 5 Nov 1829.

1838. Paid Ansley Colvin in full for his distributive share of the personal estate "in right of my wife Sarah."

Paid James H. Blair in full of his distributive share. 1835, Set. 28.

1838, June 20th. Paid Pulaski L. Blair in full of his share of the personal estate.

Comments: Obviously, Sarah L. Blair was the widow of Christopher Blair who probably died in late 1829. Thomas H. Nixon may have married one of the daughters. We know for certain that Ansley Colvin married the daughter Sarah and that James H. Blair and Pulaski Blair were among the heirs. Pulaski L. Blair must be the P. L. Blair who is buried in Mississippi. Now, we surely are on the right track here. The name Haizel Blair appears. Hazel was a male name in the nineteenth century. This is similar to the name Hayes H. Blair whom you seek. Of course, this is too early for your Hayes H. Blair who was born in 1833. My grandfather's oldest brother was William Hazel Holcomb (1886-1918) and he is remembered as "Uncle Haze."

<u>Information</u>: Besides the usual probate records (wills and estates), by an act passed in December 1824, any estate with real estate worth less than \$1000 not devised in a will could be sold or partitioned by special proceedings from the court of ordinary (probate court). In Edgefield County, the records are known as receipt books or cash books. I checked these books, and I found no

proceedings which help on the Thomas or Roden families, but I found a very interesting record concerning the Blair family.

Edgefield County Cash Book A, pages 78-79 [copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2975]:

Edgefield County Cash Book A, page 51 [copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2975]:

Hannah Robenson of Augusta, Georgia, appoints Henry Robinson of said city attorney to receive by the representatives of Christopher Blair now residing in the State of South Carolina from the estate of my late mother Barsheby Hill....

Comments: These two records here indicate that Christopher Blair's mother was Barsheba Hill at the time of her death. Therefore, the other distributees would be his siblings or at least half-siblings. It seems most likely that they were all Blairs (the women before marriage), since there is one other Blair listed, being Gabriel Blair who received the same amount as the heirs of Christopher Blair collectively.

I found in another source still further proceedings on this estate:

Edgefield County Summons in Partition, page 51-52 [copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2969]:

State of South Carolina, Edgefield District. Sarah Blair applicant vs Hannah Robertson, Gabriel Blair & Bersheba Thomas. To Sarah Blair widow, of G. W. Blair, Hazle Blair, Robert Jennings Jr. & Elizabeth his wife, James Blair, Pulaski Blair, Sarah Blair, Christopher Blair & Columbus Blair, heirs of Christopher Blair, Hannah Robertson, Gabriel Blair, Bersheba Thomas, sole heir of Mary Johnson decd, heirs and representatives of Bersheba Hill who died intestate... tract on Stephens Creek adj. lands of William Howle Junr, James Kilcrease and others, 150 acres....

Comments: There appears to be a clerk's error. It should read "Sarah Blair widow, G. W. Blair...." Anyway, now we have the names

of the eight children of Christopher and Sarah Blair spelled out for us. Notice that Hazle Blair is among them, as well as G. W. Blair.

Now, since we did not find any land mentioned of Christopher Blair himself (there should have been some, since there was an estate file), I searched for deeds from the heirs, or at least some of them. I did not find any deeds for Pulaski L. Blair, but I did find another deed.

Edgefield County Deed Book 46, pages 27-28 [copy enclosed from LDS microfilm renumbered ED 102 at SC Archives]:

State of South Carolina. Washington Blair of the District of Edgefield for \$60 paid by Sarah Blair of same, all my interest and estate and all my right, title and claim to the tract or tracts of land belonging to the estate of Christopher Blair decd, whereon the said Sarah Blair now lives, 361 acres on Stephens' Creek of Savannah River... dated 23 April 1832. Washington Blair (LS), wit: E. Hammond, James Tomkins. Martha Blair (X), wife of Washington Blair, relinquished dower 20 Sept 1832 before T. H. Nixon, J. Q. Proved by the oath of James Tomkins 20 Sept 1832 before T. H. Nixon, Q. U.

Strategy: Now, since P. L. Blair is still one of the main persons in mind and he died in 1849, his heirs (if any) would likely still be living in Kemper Co., MS. We do not have out-of-state census here in Columbia, but I was going to Greenville (100 miles away) where there is a library having most of the Southern states' census. Therefore, I took the time to go there and checked the census index. I found not the heirs of P. L. Blair, but the same entry which you already had, as follows:

Comments: Well, here is ou Lanswer. We find "Hasle" approximately the same age as your Hayes H. Blair. He is listed in the household of G. W. and Martha Blair, from South Carolina. Notice that Washington Blair (called G. W. in the estate settlement) had wife Martha in South Carolina. Notice also that two children (James and Mary) were born in Alabama. Hazel was obviously named for his uncle. He appears to have been the oldest child, and Washington/G. W. probably sold out his interest to his mother shortly after his marriage to Martha.

Assignment: To continue research on the Blair lineage. Previous research advanced the lineage to Christopher Blair, who died in 1829 and to his mother Barsheby Hill (apparently she had married, second, a Hill). To continue the research on Thomas, especially to search for records to advance the lineage from Joshua Thomas, born c1799 in SC, in Kemper Co, MS in 1860 and 1870, in Green Co., AL in 1830. Client wishes to have records on Josiah, Joshua, and Jeremiah Thomas of Edgefield County/District, SC.

<u>Information</u>: Edgefield County was formed in 1785 as a county of Ninety Six District. While Edgefield County has not suffered a major loss of records, an apparent first deed book is missing, and some county court minutes are missing. The common pleas judgment rolls (civil suits) are extant, but they are being processed at the South Carolina Archives' records center and will probably not be available for research for some months.

Strategy: On the Blair lineage, to search for probate records, deeds, or other records to show the name of the Blair husband of Barsheba. Hername appears as Bersheba Blair on the 1790 census of Edgefield County, with three males under 16 and three females in the household. If and when we determine the name of her husband, we will search for records on him, including the COM Index (see enclosed explanation) for the Colonial and Revolutionary periods.

First, I searched the Edgefield probate index (again) for a possible will or estate for a Blair which might name Barsheba as a widow and/or Christopher as a son or heir. I did not find any other Blair entries besides those in the previous report. I checked also the Edgefield County deed indices, but I found no Blair deeds to help us. I next searched my published Edgefield County, South Carolina, Minutes of the County Court 1785-1795 and found an entry to answer our question. I ordered a copy of the pages from original minute book on microfilm at the SC Archives:

Edgefield County Court Minutes, page 132 [page 114 included to give the date of the entry, copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2886]:

10 October 1787. On application Barshaba Blair widow of George Blair deceased, ordered that the administration of all and singular the goods and chattles of the said deceased be granted to her, she having entered into bond with Henry Key and John Martin in the sum

of £200 for the faithful discharge of her duty. Ordered that the Warrant of appraisement directed to John Griffin, James Thomas, Christopher Glanton, and William Key or any three of them to authorize them to appraise the goods and chattles of George Blair deceased.

Comments: This proves that George Blair was the husband of Barsheba. The date (1787) is consistent with her having been a widow on the 1790 census. As indicated, I found no estates papers. There may have been no further proceedings and the papers were not filed. I checked for recorded copies, but there are no estate books (only will books) in Edgefield County for this early period. I found the presence of a James Thomas of possible interest. I have not found any record or reference to indicate the maiden name of Barsheba.

Further strategy: Since George Blair probably had five children before his death in 1787, he would have been of age to have served in the Revolution. If he were in South Carolina, he should have some records listed in the COM Index. Therefore, I checked that index for him and other Blairs in the same area of South Carolina.

Information: South Carolina has very few actual Revolutionary War records. However, there are Audited Accounts (AA's) and Stub Entries (SE's). A card file in the Search Room of the South Carolina Archives indexes both of these series, including every name mentioned in the file in most cases. The AA's are also included in the Archives Computer Output Microfilm (COM) Index, but only by the name of the person who served or who provided supplies. A booklet available from the South Carolina Archives for \$3.00 entitled Accounts Audited of Claims Growing Out of the Revolution in South Carolina by Judith M. Brimelow explains these records in There are more than 10,000 such AA's. According to Ms. Brimelow "The files often include auditor's papers, interest-bearing certificates called principal indents, and treasury and legislative papers that were related to claims. Some files provide only the briefest description of military or civilian service; others give considerable detail." Most of the military service mentioned in the AA's is service rendered after the fall of Charlestown (1780). Prior to that time, it is assumed that the army was regularly paid, and there is no extant record of this payment. An occasional muster roll or pay register is found, and some of these have been published The South Carolina Historical and Genealogical Magazine and The South Carolina Magazine of Ancestral Research. The stub entries correspond with the indents (included in the AA's), in the way that a check stub corresponds to a check written today. Many stub entries are extant for which there is no indent, and vice versa. Some of the indents were used as payment for state land grants. Endorsements are frequently found on the reverse side of the indents. These occasionally indicate a district or county, and, therefore, serve to locate the individual who provided the service. Others are signed by persons to whom the indent was assigned or sold, or merely the interest assigned or These signatures can also be clues as to the residence of the person who provided such civil or military service.

Audited Account 528, GEORGE BLAIR [copy enclosed from microfilm at SC Archives]:

July 8th 1785. Mr. George Blair his account of Militia Duty as Private since the reduction of Charleston, $\mathfrak{k}--17$ $1\frac{1}{2}$.

Received 8 July 1785 full satisfaction for the within accot in Indent No 177 U, Drury Pace.

Please deliver my Indents unto Capt. Drewry Pace for service in Col. Hammond's regiment. George Blair (mark)

State South Carolina, Ninety Six District. Before me Hugh Middleton, one of the justices for the district aforesaid, personally appeared Moses Mathews and Makes oath that he has not until now given any order for his indents. 17th Sept 1785. George Blair (mark), Hugh Middleton, J.P.

July 9th 1785. Mr. George Blair his account of Militia Duty as Private previous to the reduction of Charleston, £6 1 5.

<u>Comments</u>: Col. Hammond (Leroy) was an officer of what was later <u>Edgefield</u> County, thus placing George Blair in the right area of South Carolina. The reduction of Charleston was in 1780; therefore, George Blair was of militia age (at least 16) before that time.

I also noted land records In the COM on George Blair and a William Blair in the same area. I ordered copies of these records:

Colonial Plats, Volume 9, page 100-101 [copy enclosed from microfilm ST46 at SC Archives]:

Pursuant to a warrant by the Hon. Wm Bull Esqr., Lt. Gov., with a precept direct by John Troup, D. S. G., dated 6 May 1766; I have admeasured and laid out unto George Blair, 100 acres in Belfast Township in the County of Granville, vacant on all sides, 19 Sept 1766. Matt: Long, D. S.

Pursuant to a warrant by the Hon. Wm Bull Esqr., Lt. Gov., with a precept direct by John Troup, D. S. G., dated 6 May 1766, I have admeasured and laid out unto William Blair, 100 acres in Bélfast Township in the County of Granville, adj. George Blair, 19 Sept 1766. Matt: Long, D. S.

<u>Comments</u>: Notice that these are adjacent tracts and the precept dates (usually dates of application for the land) are the same. We will return to this a little later in this report.

Royal Grants, Volume 14, page 432 [copy enclosed from microfilm ST65 at SC Archives]:

BOUNTY. George III to George Blair, 100 acres in Belfast Township in the Granville County, vacant on all sides, 1 June 1767.

Royal Grants, Volume 14, page 383 [copy enclosed from microfilm ST65 at SC Archives]:

BOUNTY. George III to William Blair, 100 acres in Belfast Township in the Granville County, adj. land of George Blair, 1 June 1767.

Land Memorials, Volume 9, page 274-275 [copy enclosed from microfilm ST 92 at SC Archives]:

A Memorial exhibited by George Blair, 100 acres in Granville County in Belfast Township, vacant on all sides, survey certified 19 Sept 1766 and granted 1 June 1767 to the Mem'st. 11 Aug 1767. For the Mem'st, John Allen.

A Memorial exhibited by William Blair, 100 acres in Granville County in Belfast Township, adj. George Blair, survey certified 19 Sept 1766 and granted 1 June 1767 to the Mem'st. 11 Aug 1767. For the Mem'st, John Allen.

Information: A bit of explanation is necessary about the granting of lands on family right. Prior to the year 1755, land was granted to persons coming into the province of South Carolina on a "headright" of 50 acres per person, whether they were male, female, free or slave, white, or black. From the British Public Records Office (BPRO) film, Volume 24, page 314, we have instructions to Governor James Glen in March 1750/1 "His Majesty's Governours by these Instructions are direct to proportion all the Grants according to the number of Persons White or Black that each Grantee has in his family, and to allow fifty acres for each person" In the year 1755, this practice was altered slightly to allow 100 acres for the head of the household, and 50 acres for each additional person in the household. BPRO film Volume 26, pages 314-6, 4 November 1755, in instructions to Governor William Henry Littleton, "That one hundred acres of Land be granted to every person being Master or Mistress of a family for himself or herself and 50 acres for every White or Black man, Woman or Child, of which such persons shall consist at the actual time of making the Grant ... Many families had fairly young children (usually teenagers) who declared themselves to be the "head" of the household, or a single person, in order to obtain 100 acres of land instead of the 50 acres which would have been obtained on their right as a member of another household. As of 1763, no person was allowed land for any children of the age of eighteen years or older. A person eighteen years or older was supposed to obtain land in his or her own name (which would have been 100 acres for a single person).

The precept date (in this case 6 May 1766) usually approximates the date of the application in the Council Journal. I searched the Council Journal for 6 May 1766 and a month prior without success. Fortunately, I have been abstracting the petitions for land from the council journals for publication, and I had completed the year 1766. Therefore, I went to my computer files and located the Blair entries. I was surprised to find them even earlier, 31 March 1766. I will interpolate the entries from my computer file:

The Petitioners severally produced their Certificates of their being protestants & prayed to be allowed the Bounty given by the Act of the General Assembly of this Province passed 25th July 1761.

Ordered that the Clerk do grant them certificates agreeable to the prayers of their petitions.

Comments: The entries in brackets indicate variants from the South Carolina copy to the British copy. I ordered copies of entries from both on microfilm for you. Both William Blair and George Blair were single men, immigrants from Ireland in 1766. George's age is given as 16 and as 30. I suspect the younger age is more nearly correct, and I suspect that William and George were brothers. There is not enough difference in their age for them to have been father and son. Therefore, our Blair search ends in our finding your immigrant ancestor, George Blair.

Strategy for Thomas: We will search again for deeds involving Josiah, Joshua, and Jeremiah Thomas in Edgefield records. Using the published abstracts of Edgefield County deeds, I found only one deed involving Jeremiah Thomas and none for Josiah or Joshua Thomas in the early period (before 1798).

Edgefield County Deed Book 13, pages 422-525 [copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2607]:

Lease and release. 28 & 29 Oct 1795, Jeremiah Thomas of the State of Georgia, planter, to John Jones of Edgefield County, Ninety Six District, SC, for £20 sterling, 100 acres, part of tract of 3200 acres on branches of Rockey creek, a branch of Little Stevens's Creek, waters of Savannah River in Edgefield County, granted to said Jeremiah Thomas 6 Oct 1794 adj. Messersmith, Elisha Stevens, Neates Stevens, Charles Partin, John Jones. Jeremiah Thomas (X) (Seal) Wit: Jamos Coate, Jesse Clark, Jas Scott. Proved by the oath of James Scott 31 Dec 1796 before John Blocker, J.P.

<u>Comments</u>: This deed indicates that this Jeremiah Thomas had removed to Georgia by 1795. You indicate that his name appears on the 1800 census of Edgefield District. Of course, Georgia was just across the Savannah River. In 1795, there were only a few counties in Georgia, and research there might well locate information on him. Perhaps he left record which would mention Joshua Thomas.

I searched the Edgefield deed index (beyond the period where abstracts are available) in case there were deeds recorded years

after their execution. I found one search deed, and I include it for the sake of completeness and in case it should prove helpful later in your search.

Edgefield County Deed Book 17, pages 261-271 [copy enclosed from SC Archives microfilm C2609]:

Lease and release. 11 & 12 June 1770, Charity Thomas of Colleton County, SC, spinstress, to Charles Williams of Granville County, planter, for £200 SC money, 200 acres adj. lands granted to Francis Bryce now held by Daniel Rogers. Charity Thomas (Seal), Wit: James Findley, Wm Roberts. Proved 12 June 1770 before John Purves, J. P., by the oath of William Roberts. Recorded 2 July 1799.





FIGURE 5.4 Gullah baskets. These may be found in the Charleston market and along coastal highways.

and along the coastal highways (Fig. 5.4). Needless to say, it was the knowledge, labor, and suffering of blacks that made such crops as rice and indigo—and later, cotton—successful and provided the foundation for South Carolina's colonial and antebellum wealth.

By 1730 settlement of the interior was just beginning, and rice production was well established in the Outer Coastal Plain. For more than a half-century, South Carolina had been a lonely outpost of the British Empire, threatened constantly by the Spaniards at St. Augustine and by Indians. Furthermore, the Yemassee War of 1715 discouraged settlement in the Beaufort area for almost a decade. Not until 1732 and the establishment of the Georgia colony did South Carolina relinquish its frontline defensive position against the Spaniards. By the early 1730s population growth and economic success characterized the colony.

1730-1760

Between 1730 and 1760 Carolina's total population increased two and a half times, from about 30,000 to over 80,000, and the white population more than tripled. Much of this growth occurred in the Back Coun-

try. The large number of slaves in South Carolina, the possibility of their rebellion, and the colony's vulnerability to attack from hostile Indians had caused considerable anxiety among Charles Town officials. This concern resulted in the development of a township plan, introduced to South Carolina by Governor Robert Johnson in 1731. The plan intended that an arc of frontier settlements at a distance of about 80 to 100 mi (129 to 161 km) from Charles Town be occupied by European immigrants. To encourage such settlers, the colony paid their passage, granted them lands without obligation to pay quitrents for 10 years, and established a fund to provide them provisions and other assistance.

Originally, eight townships were planned for the territory of present-day South Carolina. They were to be located on major rivers, contain at least 20,000 acres (8,100 ha) each, and be subdivided into square plots. A household was eligible for a town lot and could claim 50 acres (20 ha) of surrounding land for each of its members. The grant was increased if the family could bring more land under cultivation. The eight townships were laid out between 1733 and 1735 (Map 5.3). New Windsor was

located near the sites of the Fort Moore trading post and Old Savannah Town, but its growth stagnated as the town of Augusta was established across the river in Georgia. Saxe-Gotha was laid out near the Congarce trading post in present-day Lexington County. Many Germans settled there and in the area between the Broad and Saluda rivers, which came to be called the Dutch Fork; "Dutch" did not refer to people from the Netherlands but was a corruption of the German word "Deutsch." Germans also lived in the Orangeburg and Amelia townships, but Fredericksburg was first colonized by Quakers from Pennsylvania.

Williamsburg, first settled by Irish Protestants, later became one of the most successful townships, especially after the development of indigo plantations along the Black River. Kings Town grew very slowly, whereas Queensborough, located just north of Britton Neck, received virtually no col-

onists. In 1736 Welsh Baptists from Pennsylvania received a land grant that included 10,000 acres (4,050 ha) in Queensborough township, but they found the area unsuitable. The Welsh Tract along the Pee Dee was granted them instead, and Welsh, Scotch-Irish, and some Germans took up land in the area. A ninth township, Purrysburg, was not a part of Governor Johnson's program, but it was developed at about the same time. Its founder, Jean Pierre Purry, had formulated a colonization scheme for South Carolina as early as 1724 and had been promised grants exceeding 20,000 acres (8,100 ha). He planned to bring over Swiss Protestants, and about 170 of these settled Purrysburg in 1733. More Swiss joined the colony, and though its numbers grew to 800 within a few years, Purrysburg eventually declined as many Swiss left for the Ebenezer settlements across the Savannah River in Georgia.

80 THE COLONIAL LANDSCAPE

The township system was a mixed success. In contrast to the original plan, little settlement occurred within the township bounds but instead spread up and down streams because settlers preferred riverine lands. Some townships, such as Williamsburg and Orangeburg, were quite successful; others, like New Windsor and Queensborough, were either stillborn or soon abandoned. The fund to support immigrants quickly ran out, and this discouraged potential colonists coming directly from Europe.

The greatest portion of new settlers in the South Carolina Back Country were Scotch-Irish, with some Germans, who migrated along the Piedmont from Pennsylvania and Virginia. Place-names such as Lancaster, York, and Chester reflect ties to southeastern Pennsylvania; other names, such as Chesterfield, suggest origins in Piedmont Virginia. Many of these pioneers settled in the vicinity of the townships, and their small independent farmsteads, log houses, and crops of corn, wheat, and vegetables contrasted sharply with the commercial plantations of the Low Country (Fig. 5.5).

These various immigrant groups, along with the previously established English, French Huguenot, and African populations, gave colonial South Carolina a more po-

lyglot population than is usually recognized. The colony's inhabitants totaled about 83,000 in 1760, and European settlement was dispersed throughout present-day South Carolina, except for the Indian territory in its northwestern corner.

1760-1775

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The end of the Indian wars and the retreat of the Cherokees opened most of northwestern South Carolina to settlement. A temporary line separating the Cherokee lands and the Carolina settlements was drawn along Long Canes Creek in 1747. but warfare broke out again in 1759-1760. The colonial forces defeated the Cherokees within a year, and a new boundary that approximates the present-day Anderson and Greenville county lines was drawn in 1766. The colony laid out four new townships between 1762 and 1765. These included Boonesborough on Long Canes Creek, Hillsborough on Little River, Londonborough on Hard Labor Creek, and Belfast on Stevens Creek. The place names reflect the heritage of the Scotch-Irish, although the area around New Bordeaux in Hillsborough township was settled by some 475 French Protestants.

The colony's population stood at 180,000 in the mid-1770s. For the first time in almost seven decades, the rate of increase of whites was about the same as that of black slaves. Most of the whites settled in the Back Country, and, as wheat and tobacco became major Piedmont crops, interior trading centers developed. Camden was the largest inland town, but commercial activities focused also on Cheraw, Ninety Six, Congaree, and Orangeburg. The town of Granby, located on the western side of the Congaree and across from present-day Columbia, later became an important inland trading center and replaced Congaree.

These towns were located along the major paths that originally had developed during the Indian trade. The Cherokee path followed the west side of the Santee, Congaree, and Saluda rivers via Congaree and Ninety Six. The Catawba path, later known

as the Kings Highway, diverged from it to cross the Santee and parallel the Wateree River to Camden and the Catawba settlements. Another path led from Charles Town to Savannah Town in New Windsor township, and Cheraw could be reached by way of the Pee Dee River. The northwestern corner of the colony received little attention, and settlers frequently complained of the impassability of the roads (Map 5.4).

Another important aspect of travel were the ferries that crossed streams and rivers. Their operation was under the control of individual owners who charged tolls for passage. The laws regulating ferries prohibited the licensing of a new one within a minimum distance of an established ferry, thus insuring a certain monopoly of the crossing trade. The importance of these crossings is underscored by the many roads that today retain the word "ferry" in their names, such as Garners Ferry Road in Columbia and Shockley Ferry Road in Anderson.

CHARLES TOWN AND OTHER SETTLEMENTS

Charles Town was the economic, political, and social focus of South Carolina and an important trading center in the expanding British Empire (Fig. 5.6). Almost all of the colony's products were funneled to the city, and its merchants aggressively enlarged the port's influence along the South Atlantic coast. Its size reflecting its commercial importance, Charles Town was the fourth largest city in the American colonies at the time of the Revolution.

The original Carolina settlement was at Albemarle Point, but as early as 1672 the Proprietors developed plans for a new location on the narrow peninsula where the Ashley and Cooper rivers meet, as Charlestonians stress, to form the Atlantic Ocean. The plans for this new city at Oyster Point included wide streets laid out in a fairly regular pattern, a commons area, and a wharf. The new site offered many advantages for the city's early growth. The narrow

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and good lands sufficient for three hundred acres each to six hundred families were thought to be near Ninety-Six, up to Long Canes. 16

Doctor Phillips points out that the raising of land prices by Pennsylvania hastened the migration movement; but apart from secondary causes the migration of the Pennsylvanians and Virginians was primarily an incident in the persistent movement from the older settled regions to frontier lands. How long continued and extensive was this migration to South Carolina is evidenced by a Revolutionary pension roll of about the years 1835 to 1840 which shows that almost every one of the pensioners living in the low country had served in the South Carolina Continental line, whereas a large proportion of the pensioners living in the up country had served as North Carolina, Virginia, or Pennsylvania Continental soldiers.

The great stream of immigration overland from the northward came unaided by bounties, and spread under its own initiative from the North Carolina line to the Savannah. The roll of Colonel William Thomson's regiment in 1775 consisted of 121 men born in Virginia; 52 in South Carolina (only 20 of whom were 25 years of age), 33 in Ireland, 28 in North Carolina, 22 in Pennsylvania, 16 in Maryland, 8 in England, 5 in Scotland, and 1 each in New England, New York, New Jersey, and Delaware. To Sixty-seven were under 21. Virginia, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Maryland thus furnished by birth almost 65 per cent. of the whole, and probably a good proportion of those who were born in the British Isles had come from those provinces to South Carolina.

The movement of the 1750's to 1770 filled in the spaces of the middle country, but mainly pushed forward into the country including and above the present Lancaster, Fairfield, Newberry, Saluda, and Edgefield counties, up to the Indian line bounding Greenville and Anderson on the east and southeast. A few settled in the old parishes as overseers, etc., but those north Europeans generally avoided that region on account of the summer heat, the malarial fever, and the long established system of great slaveworked estates, conditions which had so seriously hindered the township settlement movement of the 1730's and 1740's. 13

For the immigrants expected under the bounty encouragement, four townships were laid off west of Ninety-Six: by order of the Governor in Council, October 22, 1762, Boonesborough (in honor of his new excellency), 20,500 acres on the headwaters of Long Canes Creek, a square a little under six by six miles, with sides facing north, east, south, and west, two miles

east of the present Due West; survey by Jno. Liviston, certified December 20, 1762; Hillsborough, 28,000 acres, square-like, with corners to the north, south, etc., centering near where Long Canes enters Little River, and containing New Bordeaux, named from the old home of many of the French immigrants of 1764 to whom it was largely devoted; survey signed by Patrick Calhoun, Feb. 23, 1765; Londonborough (its town Londonderry), about the size of Hillsborough and facing similarly and about eight or nine miles northeast of it, in the fork of Hardlabor and Cuffeetown creeks, its western corner cut by Hardlabor; Belfast. 22,000 acres on both sides of Stevens Creek about six miles southeast of Hillsborough; survey by John Liviston dated December 9, 1762; ordered by governor in Council October 22, 1762.10

In Boonesborough, only 500 acres of which had been granted previous to the township survey, it was planned to settle the Irish Protestants; but the names Londonderry and Belfast indicate an expected flow of that stock into these also. Mouzon's map has "Palatines" under Londonderry. Rev. Lucius, the German missionary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, reported that between Michaelmas, 1773, and Michaelmas, 1774, at Cuffeetown and Londonborough he baptized thirteen German children, seventeen English, eleven Irish, and twenty-three French.²⁰

Bull reported, December 10, 1764, that the back country had been settled mainly from other colonies; but the immigration records show hundreds, frequently with Scotch names, coming direct from Ireland. It is moving merely to read the names and ages, entire families in the vigor of life, not many over forty, few indeed over fifty, companies of half a hundred almost every one between eighteen and thirty, translating themselves to a new world which they were to transform, enriching a virgin land with the most precious and powerful form of wealth. This was mainly the Scotch-Irish, as the 1730's and '40's were mainly the German, era.

The picture had its darker side. Commercial greed led to cruelty to the helpless poor, and importers' drawing on indentured servants the bonus that was intended to bring in freemen.²¹ Hundreds more were obliged to transfer
