BUCKALEW - DAY

Simeon C. "Sim" Buckalew was born Sept. 29, 1848 in Alabama, the son of Ira Buckalew and his first wife. Sim's Mother died in childbirth with her second child, a daughter, Mary, in 1849 or early 1850. Her name is unknown. Ira Buckalew married his second wife, Mrs. Nancy McGregor, in Sumter Co., Ala. on Sept. 25, 1851.

Ira Buckalew was a carpenter and moved frequently to find work. In the later part of 1860 he took his children, Sim and Mary, to live with their grandparents, Zebulon and Mary "Polly" Buckalew, in Clarke Co., Mississippi. On Jan. 12, 1869, Ira Buckalew posted a \$200 bond in Lauderdale Co., Mississippi for his son Simeon to obtain a marriage license. No further record of Ira Buckalew has been found.

Sim's paternal grandfather, Zebulon Buckalew, was born between 1784 and 1788 in Edgefield Co., South Carolina. He married there in Sept. 1808/09 to Mary "Polly" Raily, thought to be the daughter of Abraham Raily. Zebulon Buckalew sold his land in Edgefield Co., S. C. in 1816 and moved his family to Mississippi. In 1820 they were living in Green Co. where Zebulon and Polly's son, Ira, was born ca 1825. Their other children were Eliza Beech, William Buckalew, Jane Robertson, Polly, Shirley and Caroline Wright. They lived in Green Co. for about twenty years then moved to Sumter Co., Alabama. Zebulon appears to have moved several times after this, part of which may be due to county boundary line changes. Zebulon Buckalew died April 5, 1876 in Washington Co., Alabama. His wife survived him.

Simeon C. "Sim" Buckalew and Mary Elizabeth "Betty" Day were married Jan. 16, 1869. After their marriage they made their home in Meridian, Miss. Here three of their children were born. In 1877, saddened with leaving two small children buried in Miss., they moved to Cass Co., Texas. Sim tried farming in Cass Co., but it must have been inadequate to take care of his growing family. After a few years there he moved his family to San Jacinto Co., Texas perhaps to look for work in the sawmill.

During the winter of approximately 1901/02 Sim and Betty left San Jacinto Co. and moved to Houston Co., Texas. It was raining the day they left and the next morning the ground was covered with ice and later in the day it began to snow. They were traveling in Covered wagons with their few possessions. Sim worried about his milk cow. Marion, Sim's son, riding mule back, rode ahead of the family to build big log fires to warm them as they stopped to rest. this trip was remembered by Viola. Sim and Betty's grandchild. She said that it was the first snow that she had seen.

Sim and Betty evidently moved to Houston Co. to be near Betty's relatives. They made their home in Grapeland and here they lived the balance of their lives. Simeon C. "Sim" Buckalew died April 13, 1918. Mary Elizabeth "Betty" (Day) Buckalew was accidentally killed Oct. 7, 1925 when

she was hit by a bus. Both are buried in the Denson Springs Cemetery. An impressive double tombstone marks their graves.

Sim and Betty Buckalew's marriage was blessed with the birth of ten children: Annetta Viola Buckalew, b Sept. 10, 1871, d April 1, 1875. Martha Buckalew, b May 24, 1876; Marion Buckalew, b Dec. 10, 1878. William Demeatres Buckalew, born May 18, 1874, died July 25, 1875. Ira Cornelius Buckalew, born June 2, 1881, married Josephine Hendrick. Cora Matilda Buckalew, born Jan. 14, 1884, married Joe Tims. Hattie Buckalew, born Aug. 18, 1886, married John Cook.

Hattie died in 1952. She did not leave descendants.

Frances Gertrude Buckalew, born Apr. 5, 1889, married Luther M. Hendrick.

John Lennard Buckalew, born Oct. 23, 1891, died Oct. 14, 1918.

Menzie Lamar Buckalew, born Dec. 14, 1892, married Reba Jones.

BUCKALEW - WISWELL

Martha "Mattie" Buckalew married in 1896 in San Jacinto Co., Texas, to Irby Wiswell. She died Jan. 17, 1941, Dawson, Texas. Mattie and Irby were the parents of six children.

BUCKALEW - WINTERS

Marion Buckalew married Ruth Alice Winters in San Jacinto Co., Tex. August 28, 1895. Her father did not approve of the marriage as he wanted her to continue her education. It has been said that they eloped.

Ruth Winters began her life on Jan. 14, 1889 in San Jacinto Co. where her father was Justice of The Peace for several years. She was the daughter of James P. and Mary Frances (Ellisor) Winters. Ruth had two whole sisters, Margaret "Maggie" Parker, Mary Elizabeth "Lizzie" Street, one brother, John Godfrey Winters, also three half sisters, Maude Winters, Bertha Rich, Lela Parker and three half brothers, Donny Winters, George Winters and Sherman Winters. Her mother died shortly after her birth and her father married second to Mrs. Nellie Johnson. Her maternal grandfather, Godfrey T. Ellisor, also remarried Feb. 21, 1876 to Mary Alice Day, lovingly known as Aunt Mollie, who helped raise Ruth.

The Winters family is an old Texas family arriving there before statehood. They settled in the big thicket which at that time was a wilderness and their neighbors were Indians. They came from Tennessee where James Winters, Sr. (1773 - 1848) served in the War of 1812. James Winters, Sr. married in Tennessee to Rhoda Creel Beal (1784 - 1860), the daughter of Benjamin Beal. James and Rhoda were the parents of thirteen children.

Three of their sons, William C., James W. and John Freian (Ruth's grandfather) fought in the Battle of San Jacinto. John Freian Winters was born July 13, 1814 in Giles Co., Tennessee and died Jan. 13, 1864 in Walker Co., Texas where he is buried in The Winters Memorial Park. John F

Winters married first to Margaret Miller (1815 - 1857) and second in 1861 to Henrietta Ramsdale. John and Margaret had a large family which included a son, James, born Dec. 10, 1849 in Walker Co., Texas and died Mar. 10, 1921. James Winters is buried in the Center Hill Cemetery in San Jacinto County.

James Winters married Jan. 29, 1878 in San Jacinto Co. to Mary Frances Ellisor (b. Feb. 16, 1856 Walker Co., Tex.), the daughter of Godfrey T. Ellisor (1822 - 1887) and his wife Emaline Frances (Ellisor) (1827 - 1878). Both Godfrey and Emaline were from South Carolina and may have been cousins. Emaline was the daughter of Jacob (1796 - ?) and Nancy (Seitz) Ellisor 1807 - 1895).

Marion and Ruth (Winters) Buckalew lived in Evergreen in San Jacinto Co., where Marion worked in the sawmill. They moved with Marion's parents and settled in Anderson Co., Tex. They lived for a while at Denson Springs, a small community a few miles from Grapeland, then they bought a small place at Red Prairie where they farmed. Here their oldest child started to school.

Marion and Ruth were of the Baptist faith. They lived a simple life. Ruth could play the organ and the accordion. Both Ruth and Marion were good singers and their favorite form of entertainment was to have relatives and friends over on Sunday evenings for a sing in. They were a happy family until Ruth's health failed. She was only 31 when she died, November 15, 1911.

Ruth (Winters) Buckalew is buried in the Denson Springs Cemetery with her husband's parents, many of his relatives and her beloved Aunt Mollie (Mary Alice (Day) Ellisor), who died the year before her. Your writer never knew her, but as I ~~love~~ her name I often think of this woman as my grandmother.

Some years ago I was permitted to read and copy some old papers in the possession of my Aunt, Clara Buckalew Landrum. These papers had belonged to her Aunt Mollie. They consisted of an old ledger book and letters written during the Civil War by John Day, Aunt Mollie's brother. Laying in the ledger book was the beginning of a letter written by Ruth.

Evergreen, Texas
Oct. 10, 1899

Mama (her step-mother, Nellie)

As I did not get to send my letter off I will try to write you a few more lines. The baby (Lila) is some better today. Wish you were here with us. Marion has gone to hunt Rambles (horse.) He has run away and can't find him. Mag and Tom Parker were here the other day. They said that they were not going to stay on the place another year. Mag said that it would starve them to death.

* * *

Ruth called her husband Marion. His cousins, nieces and nephews knew him as Bud. Marion and Ruth (Winters) Buckalew were the parents of Viola Elizabeth, married Claud Dunn, Clara Dewey married H. W. Landrum, Lila Era married (1) John W. Moffett (2) Robert Briscoe, Mary Frances married (1) Jack Winiger (2) Calvin Flowers, died May 14, and did not have children. Jeff Davis married Neda Rutledge, Floyd Simoun married (1) Zella Kilcrease (2) Vida Boles, and Ezra Lafayette married Mary Massey.

* her beloved Aunt Mollie (Mary Alice) was her grandfather's 2nd wife who helped Ruth.

BUCKALEW (SUMMERS) RODGERS

After the death of Ruth, Marion married the second time to Mrs. Mollie Summers Rodgers. Her ancestry has not been traced. Mollie was the widow of Dr. Will Ramsey Rodgers, by who she had two daughters, Pauline and Kathleen.

Marion and Mollie moved to Wilbarger Co., Texas, where he worked in the oil fields. Marion Clayton "Bud" Buckalew, who was born ~~Oct~~ 11, 1878 in Cass Co., Texas, died of typhoid on Oct. 13, 1925. He is buried in Eastview Cemetery, Vernon, Texas. Mollie survived her husband by several years.

Marion and Mollie had four children, Florine married Guy Freeman, Marion Ramsey married Burnie Walls, Johnny died young, and Molly Elizabeth married (1) Truman Welch (2) Lee Corkill.


