

DANIEL MacCALL, was born about 1750 and married Mary McFarland in Argyleshire, Scotland. Emigrated to the United States in 1803 on the Ship William Pitt after a stormy voyage of 51 days. His wife died on the voyage and her body committed to the waves of the Atlantic ocean for a last resting place. He survived her but a few years and was buried at Laurin Hill in Richmond County, N. C. He had two sons and five daughters.

HUGH, the first son came to the States in 1790 and settled in Taylorville, N. C. where he was successful as a merchant for several years and moved to Wilmington, N. C. desiring to extend his business. Came to Mobile, Alabama in 1815 and settled on the Alabama river at a flourishing town called Fort Claiborn, named after Gov. Claiborn of the Miss Territory. Returned from Claiborn to N. C. through the Creek and Cherokee Indian natives, considered a hazardous undertaking at that time. Being of a delicate constitution and afflicted with asthma he gradually declined in health and died at Claiborn on April 1819. Having a large estate which through the unfair management or neglect of partners benefitted him very little.

DUNCAN, second son died in early life.

ISABELLA, the first daughter of Daniel McCall was married to John McCall about 1798. Left a widow with three sons and five daughters. Samuel the first son married Mary Ann Portis and died at Monroeville, Monroe county, Alabama 1837. His sons William Wallace and John Ira gave promise of being good and useful men but were taken off about maturity by yellow fever in 1853. at Ft. Claiborn. Samuel's first daughter Isabella was well educated at Selma, Alabama and is ^{now} the accomplished wife of Leander Poole, merchant of Mobile Alabama. The second Daughter Maria married a Mr. Goodwin, who both died in early life, leaving one daughter Catherine who resides with Mr. Poole at Mobile. Jane, third daughter married a Mr. Barnes of Clark county, Alabama where they still reside. He is a prosperous farmer

DUNCAN, second son of John & Isabella McCall died in middle life in Monroe county, Ala. never married and was inclined to dissipate, the fate often of men who have no settled home where the affections of wife and children have so many binding cords.

DANIEL, the third son of John and Isabella McCall was distinguished as Clerk of the Court of Monroe county, Alabama succeeding his brother Samuel in the office. Married a Miss Sewell and died about 1848 leaving two infant daughters Minnie & Bru Trail after two lovely characters in Sir Walter Scott's Pirate. They are now accomplished ladies in Selma, Alabama.

ISABELLA, first daughter of John and Isabella McCall was married first to Mr. Moore who lived but a short time, leaving her a widow with an infant daughter (whose mind became unsettled about maturity and died - her name was Mary Ann). Isabella married a second time Edward Wingate of Montgomery, Alabama who volunteered with Col. Fanning while passing that city and shared the miseries of that illfated Command in Texas in 1835. His widow Isabella followed on after the independence of Texas was acknowledged with her two sons and two daughters, where she died soon after securing the land donated to her. The sons Robert and Samuel were distinguished as Texas rangers for many years on the border under Col. Jack Hays and were doubtless killed in some of the wild adventures for which that command was distinguished.

MARGARET, the oldest daughter by Wingate married a Mr. Collins, a successful merchant of Henderson, Texas, where they now reside. Isabella, the youngest daughter married a Mr. Davis also a merchant in Texas and prosperous.

NANCY, second daughter of John and Isabella McCall married Duncan McIntosh and both died of consumption after passing middle age. Their oldest son John, a young man of promise lost his eye sight about maturity and died of a broken heart from the great misfortune. The three daughters followed their father and mother to the grave by consumption in early life, also their brother Daniel. Samuel, the youngest is still living in Leake county, Miss. tho in low health.

CATHERINE, the third daughter of John and Isabella McCall married Thomas L. Roberts. They reside in Monroe, Alabama
