FOREWARD

This compilation covers just a few of Richard Dearman's descendants that migrated to the Mississippi Territory and into Louisiana. It does not present all Dearman families that came to this area.

The spelling DORMAN on the first Richard is the spelling used on his transportation record when entering America in 1656. A short time later, in Lancaster County, Virginia, the spelling DEARMAN is used, the same spelling that was used in Braithwaite, England. It has been passed down to us as DEARMAN but if you research the records you may find the different spellings that we have listed on the title. These differences occur, partly, to old records that were almost illegible that were copied, poor handwriting, and census takers using their version of the spelling.

Jonathan, son of Solomon, consistently extended his 'n' to the point that it resembled a 'd' on his signature. The fancy flourishes of the handwriting of one court recorder seems to have changed Thomas Monroe Dearman's name to McDearman on his Revolutionary War Pension record.

We hope that this writing will bring you pleasure reading about the Dearmans and other families listed herein.

MG I Richard Dorman (c1634-1684), Lancaster County, Virginia
Richard Dearman, born in Braithwaite, England,¹ migrated to Virginia in 1656.² A wide spread claim of Irish and Scotch ancestry by the Dearman clan has been passed down through the generations that we are unable to validate. Any Irish or Scotch ancestor would have to be on maternal lineage after the migrating generation. Richard married Elinor Harris, also born in Braithwaite, England. Richard and Elinor were transported by Thomas Harris in 1656.³ Thomas Harris could have been the father or a relative of Elinor. Richard and Elinor were married in Lancaster Co., Va. in 1657-58. They remained there until Richard's death in 1684. Elinor survived Richard.

AG I Richard Dearman II (1660-c1730), Craven County, North Carolina

Richard Dearman, son of Richard Dearman and Elinor Harris, was born in Lancaster Co., Va. In 1707 Richard received a land grant of 640 acres in Bath Co. (later became Craven Co.), N.C. located on north side of the Neuse River.¹ Prior to 1708 Richard married Ann Nichols.² a widow with several children.

AG II Richard Dearman (1710-c1780), Anson County, North Carolina

Richard Dearman, son of Richard Dearman and Ann Nichols, was born in Craven Co., N.C. and married Elizabeth (last name unknown). This Richard received a land grant of 500 acres on February 25, 1744 in

Craven Co.¹ Later this part of Craven Co. became Johnston Co. In 1750 Richard transferred this land to Nathaniel Hawthorne.² In 1752 his son, Thomas, was born in Anson Co.³ indicating a move between 1750 and 1752. He applied for a land grant in Anson Co. and received it on Sep. 27, 1756.⁴ In 1757 he sold 100 acres of this grant to John Mesh and on same record and date he sold some land to James Lewis that was located on Mill Creek.⁵ In 1760 records show Richard owning land adjacent to Jesse Bounds⁶ and same record dated in 1775 show him still living at that location. Amount of land shown indicates Richard to be a prosperous man living among neighbors. Richard died after 1780 and Elizabeth survived him.

AG III Solomon Dearman (c1749-1805), Darlington County, South Carolina
Solomon Dearman, son of Richard and Elizabeth Dearman, was born in Craven Co., N.C. and moved to Anson Co., N.C. before 1752. Solomon married Mary Brigman, thought to be the daughter of Thomas Brigman of Anson Co. He is first mentioned in a land survey on Nov. 14, 1771.¹ In 1772 he was surveying for a land grant and his brother, Thomas, was the chain carrier.³ On April 15, 1774 he was numbered on jury to lay out road⁴, on same date he exhibited the will of Thomas Brigman.⁵ On July 25, 1774 he received land grant number 3676, located on Gum Branch, Anson Co., N.C. (this part of Anson Co. later became Richmond Co., N.C.). The 1790 Census of Richmond Co. shows Solomon next door to

his brother, Thomas.

Between 1795 and 1800 Solomon moved to Darlington Co., S.C. This move is indicated by birth place of his son, Elisha, in 1800. Solomon died in Darlington Co. His will was probated there and also in St. Clair Co., Al. in 1823, where Mary was living when she died. Mary is thought to be buried in the Deerman's Chapel Cemetery in St. Clair Co., Al.

AG IV Elisha Dearman (1800-1839), Lauderdale County, Mississippi

Elisha Dearman, son of Solomon Dearman and Mary Brigman, was born in Darlington Co. , S.C. and lived there until after his father's death in 1805. His mother and some of the children moved to Madison Co., Mississippi Territory c1812. In 1819 they moved to St. Clair Co., Al. Elisha married Mary Varnon and they resided in St. Clair Co. until 1831 or 1832, moving to Tuscaloosa Co., Al. Elisha and Mary bought land and stayed for a few years. In 1836¹ they sold their land and moved to Lauderdale Co., Ms. Elisha died in 1839 and his son, Henry, was born after his death. Mary is listed as head of household in 1840 census² in Lauderdale Co. In 1841 Mary married Charles Blackwell, a veteran of the War of 1812. After Charles' death ^{p. 1869,} Mary lived with her son, James, in Toomsuba, Ms.

Wrong Many are the tales concerning the Dearmans and the Indians that have been passed down through the generations. A story involving Elisha and his brother, William, as they were traveling in a wagon and bad weather set in. They went to the Indians for help. They sat around the fire, each telling his tale. One brother needed corn for his milk cow, the other needed everything. The brother that needed everything was told he could have whatever he needed as he was in the most need. The other was told he was not needy enough for their help.

Another time Elisha and William were on a trip and Elisha became ill. William left Elisha with some Indians until he could return and carry him home. Later Elisha named a son after Chief Jesse Brashears whose tribe had cared for him.

AG VI Jesse F.S. Dearman, Jr. (1876-1948), Richland Parish, Louisiana

Jesse, Jr., only child of Jesse Dearman, Sr. and Mary Glass Wilkinson, was born in Toomsaba, Ms. He married Mary Frances Morgan, daughter of Merit Morgan and Minerva Jane Gough from Energy, Ms. After their marriage Jesse, Jr. purchased some land and a home at Whynot, Ms. There he tried his hand at farming but the soil was extremely sandy and poor. When the boll weevil began devastating his cotton crops and it became necessary to use considerable amounts of fertilizer, he found it impossible to make a living and sustain his family. He heard, through relatives, of the rich land west of the Mississippi River where one or two bales of cotton could be raised without aid of fertilizer on one acre of land. In December, 1918 he moved his family to a sparsely populated area near Delhi, Richland Parish, Louisiana. He rented a parcel of land and he and Mary Frances spent the remainder of their lives in Louisiana.

Willie Arthur Dearman, Sr., son of Jesse F.S. Dearman, Jr. and Mary Frances Morgan, was born in Lauderdale Co., Ms. and moved with his parents to Richland Par., La. while in his early teens. He finished high school in Delhi, La. and answered God's call to the ministry. He was licensed to preach May 18, 1924 and ordained June 7, 1925. He married Pauline "Polly" Annie Newton, daughter of John Newton and Effie Radford. The church where Willie Arthur was licensed and ordained bears the name of his wife's family, Newton Baptist Church. At first he preached part time in the north-east area and helped organize and construct many churches in Richland and the Carroll parishes. In 1946 he resigned as postmaster at Delhi to assume full time ministry. He retired from Red Hill Independent Baptist Church on March 14, 1980 after serving 54 years of active ministry to God and his parishioners. He and Miss Polly reside on the farm that he bought, the one where his mother and father lived for many years.

Merritt Newton Dearman, son of Willie Arthur Dearman, Sr. and Pauline A. Newton, was born in Richland Par., La. Merritt obtained a B.S. degree in Pure and Applied Sciences at Northeast Louisiana University in 1959 and his M.D. at L.S.U. Medical Center in New Orleans, La. in 1962. After serving his internship at West Moreland Hospital, Greensburg, Pa. in 1962-63, he entered the Medical Corps of U.S. Army and served as an officer from 1963-65. Upon being discharged from service he served his residency in psychiatry at L.S.U. Medical Center and the Charity Hospital of Louisiana in New Orleans. In 1968 he moved to Monroe, La. and opened his private practice. He served on the boards of the Monroe hospitals. At the time of his death he was working to help establish the new psychiatric hospital in Monroe. His death was a great loss to this area, a loss deeply felt by family, patients, co-workers and friends.

Grady Harmon Dearman, son of Jesse F.S. Dearman, Jr. and Mary Frances Morgan, was born in Lauderdale Co., Ms. During World War I Grady worked in Washington, D.C. in the national defense program. He married Velma Erline Culpepper, daughter of James Hardin Culpepper and Margaret Waller from Meridian, Ms. Grady and Velma lived in Delhi, La. for a few years and moved to Meridian, Ms. Grady retired as City Mail Carrier with U.S. Postal Service. After Grady's death Velma continued to live in Meridian until her death in 1982.

MEMORIES OF GRANDPA JESSE AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY
By Grady Dearman

Grandpa Jesse, Sr. never talked about his family except to brag, overly much, about being Scotch-Irish. He was a small man with dark complexion and facial features somewhat resembling the Indians. Whenever he was accused of being part Indian he would become fiery mad.

He had two horses that he plowed and he raised cotton and corn. He sold his wagon and double harness and bought a single wagon and an old grey mare. He would carry corn, cotton seed (with eggs packed in the seed), and a "little brown jug" when going to town. While traveling the country roads he would keep his foot on the "little brown jug" to keep it from falling over and rolling around. He would take me with him and upon arriving at the grist mill he and the other farmers would "live it up." I was told to stay at the mill until he returned. He always returned with his "little brown jug." At home he kept it under his bed and would often sneak a drink, telling me "never to touch a drop." After taking his second drink for the night, he would carefully wipe his mouth and send me to bed.

For awhile the saloon was open and then it closed but Grandpa could always get a gallon of whiskey by ordering it express. Cousin John McKinney ran a small store at Whynot and could get cases of twenty-four quarts. Grandpa would often visit with Cousin John and drink. On one such occasion it had rained and the creek had overflowed when Grandpa started home. As he crossed the log that was used when the creek was up he lost his footing and fell in. He waded out and made his way to the fence, climbed up and sat on top of the gate and sang "Coming thru the rye, etc." to the top of his voice. He loved his toddy! The only way you could tell if he was drinking was to watch how high he picked up his feet when walking. Aunt Nancy, Grandpa's stepdaughter, always "hit the ceiling" when he came in drinking but he would just ignore her.

Grandpa would wear old ragged clothes to make people feel sorry for him and Grandma Mary cooked on a fireplace and saved all the corn-cobs to start the fires. Her favorite food was cornmeal mush, which consisted of cornbread, onions and buttermilk heated over the fire in the fireplace.

Aunt Ann was a hysteric. She became hyper over everything and fainted in church on two occasions.

Aunt Nancy was something else!! She would often wash children's faces with dirty dish rags! She never married and was a bossy type person and tried her best to be a man. The story goes that her father, George Wilkinson, died when she was born because he wanted a son so badly. She took pride and always bragged about getting people to do things her way. She would get "hot" when kidded about men folks and leave the conversation but would always come back for more. Her routine expression was "god amighty."

Aunty Nancy wore glasses, mostly pushed up on top of her head, which did not help her seeing ability. Frequently she would question us boys if we had seen her glasses. We'd tell her "Yes, right there."

And she would ask "Right where?" This exchange of question and answer would go on until she lost her temper and we would tell her to look on top of her head. She never learned to check there before asking us.

There was a cat that lived there and Aunt Nancy had no affection for it and was continuously chasing it out of the house. One day, with glasses on top of her head, she yelled, "There's that durn cat on top of the safe." Naturally we all ran to watch what was going to happen. With all us boys as an audience at the doorway, Aunt Nancy got her a chair, climbed up and took a mighty swing at the object on top of the safe.... the powder horn went flying across the room, bounced off of the wall, rolled a few feet, making a terrible racket. "God amighty," exclaimed Aunt Nancy, "I thought that was the cat!" We doubled up with laughter but got safely out of her way as she came through the door.

Once when I was about eight years old, around Christmastime, everyone was having eggnog, including Aunt Nancy. It was the real stuff with enough corn liquor to cook the milk and eggs. Grandma would pour out of her cup into mine and so would Grandpa. I got to feeling funny and wanted to go home. I went outside and lay on the ground beneath a tree. To me it looked as if the stumps were falling so I got up from there and made it to the top of the hill and headed straight for home ...thru the cotton patch with my knee pants and long black stockings on. Near home, I hollered, jumped as high as I could and went thru the back lot gate to the house. My lips were bleeding so I sneaked in the house and went straight to bed. I decided right then I would never drink eggnog again.... Eggnog had no ill effect on Aunt Nancy. She accused "Mister Dearman" (meaning me) of being drunk on whiskey. "Nothing but a drunkard."

Rabbit tobacco is a long broad leaf plant and when mixed with deer tongue (another plant) it smells and tastes good. Even Grandpa Wilkinson smoked a pipe and all of the old folks would plant some tobacco and cure the leaves. The twists were pressed and placed in a special box. After a "cud" was chewed it would be placed in the cracks of the log cabin to dry. Later these same "cuds" of tobacco could be taken from the cracks and smoked in a pipe. The ashes were saved until the next crop and sprinkled on the young tobacco plants to keep the bugs and worms away.

Grandpa Jesse had gotten old. He had lived at Alamutchee in the lime hills since 1868. The land had washed to the bottom of the hills and even crops would wash away when it rained. In the bottoms mud would cover the crops. Most of the people moved out. Papa (Jesse, Jr.) bought 120 acres of land two miles south of Whynot, Mississippi and moved from Alamutchee. He did the best he could but it was a struggle. He taught one year of school (a year of school was only 3 months then) at the Antioch School in 1904.

He didn't buy fertilizer for the crops, if it rained the fertilizer would go to naught. He was struggling to pay for land and raise his family. Couldn't raise enough crops to pay the taxes. About 1911 he started talking about buying enough fertilizer to grown enough

cotton to pay the balance on the land. He had a first cousin, Rankin Hardin (related on the Wilkinson side of family), who had a cotton gin and mill. Cousin Rankin offered to buy four tons of fertilizer for Papa. Papa accepted his offer and put 200 pounds of fertilizer per acre on the cotton. It paid off. He paid Cousin Rankin for the fertilizer and the balance of the debt on the land that year. But then the boll weevil started in

Papa had started off with 120 acres of land. Aunt Nancy had fifty dollars and wanted 40 acres of land. She raised such a fuss and promised she would not sell it, so Papa sold her 40 acres. She then sold it to Howard Butler, whose wife was Cousin Cannie Hagwood, the granddaughter of William Dearman, brother of Jesse Dearman, Sr., ...so Papa had only 80 acres left.

We had a few cows and would sell one or two at times. We gradually built the herd up to 18 or 20 cows and sold sour cream to a co-op dairy in Meridian to be made into butter. We would make the trip 2 to 3 times each week to carry the cream. We were paid by postcard check from the dairy. The other farmers soon lost interest in providing the cream to the dairy and soon we were the only ones doing so. We did not have enough land to raise enough hay for that many cows and it took all the profit to buy feed so we, too, had to abandon the dairy farming.

Mama, Mary Frances, dipped snuff. I had seen her. I decided to try to smoke some. I gagged, my mouth burning and I thought I heard someone coming so I crawled under the house. I gave some to Willie, my younger brother, and he, too, got sick under the house and others had to crawl under house and get him out. No more snuff!

Once when visiting Uncle Will Prince (Mama's brother-in-law) I decided to smoke a cigarette. Rolled the cigarette and it didn't phase Uncle Will, he acted as if nothing was amiss, so I smoked it. He must not have forgotten about it as on the next visit he offered me a chew of tobacco. I took it, chewed and "spat!" I came close to being sick. Couldn't walk, so never chewed since.

In my boyhood there were few vices available and at a very early age I had given up three of themeggnog, snuff, and chewing tobacco.

William Gibson had moved from Louisiana to Mississippi and had married one of Mama's first cousins. He told Papa about land in Louisiana where did not have to use fertilizer to raise good crops and the land was not as hard to clear, the trees were less thick and no hills. In 1912 Papa and I visited Louisiana and we looked at various strips of land that was selling for twenty dollars an acre. Eventually William moved back to Louisiana due to wash outs, land wearing out, boll weevils and a malaria outbreak.

Papa moved to Louisiana in 1918. He first rented land south of Delhi from a Mr. Fred Cook. The next year land was rented from Coma Williams north of Delhi. Then land was rented northwest of

Delhi in 1920 and the family moved again. This land was purchased by Willie Arthur in 1941. Mama and Papa continued to live there until their death. Willie Arthur and Polly live there to this day.

When Papa moved to Louisiana I was doing clerical work in the Federal Defense office in Washington, D.C. and Hardy was in the navy. We both went to Louisiana after World War I. We had both married and lived in Louisiana for several years before returning to Meridian, Mississippi.

 Jonathan Dearman, son of Solomon Dearman and Mary (?) Brigman, was born in Anson Co., N. C. He married c1790, his wife's name is not known. He, his wife and children moved to Darlington Co., S.C. at same time his parents moved to that area, c1796. In 1799 he moved to Georgia and stayed until after 1803. He moved to Mississippi Territory before 1809 as the Territorial Papers have his signature on a petition dated May, 1809. By 1821-22 he had become deeply in debt and he moved to Escambia Co., Florida Territory, carrying some of his family and his slaves to keep the slaves from being seized for his debts. In 1832 he moved to Sumter Co., Al., staying there until c1839. He moved to Washington Co., Al. and died there between 1841-1849. We have a partial list of his children.

AG V Solomon Dearman (1794-1837), Sumter County, Alabama
 Solomon Dearman, son of Jonathan Dearman, was born in Richmond Co., N.C. His parents and grandparents moved to Darlington Co., S.C. when he was very young. From there his parents moved to Georgia and then to the Mississippi Territory. Solomon's signature appears on a petition in the Territorial Papers of 1816. Solomon married Anna Dearman,

daughter of Thomas M. Dearman, whose route to the Mississippi Territory had been via Tennessee. Solomon and Anna lived in Mississippi until c1830. They moved to Escambia Co., Fla., staying there about two years. In 1832 they moved to Sumter Co., Al. where Solomon died in 1837. Anna married Thomas Russell in Dec., 1846. We are unable to locate her on any record after that date.

After the war and recovering from his wounds he returned and visited the family. He disappeared and was never heard from again.

Jewel Motley, daughter of William T. Motley and Mary Clementine Dearman, was born in Lauderdale Co., Ms. and moved to Sumter Co., Al. at age two. In 1903 the family moved to Richland Parish, La. Jewel married Green Edmond "Edd" Barnette, son of B. G. Barnett(e) and Ella Mae Hopkins, who had moved to Richland Parish from LaSalle Par., La. In 1923 Edd and Jewel moved to Morehouse Par. where Edd was employed by Southern Carbon Co. In 1938 the company relocated in west Texas and Edd and Jewel moved to a farm they had purchased in 1926 near Delhi, La. They continued to live on this farm until their death. Daughter, Tressie, and grandson, Terry, continue to reside on this farm.

AG III William Dearman (1743-a1790), Richmond County, Georgia

William Dearman, son of Richard Dearman and Elizabeth, was born in Craven Co., N. C. We have established only few facts concerning him. He was living in Cheraw District, S.C. when he served in the Cherokee War under Col. Gabriel Powel in 1667. He moved to St. Georges Parish, Ga. c1770 and petitioned for 100 acres of land. He received this grant April, 1772. He returned to the Cheraw District and served in the Revolutionary War under Col. Wade Hampton and Col. Henry Hampton. After the war William returned to his home in Georgia. St. Georges Par. became Richmond Co., and William is listed there in the 1790 census.

AG III Thomas Monroe Dearman (1752-1840), Sumter County, Alabama

Thomas Monroe Dearman, son of Richard Dearman and Elizabeth, was born in Anson Co. (later became Richmond Co.), N.C. We first find him as chain bearer working with his brother, Solomon, who was surveying land in 1772. Thomas married Susanna Mims in Richmond Co., N. C. in 1788. In 1790 the census show him with 2 males under 16 years of age and 4 females. Before 1800 Thomas and Susanna moved to South Carolina. He petitioned for a land grant on Black Creek in Chesterfield Co., S. C. This land was surveyed in his name in 1809. What developed on this is not known. Almost 60 years of age he left S.C. and headed west with his family. Revolutionary War records show that he had lived in Tenn., Ms. and Al. by 1832.

The 1840 Census of Sumter Co., Al. show that Thomas and Susanna were living next door to his daughter Anna, and his age as 94. War records indicate he was 88 in 1840.
