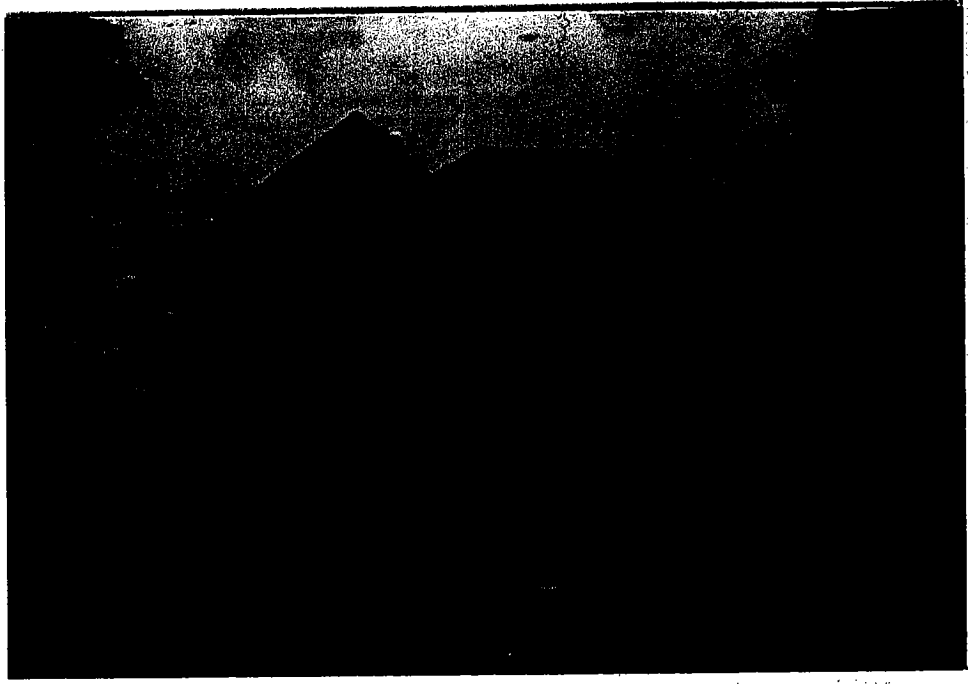

(on Horace Lee Lane's death certificate <sup>in</sup> my family Bible, it just states Place of Birth "near Indianola, Sunflower co, ms.")

At <sup>Pine Springs home</sup> the left rear, just outside pickett fence, was a huge wash shed, across driveway was the "commissary", beyond that to right rear was big shed for farm machinery - across driveway to left was a huge barn. All these buildings were built of same material as the house and painted to match house. at end of driveway was a big double gate to the lane that led down a slight hill to the cotton gin and past there - the tenant houses (all white tenants), when my father was sixteen he was helping grandfather at the gin and he got his right hand caught in machinery - cut off four fingers at second "knuckle" and made a wide scar all way up his arm.

Soon after 1918, my father and grandfather, Stephen Longo came  
 came to the Delta, <sup>my father</sup> lived first just south of  
 Clarksdale, then near Belen, then Alligator, ms.  
 Grandfather and family went on to Arkansas,  
 I think marked Tree, ark. but not sure -  
 anyway, it wasn't far from Osceola, ark -  
 daughter, Mazelle, married Roland Stephens  
 and youngest daughter, Alice, married Pat Bayles.  
 A few years later, uncle Steve and Mazelle  
 went to Hazelhurst, ms. his old "home place"  
 and lived there until they died - Aunt Alice  
 and her husband moved to Jackson. She has a  
 son living there now who is a doctor at  
 Hinds General - Grandfather + grandmother came  
 went to Hazelhurst and lived with uncle Steve  
 + Mazelle - don't know what year. In their  
 late years, they lived with us at Alligator, ms.  
 Grandmother was killed in a car wreck  
 near Brandon, ms. Daddy was taking her to  
 Haversville to visit Aunt Velma - who lived  
 there several years where she taught school  
 She had two daughters, Mary and Dana - Belen  
 they went to the "W" (msw). Mary is retired but
