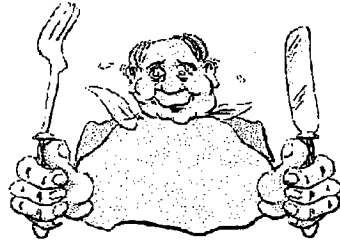

THE FOREBEARS OF RICHMOND EARL DEAS  
(Prepared in March 1979)

This outline of my ancestors is made primarily for the edification of my children and grandchildren and does not extensively cover the family.

For most of the information here I am indebted to the book, The Dees Family, by Dr. Benjamin C. Holtzclaw of the University of Richmond, Va. The book was printed, with Dr. Holtzclaw's permission, thru the efforts of Mrs. Elaine Dees Bryant of 905 Deer Park Road, Shreveport, La. 71107. She will supply a copy of this book as long as the supply lasts.

I am also indebted to the late Alla Dees Smith Waters for getting me interested in this book and for supplying most of the information on the Shamburger family. Her Great Grandfather was Calvin Dees, a cousin of William Deas. Her Great Grand Mother was the daughter of Nancy Deas and Joshua Shamburger and was the aunt of my grandmother Laura.

I am placing a copy of the book, The Dees Family, in the Houston Clayton Genealogical Library.

It is believed, tho we have no hard evidence to support it, that <sup>the</sup> family originated in the River Dee area of Scotland and took their name from the River. However, they spelled the name Deas.

The Coat-of-Arms of the Deas family is: "Ermine, a pale vert. Crest: a bee feeding on a daisy, all por".

Our branch of the family is supposed to have moved to Wales, and from there to have come to America. It is easy to see how in the days when few persons could write that the name was changed to the easier phonetic spelling of Dees.

It is interesting to note that the Deas family, they pronounced the name as Daze, of Charleston, S. C., is believed to be a different branch of our family. At any rate, there are numerous records of contacts between the two groups.

Some of the Charleston family were fairly prominent in the 18th century. In fact Time magazine for July 4, 1776 and The Peoples Almanac <sup>carry</sup> a copy of a poster by John and David Deas, merchants. The poster was an advertisement for the sale of a ship-load of Negroes.

It isn't known exactly when the family first arrived in America. However, on June 26, 1635, Richard Bennet was granted 2,000 acres of land in Nansemond County Virginia for transporting a group of settlers to the colonies. One of this group was a John Dee who may have been the father, or grandfather, of Emanuel Dees, the first definite member of the family in America.

EMANUEL DEES. Probably born in Virginia about 1675. Died in Isle of Wight Virginia in 1722. Wife's name unknown.

Emanuel is mentioned in several instances in connection with others. One such mention was a suit of Henry Lightfoot vs. Emanuel Dees, May, 18, 1715, and again on July 20, 1715 when the suit was dismissed.

It is interesting to note the inventory of Manuel's estate. It provides an interesting commentary on the difference of what was of value then and what it would be worth today.

Emanuel is known to have had four sons. They were: Emanuel, John, William and Daniel.

WILLIAM DEES was born about 1705 to 1717 in Isle of Wight Virginia.

Little is known of William except that he moved to North Carolina, had several land transactions there and probably died in Johnston county of that state. Whom hemarried and how many children he had are unknown.

Williams brother John reared a large family, of whom it is believed that were the children of William. They were James, Mark, Benjamin, William and Arthur.

BENJAMIN DEES, born about 1745 - 1747 in Johnston County North Carolina. Died in Clark County Alabama about 1820. His estate was not completely settled until 1831. The proceeds of \$4,386.25 from the estate were divid among nine heirs.

Benjamin's wife probably was Stacey Stout. The had at least six sons and seven daughters. a complete list is not available, A partial list of children is: Roderick Dees, Hannah, Sion, Benjamin, Willoughby, Georgee and Gaddy.

That he served in the revolutionary army is shown by the following.

"Revolutary Army Vouchers, No. 1607, state of North Carolina, Salisbury District, Auditors of the Lower Board, March 2d, 1784. This may certify that Benj. Dees exhibited his claim and was allowed two pounds, ten shillingand ten pence--specie. L2-10-6.

T. Wade, Jr., Clk., Stephen Miller, Thomas Chiles, Audrs."

There are many records of land transaetions by Benjamin as he moved about the country. He made his final move to what was to later become the state of Alabama. This was some time before 1815.

2> GEORGE DEAS. Born between 1770 and 1780 in Anson County North Carolina. Died in 1842 in Sumter County, Alabama.

George married his first wife about 1800 in Chesterfield County, South Carolina. We have no record of her name. Among their several children was a daughter Nancy who married Joshua Shanburger. His second marriage was to Rachel Phillips. One of their children was William, of whom, more later.

Records of the settlement of George's estate indicate the following other children: Samuel, Mary Ann, Elizabeth, Rebecca, James and Eliza. The last three were minors in 1842, therefore would be the children of Rachel. Which wife was the mother of each of the others is not known.

Like his immediate forebears, George moved ever westward. He was in Chesterfield County South Carolina in about 1800. Again in Clark County Alabama where he married Rachel Phillips on July 26, 1815., and later to Sumter County.

George seem to have<sup>been</sup> at least moderately well fixed, for there are a number of records of the sale of land and slaves by him.

He appears to have been the first of his line to have used the Deas spelling of the family name. So far as I know all of hfs descendents continued to spell the name in that manner.

WILLIAM DEAS. Born in 1818 in Clarke County Alabama. Died after 1860, probably in Clark County.

On Nov. 27, 1839 he married Martha York in Clark County. She was born in 1814 in North Carolina.

The 1860 census shows William residing in Coffeeville, Clark County, Alabama. His family is listed as follows:

Of the five boys listed above I have been told that all

all but the youngest, William, served in the Confederate army. Of these only one was a casualty, and that from natural causes. If this is correct, then the casualty must have been John for the others are in the 1880 census.

William owned a plantation at or near Coffeeville, Ala. before the Civil War. Although he had slaves, he had a rule that when the boys rode their horses they were required to personally care for and feed them when returning from the ride.

William ~~apparently~~ died after 1860 in Clark County.

JAMES MADISON DEAS. Born May 14, 1844 in Clarke County Alabama.

Jim Deas was raised on his father's plantation near Coffeeville. On March 15, 1862 at the age of 17 he enlisted in the Confederate army. He served in Co. D of the 32nd Alabama Infantry until his discharge on June 12, 1865.

Not much is known of his personal life in the army. However, we can follow the movements and the battles of the 32nd Regiment and assume that he took part in all of them.

The Regiment went to Tennessee in July 1862. It forded the Tennessee River while engaging the enemy. It operated part of that year under Gen. N. B. Forrest. (His formula for winning battles was, "Git thar fustest with the mostest"). The Regiment lost a number of prisoners at Laverge, fought at Murfreesboro with heavy losses. The winter of 1862-63 was spent at Tullahoma, Tenn.

In the spring they were sent to the relief of Vicksburg, but apparently were not involved in the actual siege of that city. They fought in the trenches at Jackson and repulsed the enemy attack without loss. But after the battle they collected and buried 260 enemy dead in front of their position. Next they went to Lookout Mountain and took part in the battle of Chickamauga. Shortly after that battle the 32nd consolidated with the 58th Alabama Regiment for the rest of the war. The 32nd-58th fought at Missionary Ridge with heavy losses. They spent the winter of 1863-64 at Dalton Georgia.

Their next battle was at Resaca where they lost 90 men out of 300 engaged in a few minutes. The regiment later fought at New Hope and Kennessa. Next they joined Hood in the battle around Atlanta with more heavy losses. Back to Tennessee where the regiment fought at Columbia, Franklin and Nashville. The army spent the winter of 1864-65 before Nashville.

After being driven from Nashville they again fought at Franklin. The 32nd-58th were then sent to Spanish Fort on Mobile Bay for their last fight. The Regiment was discharged at Meridian, Miss.

The above does not <sup>correspond</sup> to some of his war experience as I had been led to believe. However, since his pension applications indicate that he did serve with the 32nd Regiment, and since it was not the practice of the Confederate Army to transfer men out of their units, he probably did participate in these battles.

It seems apparent that on returning from the war, the brothers found everything gone with the wind. In any case he was never to rise financially and spent the rest of his life as a poor one gallused dirt farmer. That must have been bitter

gall for one who had started life in such good circumstances. On Dec. 17, 1869 he married his cousin, Laura Shamburger. She was the granddaughter of his aunt Nancy and Joshua Shamburger. The Shamburgers made their home at Thompkinsville, on the west bank of the Tombigbee River in north Choctaw County. This was near the present town of Pennington. The young couple settled in Choctaw County and spent the rest of their lives there. Laura died June 7, 1889, after having borne 11 children, only six of whom lived to adulthood. These six were:

About 1900 Jim remarried. His second wife was Mattie Robert son of Pachuta, Miss. She was the widow of another Confederate veteran.

Mattie bore him one son, Duma Cecil, born in 1902. Jim's eyes failed and he gradually became blind. In the 1920s Duma moved his parents to Mississippi. They lived there for some time, and then lived with daughter Lula in Louisiana for a short time. They then returned to Alabama where they lived with son John until Jim's death in 1925. He is buried in Bethlehem Cemetery at Edna, Alabama.

After his death, Mattie returned to Mississippi where she spent her last days in a Confederate Veterans home.

THE SHAMBURGERS

The Shamburger family originated in Germany. In 1667 Fredrick Charles Shamburger was awarded a Coat of Arms in recognition of his services to Prussia.

The first Shamburgers to come to America seem to have been a family of three brothers and three sisters. They were William, Peter, John, Sarah, Elizabeth and Evaline. They settled in North Carolina before the Revolution and all are said to have taken an active part in that war.

JOHN SHAMBURGER. Dates of birth and death are not known. John married before coming to America. His wife's name is unknown. John sired 10 children, <sup>as 1 boy</sup> whose names were: Dumas, Joshua, Elijah, John, Thomas, Samuel, Peter, Noah, Absalom and Matthew. These sons scattered. Joshua moved to Alabama, John to Mississippi, Thomas, Peter, Absalom and Matthew all settled in Texas.

JOSHUA SHAMBURGER. Dates of birth and death not known. Joshua moved to Alabama where he married Nancy Deas on Dec. 9, 1822. Nancy was the daughter of George and a half sister to William. Joshua and Nancy settled at Thompkinsville, Ala. on the west bank of the Tombigeeriver in north Choctaw County near Pennington. Thompkinsville no longer exists except in the memory of old timers.

ELBERT J. SHAMBURGER. Born about 1826 probably at Thompkinsville Ala. Probably died in Choctaw County, date unknown.

On March 20, 1845 he married Patience Woodall. They apparently spent their lives in Choctaw in the vicinity of what was then Thompkinsville.

Some children of Elbert and Patience Shamburger were:

At least four Shamburgers married members of the Deas (Dees) family. Joshua married Nancy. His brother, Absalom, married Mary. His daughter Martha married Calvin, a cousin of Nancy, and his granddaughter married James M. a nephew of Nancy.

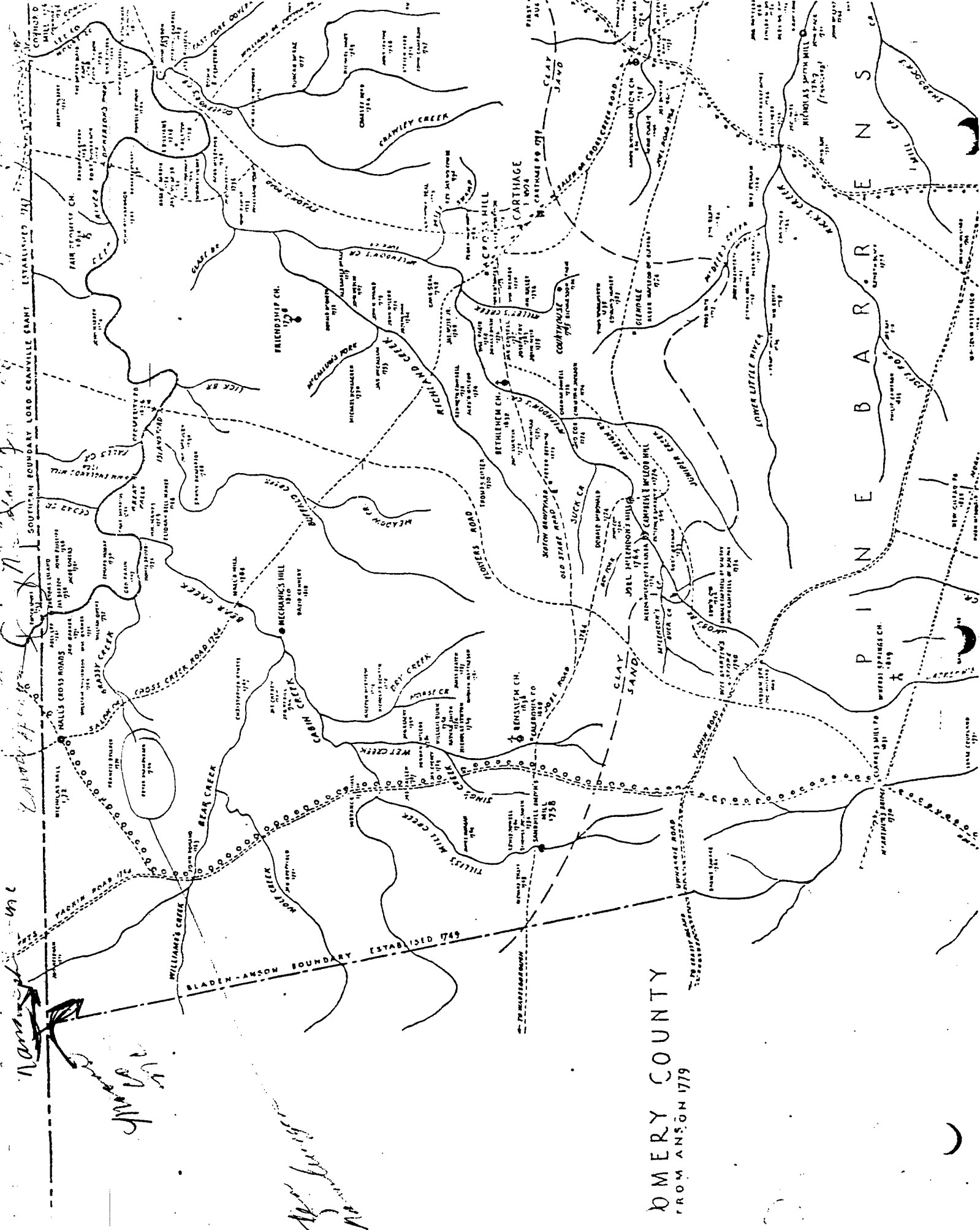

good time they had missed.

The number of Church of God (Holiness) preachers slacked off after a time and, in the last half of the 1920's, only one Holiness minister held regular services in Union Church. A kindly, un-assuming man in his thirties when he began preaching at Pine Springs, Bro. Jesse Cleveland Hearn did not preach hell-fire and brimstone sermons. He did not adhere to speaking in "unknown tongues" but chose to give something to the congregation they could use in their everyday lives.

Rev. Hearn drove from his home in Cuba, Alabama each month to hold a morning and evening service. He and Pat Harris were cousins, as Bro. Hearn's mother, Mattie Harris Hearn, had been Pat's aunt. Usually Rev. Hearn ate Sunday dinner with either the Harris' or at Sis. Phronie Bozeman's. Sometimes he was invited to eat with some other family, but not often.

In the late 1920's, Bro. Hearn was preaching on a warm summer evening and the old Union Church was packed. Miss Minnie White, Doc White's wife, was there with her third youngster, little James. The only seat Miss Minnie found was near the front of the church, but it was next a window. (For some reason, nobody liked to sit down front.) Minnie had her card-board fan (the funeral homes passed them out as advertisement) and she sat her small son in the open window so he wouldn't be hot and restless. After a while the sermon got under way and everybody was fanning, eyes

intent on watching the preacher as he led to a serious point.

Suddenly, little James went to sleep and fell out the window, falling five feet to the ground. Awake by the time he hit, he landed on his feet like a cat and hit the ground screaming and running. The engrossed congregation jumped as the most God-awful sounds that ever came from a pair of lungs shattered the quietness.

"MAAA-MAAA! MAAA-MA!", James screamed, racing toward the steps of the church and then up the aisle, wailing every breath, his bare feet sounding like horses' hoofs each time they hit the floor. When he reached Miss Minnie his screams suddenly stopped as he hopped back into the window to sit quietly, looking out at the people as if nothing was amiss.

After the first shock, folks realized what had happened began to laugh. The preacher had stopped in mid-sentence at the first blood-curdling shriek and then his mouth, like the others, began to twitch. The sermon did not last much longer; nobody was in the right frame of mind to have his soul saved so Bro. Hearn just gave up.

In 1918, the office of Home Demonstration Agent was established in Lauderdale County. Nobody remembers when the Pine Springs chapter of the County Home Demonstration Club was started, but it was holding lively meetings in the early 1920's. Miss Katherine Staley was the first agent remembered, meeting with the Pine Springs ladies until Clara Jean Clearman took her place in the late 1930's.

[A 1924 state law authorized county supervisors

The old Union Church was still in service after the Methodists moved into the former school house. In 1932 when the Methodists moved, Union Church was used mainly by a small Holiness congregation led by their faithful minister, Rev. Jesse C. Hearn. The church-going community, whether Holiness, Methodist, or whomever, still went to hear preaching.

As the Methodists shared a preacher and with others on their charge, their ministers held services at Pine Springs only twice a month. Bro. Hearn came one Sunday each month to preach at Union Church when no Methodist preaching was scheduled. It was the practice for the Methodists to have Sunday School in their church, then cross the parking lot to hear the Holiness sermon at Union Church. It was bothersome to kindle fires to warm both churches, or to cross during rainy weather. Eventually, it became the habit for Rev. Hearn to preach his sermon in the already warmed-up Methodist church. The old Union Church gradually fell into disuse.

Rev. Hearn's oldest son, Jesse Cleveland Hearn, Jr., called J.C., began to come over from Cuba to take his father's place. J.C. was not ordained but gained experience at Union Church. The Hearn's, as Jake Smith said of Bro. Snellgrove, "certainly weren't preachin' for the money". During the darkest of the depression they drove from Cuba when it was hard to come up with gasoline for their car.

Young J.C. had only one suit he wore when he came. The seat of his trousers had worn so thin a cat could fall through. One Sunday, Mrs. Pearl Harris got up to announce that J.C. was going off to a seminary to become a "real" preacher and he didn't have clothes to wear. The folks liked J.C. and his need was obvious, so they gave what they could to get the man a new suit.

[J.C. Hearn, Jr. went to school and became a Presbyterian minister. He was pastor of the Faith of the Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church in New York, although he later was Dean of a boy's school in Pennsylvania. He died in Pennsylvania when he was in his 50's. Rev. Hearn's second son, Malcolm, not as well known in Pine Springs, also made a preacher. He is presently pastor of Countryside Methodist Church in Kansas City.]

The senior Rev. Hearn's wife had died after J.C. and Malcolm were born. He married again and had raised seven more children. He died in 1958 at the age of 69 years.

[In 1945, Pine Springs Methodist Church, thinking of building a parsonage, bought the dilapidated Union Church with its 1 acre of land from surviving members of the church's trustees.

The only ones left were Mrs. Sophronia Bozeman and Mr. E. Kirby Smith, who sold it to the Methodist church for \$1. (The deceased trustees were Joe Wright, Uncle Jimmy Wright, Albert Lockard, Felix Vincent, Spinks Jones, W. Thomas Love, and Jim Thead.) The old building was sold to one of John Lovett's sons, who tore it down and cleaned the site, taking salvaged lumber as payment.]

\* \* \* \* \*

Among the families who returned to Pine Springs to weather the hard time after being laid off their jobs were the Frank Vincents, the Gordon Saddlers, and the Ches Loves.

Chester and Myrtie Love, with their three children, rented one of the little red houses on The Lane from Myrtie's brother-in-law, manager of the Threefoot farm. Frank and Edna Vincent were not as lucky. Finding no vacant house for rent in the community, they camped on the Felix Vincent farm. They cleared out the smokehouse where they cooked and ate, but they and their five children slept in the house with Frank's parents. As soon as a house became available on The Lane, they moved onto the Threefoot farm.

James Oliver Vincent, Frank's son who was born in 1926, has fond memories of the times they spent in Pine Springs. He says:

"Nobody had any money then, but we [the community kids] were together all the time. We got together at each other's houses but sometimes we just built a fire in the middle of the road. Nobody had a car."

"I remember playing with ole C-Bo Love [C.L.], the Townsends from down the road, and the Lockard boys from down on Bozeman Hill. I was just a little fellow, but it seems there were some Lovetts that played with us [Durwood?] and our cousins, Les and Louie Hooks. I remember Joe Harris and the Foster boys, and more that I can't call by name."

"I started to school in first grade at Center Hill [1932] and rode Herbert Lovett's school bus. One day Aunt Ida [Hooks] stopped the bus as it came by her house and sent a settin' hen home to Mama. What a time we had with that chicken! 'Course, we were always fighting on the school bus, anyway."

"When we moved back to town my brother [Frank, Jr. or John Morris?] wanted to stay in the house with Willie and May Belle Kinard. They liked kids and they put him up in a back room where he and Billy White shared a bed. Willie bought him a pet goat."

When the economy eased a bit, Frank Vincent and Ches Love both returned to their railroad jobs.

Gordon and Alma Saddler rented the fairly new
