Jerry -

7/17/85-

Summer Cemetery - Mosby Road. Marion, MS

Angie Bessie Jerry Wife B-7.
6/4/1885 - 2/1/1910

Old Marion Cemetery - Marion, MS

Large concrete and brick tomb above ground
almost all legible

Jerry ??? - consort of Abraham

This no doubt grave of Abraham Jerry Wife.

This one of the oldest grave yards in the County
being located near the site of Old Marion, the
original County seat.

Old Vote List - Sumner Co Al 1834 - 1861

J. Jerry voted at Gainesville on March 1, 1841

William Terry ran for J.P. on 12/9/1843
at Black Bluff - Not elected

Thomas B. Jerry Voted at Belmont on 3/4/1858

Beal Jerry Voted at Brewerville on 11/6/1861
so did G.W. Jerry.

Charles K Terry - exact type Terry

T. C Lyle Sr was County Pension (Corpseducts)
Commissioner in 1908 here in
Lauderdale Co. MS

Corpseducts Application files

F. R. J. Terry, in 74th year on 9/5/1908
Lived Lauderdale Co all his life - married
entered service from Copiah Co, MS in 4/1862
36th MS Regiment - Co. B.

Discharged due to imperfect vision
Surrendered at Goussville (Sumter Co) Al.

Did odd jobs. Lived with daughter - wife 64 yrs age

Later Mrs Betty Terry wife of F R J applied
for Widow Pension. They had in August 1878
He died 1/1910

She died on 8/2/1916 with J E Terry her son.
They had 2 sons + 2 daughters

(earlier) ← On another application by her, she lived with her
daughter + she had 4 sons + 3 daughters

Mrs Linda Terry 45 yrs, living at Lucile (Lucile)
in Lauderdale Co applied for Widow Pension on
8/29/1896 against her first husband W.C. Barber
Did not name her present husband. She was referred
to as Malinda Terry in one part of application

all were minors + lived with mother in County of
Lauderdale - J. S. Jerry admin of estate
It was Eliza T. Jerry. No middle initial for
Charles.

Know not your Charles but thought you might
like to have the info.

The Lacy's were in Kenner Co MS as well as
Sumter Co, AL.

Will continue. There are many documents to check

City of Indian Value \$1,000.00

T J Terry on 1874 Landroll and a John Terry
in City of Indian in 1874 also

1840 Census Record - Kemper Co MS

Thomas Terry, Howard H Terry + Calvin Terry

The marriage record 1845-50 are missing. Perhaps
they were md during this period
