My affoction and lovo go with this though I stay bohind. Our Fathor, Mother \& all of this family aro woll \& I hopo theso fow linos may find you and your family woll. Whon we mamm separated I intondod to writo a few lines upon my roturn home and did so althou I nover roc'd a reply. MERRYMAN STEVENSON - 28 NOV., 1803; took oath of offico as doputy shoriff of Frodorick Co., ild., before John Wamplor. Cortificato Roccrdod 5 Doc., 1803:(Froderick Co. Doeds WR \# 25, 1. 204.).

MORDECAI STEVENSON - 11 DOC., 偮 1787 - a petition was read in the Houso of Dolegates, from Nordecal stevonson, stating that ho is blind and unablo to provido for a largo family, and prays oxomption from paying taxos. Tho mattor was roferrod to Mr. Fidgoly, Mr. Craufurd, Mr. John Sonoy, and Mr. Burgoss to consider and report on. (Votas and Procoodinfe of the Houso of Dologatos, Novombor Sossion, 1787)
MOSES STGVENSON - 2 NOV., 1799, Moses Stovenson bound his 19 yoar old son, Shaddick (Shactrack?), who would bo 19 Fob., 17, noxt, to Samuol indorson, to laarn tho trado of cabinot maker until 21 yoars old. (Ealtimoro Co. Orphans Court, Liber 2, 1. 283)
