Remarks: The 14th Regiment Miss. Infantry was organized in May and June, 1861, of companies which had previously been in the state service and was mustered into the Confederate service for 12 months. It was surrendered at Fort Donelson, Tenn., Feb. 16, 1862, and exchanged at Vicksburg, Miss., about September, 1862, immediately after which it was re-organized.

Remarks: Left at Goodman's Ferry sick Dec. 1, 1862.

To all whom it may concern, Know ye that; I John W. Saxon a Corpal of Co. E of 37th Reg't Miss. Vols. C. S. A., being a prisoner of war, in the hands of the United States Forces, in virtue of the capitulation of the city of Vicksburg and its Garrison, by Lieut. Gen. John C. Pemberton, C. S. A., Commanding:

JOHN W. SAXON

on the 4th day of July, 1863, do in pursuance of the terms of said capitulation, give this my solemn parole under oath --

That I will not take up arms again against the United States, nor serve in any military, police, or constabulary force in any Fort, Garrison or field work, held by the Confederate States of America, against the United States of America, nor as guard of any prison, depots or stores not discharge any duties usually performed by officers or soldiers against the United States of America, until duly exchanged by the proper authorities.
