Also so I don't have a wife for him but do show a daughter MARY Taylor who may have become the Quinelly wife of John R. The Martha Goins person may be a daughter also from Hamess and Barbara Alice. Glennie's notes has him with 3 daughters, Mary, Martha and Ella and a son Gus.

Notes for BARBARA SKELTON(ALICE):

In the obituary for Wm. Green she is listed as one of 7 daughters.....and living in St. Louis, MO i n April 1929 when he died.

She is buried in Magnolia Cemetery, Meridian in the John Robert and Mary Etna Quinnelly plot, who is one of her daughters...In the 1880 census for Sumner Co.

MS she is out of the houshold. She would have been about 20 and already had given birth to "Gus" in 1877.

I saw in the Magnolia Cemetery office that she was in MO when she died. The tombstone reads "OUR MOTHER" born 1860 and died 1935. This would place her possibly as the first child of Wm. Green and Victoria Ezell who married in 1859. She married a Taylor, may be Hanan Taylor, I am checking with Webb Funeral Home on 10/30/95 to see if they have a funeral record for her and also for the Quinnelly and Goins also buried in the same plot.

Larry 10/31/1995 from Webb said that no record of Alice's parents on his funeral record. But-- 3 daughters are listed, Ella Murray of Ft. Worth TX,. Martha Mathews of St. Louis, MO and Mary Quinnelly, of Meridian, MS show as well as a son, M.A. Taylor of Vimville, MS. He was the informant on the Webb funeral Home . It appears that Martha Mathews became, Martha Goins at some point from the tombstone. I have a Webb record for her and her residence at time of death was Ft. Worth, TX.

I also have a death record for Mary Etna's husband, John Robert Quinnelly from Meridian, Webb Funeral Home. He died July 31, 1935 just 2 mos. before Barbara Alice.

The pall bearers were: Ellis Quinnelly, Homer Quinnelly, Bernard Quinnelly, Leon Quinnelly, Horace Quinnelly all sons except Joe and Clyde Anderson filled in for him to make the six pall bearers. This all per the Webb paperwork. I have a copy of this document.

She was widowed but no husband or parents are shown on the Webb paperwork.

She was living in Ft. Worth, TX when her Mother died in St. Louis, MO in 1935. Ella's 1st husband was a XXX Murray and he was the father of their 2 sons. She was living with one of them in TX when she died. She had remarried after Mr. Mathews to an elderly man in Meridian and when he died

she went to TX to live. No record of what his name was.

Notes for MARTHA JOE TAYLOR:

She may have been married 1st to a Mr. Mathews at the time of her mothers death in 1935, but her tombstone in 1956 shows her as a Goins. In 1935 she was in St. Louis Mo also with her Mother, "Alice" but when Alice died it appears that Martha had left MO. & remarried to J. C. Goins and was living in Ft Worth, TX. Mr. Goins was still alive when she died. No one yet has any information on what happened to

him,

The funeral chrgs. were to J. C. Goins. I have only the burial record from Webb. She is buried in Magnolia Cemetery in Meridian with her Mother, Barbara Alice (Skelton) Taylor, her sister Mary Etna (Taylor) Quinnelly and Mary's husband John Robert Quinnelly.

I believe with certainity that these facts are true, due to the various facts gathered. I have her funeral record from Dutton Funeral Home in Iowa Park TX on file but no parent info is listed. Norma at Dutton's said that this organization used to be called Tanner Funeral Home and they took over in 1989 and the previous owners didn't do a good job on getting family information. She died of lung cancer. The Dutton number for Norma is 817-592-4151

Her husband John"s record is at Webb Funeral Home and he is buried in the same plot in Magnolia. He died 20 yrs. earlier in July, 1935 in Meridian. I have the funeral record from Webb for him as he and Mary were both living there at the time of his death. Her sister, Martha Mathews was living in St. Louis. When Barbara Alice Taylor died. she was staying with Martha in St. Louis. Apparently Martha left St. Louis and had remarried prior to her death.

Mary and John's children were apparantly all living in the Meridian area as they were pall bearers for Alice in Sept. 1935 when her body was sent to Webb for burial. John Quinnelly had died 2 mos prior to his Mother In Law, Alice.

Notes for JOHN ROBERT QUINNELLY:
He is buried in Magnolia Cemetery, Meridian. The Webb funeral home sent me a copy of the funeral record which they handled as John was living in Meridian when he died.
He was a carpenter by trade.

I see that James is not shown as a living brother in the 1947 obituary for William Robert Taylor.

They were living next to a Henry Bynum and his wife Manerva married 26 yrs. who had 2 daughters still at home, Ola and Callie. Ages 16 and 14.

There's a Mary Callie who married James Marion Taylor who was born 1879.

This Callie Bynum would have been born about 1886 so is possible his wife.

Don't have a maiden name for her.

The nicknames for the girls have me confused as I had a Mary, Medie, Sarah and Margaret. So I changed the Mary to Melvina to match the Ranegar wife I found on the 1910 census page house #377 next doo rto Willie and Charlie Anderson. Since Sudie married a Gray, and lived at house 374 and Rissie was in house #373 with Natie, I feel sure that Melvina belongs in this family tree.

Glennie's notes list a daughter Bernice, so even the the census in 1910 shows a Hazel, another daughter may have come along after Hazel.

She apparently was the second wife. Look up the Obituary to confirm. the Obituary shows a date for her husband as Feb. 29th, 1869 but that yr. had no leap date...
Her two girls were named Joyce and Jerl and were single ladies per the 1947 obituary of their father. They were living in Meridian.
