

## L. E. HARWELL FAMILY

CLAYTON A, HARWELL

Clayton died in Tennessee and Susan brought their 10 children to Laud. Co. probably in early 1857 and moved onto the farm of Thomas W. Wells of Pine Springs.

In the September, 1857 term of Laud. Co. Probate Court, Susan B. Harwell stated that her husband, late of Giles Co., Tenn, died intestate, leaving an estate at the time of his death of the value of about \$3000, consisting of Negro property which was then in Tennessee, (apparently his land had already sold). Her children who were over 14 had chosen her as their guardian, but it was necessary for the court to appoint guardian to protect the interest of the younger children under 14, and Susan asked to be appointed their guardian. Susan was appointed guardian of the three oldest children, Martha Jane, Mary Elizabeth, and Sophia J. Harwell.

On the same day Susan was appointed guardian for the 7 younger children after making a \$4500 bond with neighbors Thomas W. Wells and William W. Stokes signing with her as securities.

A year later on October 19, 1858, Susan apparently had not been able to recover the Harwell estate from Tennessee, so she gave Thomas Wells power of attorney to recover the estate in Tennessee. The older two girls were married by that time, but Thomas Wells became also the guardian of Sophia Harwell. HE resigned shortly after then apparently to go fight in the Civil War.

It is not known at this time if Susan ever did get hers and the children's inheritance from Tenn. She lived on the Well's farm throughout the war, with neither of her 2 sons taking part in the conflict. They were a little young at the beginning of the war, but were old enough before it was over, especially since Miss. began drafting all men from 14 to 50 toward the end when they were running short on soldiers. The youngest boy, Holly, told his children how the soldiers would come looking for men hidden out in the woods - they would send them to the Confederate Army if they found any.

It is not known when Susan Harwell and her children left Pine Springs. Wells sold his farm and moved away in 1869. Susan's grandson seems to recall that she was buried at Pine Grove Church (Lauderdale or Kemper Co?)

In 1877 the two Harwell boys bought 40 acres from Thomas J. Hamrick (father-in-law of one of their sisters) in Collinsville [Sec. 26, Township 8, Range 14E] and the adjoining 40 acres from James M. Trussell, agent for Mrs. Nancy J. King of Texas. It is assumed that the mother and other children moved there that year.

In 1880 they were having trouble keeping their land; had borrowed \$485 from M.D. and N. J. King. It is not known if they lost their land during the hard times when so many were in trouble. Bud, the oldest son, moved to Perry Co. and Holly, the youngest, bought land near by in "downtown" Collinsville, married and raised a family there.

Susan Harwell may have been living with one of her daughters when she died. Her death date is not known.

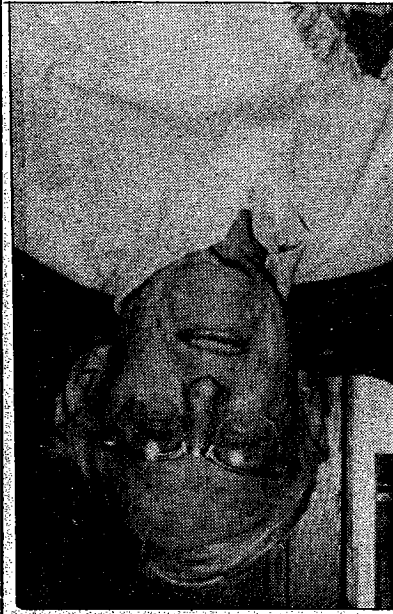

Clayton L. Harwell, whose lifetime spanned five wars and 21 presidents, died at a local hospital Wednesday. He was 108.

He may have seen a 22nd president to hold office had he reached his birthday this November, his second oldest child, Conner Harwell said Wednesday following his father's passing.

The elder Harwell lived with his son and his family on Bounds Road for a number of years before recently moving into Meridian Convalescent Center.

"I had my father longer than most, and I'm very thankful to God for that," said Conner Harwell. Harwell was the father of nine children.

Born Nov. 1, 1883, Harwell was reared in Collinsville. Before his death and well after reaching 100 years old, Harwell could remember using a slate as a student at Collinsville school.

A carpenter and farmer by trade, Harwell built about 35 houses and a government barn in Hickory during his lifetime. He even instructed the first Collinsville Church of God. His farming work in-

The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden Susan B. Hearwell as guardian to Martha J. Hearwell, Mary E. Hearwell, Sophia J. Hearwell, Sarah A. Hearwell, Mariah W. Hearwell, William A. Hearwell, W. S. Hearwell, Cona E. Hearwell, minor heirs of S. Peyton A. Hearwell deceased shall faithfully account - with the probate Court of Lauderdale County, as directed by law for the management of the property and estate of the Orphans under him, ours and shall also deliver up the said property agreeably to the order of said Court - or the directions of Law, and shall in all respects perform the duty of Guardian to the said Martha J., Mary E., Sophia J., Sarah A., Mariah W., William A., W.
