THE HUDSON FAMILY

ABNER M. HUDSON was living in Remper County when the Civil War started. He enlisted in the Confederate Army on March 19, 1861, at the beginning of the war and was assigned to Co. H of the 2nd Miss. Calvary Regiment. He fought all through the war and was at Goreinth, Mississippi when he was paroled.

Near the end of the war, Ab Hudson married a girl named Sidney F. PERKINS.

They made their home Bailey in Lauderdale County and were living therevin

1865 when their oldest child was born.

Abner and Sidney Hudson had six children when Abner died in July of 1876.

OFF. STEPHENS, FAMORIA CO.

They were living near Rushing Store when he died. Sidney and the children moved in with her brother-in-law, William B. Snowden of Shucktown, After Ab died. William Snowden was married to Phenebe B., Sidney's older sister. Sidney and the six children are listed with the Snowdens in the 1880 census; it is not known how long they remained there or if Sidney ever married again. (Sidney had been born in 1848 and was 32 years old in 1880.)

Nothing is known of the family of Abner M. Hudson. There is a record of James N. Hudson who married Arabella Horton on Sept. 2, 1858 in Lauderdale County. Harvey E. Snowden acted as his Bondsman. James Hudson was probably a brother of Abner Hudson, and they apparently lived on the Kemper-Lauderdale County line.

I. JUNIUS WALTER HUDSON

Born: July 6,1865, Lauderdale Co. Died: March 11, 1947, bur. Fellowship Ch. Married: Margaret Annie "Maggie" about 1889. Dau of was Jaspen to marrian (mcDonald) Walter was about eleven when his father died in 1876 and for the next few years he lived in the home of his aunt, Phenebe Snowden and her husband, William. Walter was married between 1885 (he was single, listed in School census) and 1890 (when his first child was born).

In 1910, Walter was listed in Lauderdale County census. He owned a farm near present day campround and swimming pool area at Okatibbee Water Park. He and Maggie were listed with five children. Walter was 44 years old.

Maggie died five years later in November of 1915. She was buried at Fellowship Baptist Church. Walter lived until 1947 when he died at the age of 82. He was buried beside Margaret at Fellowship Church. Children:

1. DR. WILLIAM ERNEST HUDSON

Born: Oct.13,1889, Lauderdale Co. Died: Nov.20,1954, bur.Pine Springs Church. Married: Effie Yeager,19, dau of Rev. Daniel P. and Mollie Yeager. Ernest Hudson was 20 years old, still at home with his father in the 1910 census. He studied and became a veternarian and was married to Miss Effie Yeager about the time of World War I. In the late 1930's he bought a house

in Pine Springs from L.L.Ratcliff. The house was a five room, frame house that was just south of the Union Church on the same side of the road. Built on the edge of the road, it was painted white when it was built. It had served Ratcliff as a rental house for twenty or more years, but it was still in fairly good dondition and was a convienent location for Dr. Hudson to answer his calls to the various farmers when sick animals.

Effie was of a strong Methodist faith: her father had been a Methodist Minister in Meridian. Her father had started bring Effie and her sisters, Ola and Bell, to Pine Springs when he would come out to preach. He may have

even moved out to Pine Springs before he died. (?)

Ernest Hudson enjoyed living in Pine Springs. He was diabetic and every afternoon he walked out to Ratcliff's store and bought a Coke. If anyone happened to be there, he would stay and talk a spell and pass the time of day. If not, he would go on back home and take a nap.

Dr. Hudson lived to be 65 years old. He was buried at the Pine Springs cemetery in 1947. Miss Effie lived on in their house for years until the foundation gave way and she had to move out. Her children bought her a small mobile home and set it up under the oak trees on the property. The house stayed vacant for several years until they finally tore it down.

Miss Effie died in 1985 at an old age and was buried at Pine Springs.

Darryl was into all sorts of mischief when he was growing up. Whenever the youngsters got together to play a prank, you could almost bet the rent that Darryl was in on it. He volunteered of the Army when World War II came, and is a combat veteran. He was shot in the leg, a wound that left him slightly crippled. After the war he became a bulldozer operator. Later he bought a minnow farm from Ralph Trussell which was near where his father grew up near Okatibbee Water Park. He is still living there with his second wife.
