Dear Mother (and anyone you might want to send this to),

The following was written by L. Floyd Hess (Pappy) on brown wrapping paper in 1946.

In 1737, 7 sons of Jere Hess Zweibrucken, Germany migrated to Northampton. These sons were Jeremiah, Phillip, Reuben, William, John, Charles, and George. Jeremiah Hess, son of Reuben, moved to Allentown in 1790. His son, Phillip moved to Salem Township, Luz. County in 1830. His son, Jeremiah Phillip lived there until 1885. His son Floyd moved to Forty Fort in 1902; Harrisburg 1915; Boiling Springs 1918. His son Jere moved to Fruitland Park, Miss. in 1936. His son Jere Jr. now 2 years old lives there.

His son Jere Jr. moved to Meridian, Miss. in 1978. His son Jere III now 16 years old lives there.

Now, I have done a little checking and I find that Zweibrucken is located at 49° Longitude and 7° Latitude in the lower southeast part of West Germany near the border of France. It had a population of 33,800 as of 1967. Further, I have contacted our foreign sales people who have dealers all over W. Germany and close by to get me a telephone book so that I can contact any of the Hess names that are shown to see if they are relatives. Hopefully one of them will be connected to the church where as I understand it the Nuns have written down very carefully family trees etc. Anyway, we shall see.

Several of our people here in Meridian have traveled to W. Germany. One of them has a homestead in a town not far from Zweibrucken, since his grandfather migrated from there in 1915. He visited there last year. So it is possible for you and I to make a trip over there if we find something interesting. Since several have been, the details of how to get there, where to stay, etc. would be easy to get, and we would certainly be welcomed at the airport by our sales representatives in that area.

I have made a couple of copies of this for you to send on to Barb or whoever. You might ask them to send us or me any info about the above line of Hess progression after they came to the States.

Needless to say I am excited about finding out about the original Jere in Germany, if he was. There may have been others.
