Jutt, James B (Estate) December Term 1846: Britt Moore filed two accounts, one for \$70.52 and the other for \$63.00 against the estate - allowed.

Same term: Hogan Adams applied for publication notices to those interested in the estate to appear at the January next court term.

Same term: J A Sanderson^{dec} failed to make annual administration report. Ordered to report from Carroll Co Ms at the January 1847 term of court.

January Term 1847: ~~order~~ Hogan Adams and wife requested order for publication re-estate and citations to all persons interested in said estate - that an application had been filed for dower in the real estate of the deceased. Later same term issued citation to Carroll (Carroll Co. Ms). This probably to J A Sanderson to account for the real estate.

February Term 1847: Citation issued to Joseph A Sanderson admin of estate. First citation to appear returned - not found (in the County).

Same term: Application by H. Adams in right of his wife Ann Adams for an order for suit to be commenced in the name of J B Hancock, Judge of the Probate Court of Lauderdale County - State of Miss., against Joseph A Sanderson admin of the estate of James B Jutt, deceased, and his securities on his bond for removing the negro property belonging to said estate beyond the limit of Mississippi contrary to the statute in such cases and provided granted the first day.

March ~~Same~~ Term 1847: Citation issued for admin to make report.

April Term 1847: Benjamin Carpenter applied to be appointed admin of estate - granted, gave bond of \$1600.00

Securities Harrel Denton and Walter William Jolly.

R McElroy made claim against estate - mentions a John Elliott - ~~granted~~ McElroy granted \$5.00. Had something to do with a land case with R McElroy as attorney.

Same term: Motion made to revoke the letters of administration for Joseph A Sanderson for failing to return account. Revoked.

Jett, James B (Estate) Con't.

June Term 1847: Benjamin Carpenter Admin., presented an inventory of the estate. ordered to the record.

Same Term: Request of guardianship by Mrs Elizabeth R Dunkley Continued

Same Term 1847 Benjamin Carpenter, Admin. made application to redeem the real estate that ~~is~~ was lying in the County of Kemper and sold for taxes in the year of 1846 and bought by James P. Dement.
