THE WRIGHT FAMILY # I

Affectionately called "Uncle Jimmy Wright" by most everybody in Pine Springs, James Berrygrove Wright came to the community in 1897 when he bought land in Section 4, Township 7, Range 15E. He was 65 years old when he arrived in Pine Springs with his wife Jane and his daughter, Lula. His other nine children had already married and left home.

Uncle Jimmy's ancestors were as follows:

RICHARD WRIGHT - Born in England in 1633, he came to Virginia in the American Colonies where he worked for a big Mottrom Company. He married the boss' daughter, Ann Mottrom in 1656 in Virginia. His son was -

FRANCIS WRIGHT, born in Virginia in 1660, married Ann Washington in Westmoreland County, and died in 1713. His wife was great-aunt of Gen. George Washington. Their son was -

JOHN WRIGHT, born 1682 and died in 1729. His wife was Dorothy Aubrey. John was a surveyor. His son was -

JOHN WRIGHT, JR., born in 1707 in Virginia. He married Elizabeth Darnell. John, Jr. was Chief Justice of Virginia about the time that Washington was made President of the United States. His son was -

WILLIAM WRIGHT, born 1720(?). He was a Captain in the Revolutionary War. He married Judith Amos and they made their home in Rowan County, North Carolina. Their son was -

THOMAS WRIGHT, who was born in 1740. Thomas was also a Captain in the Revolution, fighting with the Colonist under Gen. Nantaniel Greene. He was somewhat of a hero during the war. He married a girl named Martha, but her last name is not now known because the records of Anson (Rowan) County, ^{NC} were burned in 1868 courthouse fire. His son was -
Martha (b. March 25, 1745?)

JOEL WRIGHT, born in Anson County, North Carolina, in 1794. He married Miss Mary Ann Harrington around 1820 and they had ~~ten~~ children before they came to Cuba in Sumter County, Alabama, in 1849. They made the trip in covered wagons. Joel died in Cuba, Alabama in 1868. His 11 children, all born in Anson County, North Carolina, were listed in his Bible as follows:

Jimmy was about 17 when he came to Sumter Co, Ala. from North Carolina with his father. He married not long before the Civil War and had a young son when he joined the Confederate Army and went off with in 1861 in Co. F, 46th Miss. Regiment. He served four years under General Sears and Capt. Wiggins. He spent some time in a Yankee prison at Camp Chase, Ohio. At the surrender of the South, Jimmy was honorably discharged on June 12, 1865. He had to walk home from Ohio. Rufus King and S.B. Denton of Obediah served in the Confederate Army with him.

When Jimmy finally got home, we can only imagine his dismay when he found that his wife had died. She had been dead three years before he returned and he had not known about it. Before the year was out (1865) Jimmy married Mrs. Mary Jane White (did she have any children?) She had been an ~~unmarried~~ ^{unmarried} before she married, but we do not know who her family was, but she was some relation to Judge George Ehrhridge
 I HAVE FOUND NO CONNECTION BETWEEN HER WHITE FAM. AND OUR WHITES

It is not known where Jimmy and Jane Wright lived, but they had eleven children. They may have lived in Sumter County, Alabama, or in Kemper County, Miss. Some of their children were in Kemper County, so it is possible that they lived there. I have not found them in any census until they moved to Pine Springs in 1898 and appear in the 1900 census in Pine Springs. By that time, Jimmy was 65 years old and all their children had grown and left home except 18 year old Lula Wright. That census also shows that Jane had had 11 children, but only 7 were still living. I cannot find any of their children in Lauderdale County census records, for any year.

Some time after 1900 they traveled over to Kewanee, Lauderdale County to visit relatives. Jimmy's grand-niece, Bernice Simmons, a small child at the time, remembers Uncle Jimmy and Aunt Jane's coming to see her parents at that time. It was the only time that she recalls having met Uncle Jimmy and she was impressed with how happy the old couple seemed to be. They were members of the Church of God denomination and were very religious. Bernice recalls that they sat out on the front porch and the old couple sang hymns and she was impressed with how well they sang together.

Uncle Jimmy Wright first came to pine Springs when he bought 80 acres land located in the East 1/2 of the Southwest quarter of Section 4, Township 7, Range 15E. The deed is dated Nov. 16, 1897. Jimmy bought the land from Mike Shea (Shay?), who had married a daughter of Robert and Mary Elizabeth (Lewis) Phillips of Pine Springs. The Wright's son, William, had married into the Phillips family while in Kemper Co., so it may be that the Phillips' family may have had something to do with the Wright's moving to Pine Springs. They certainly knew each other. The question is, why did they go off and leave all their children who must have been living in Kemper County?

The log house Uncle Jimmy had was torn down in 1940's - we built our house on EXACT SPOT AND THAT IS WHERE I LIVE NOW IN PINE SPRINGS

THIS WAS ANOTHER PHILLIPS FAMILY

Jimmy and Mary Jane lived on the place they bought about three years before they (Nov. 10, 1900) sold it to Mr. Hill Wolfe, who lived over above Marion. On Dec. 11, 1901, Jimmy bought the West 1/2 of the Northwest quarter of Section 9 from the M&O River railroad. It was the 80 acres behind where the Pine Springs Gen Store was built in 1905.

In 1903, Jimmy's son Joe Wright bought 80 acres in SE quarter of Section 9 from the Westherfords, and must have moved to Pine Springs at that time. In 1906, Jimmy and Mary Jane sold Joe half of their 80 ares in Sec. 9 to Joe. In 1905, Sammy Bozeman built the Pine Springs store and traded it to Joe Wright for the land he owned in the SE 1/4 of section 9, which was next to his home. Joe owned the store until he sold it to L.L. Ratcliff in 1911 (land moved to marion)

Rev. Sammy Bozeman built the Union Church in Pine Springs about this time and Jimmy and Mary Jane Wright must certainly been members. The Bozeman and Wrights were all members of the Church of God. It was at this time that Janie Smith, born in 189>, remembers visiting Jimmy and Mary Jane with her parents and two sisters to attend revival meetings at the old Union Church. They came to visit the Wrights and go to the protracted meetings for two summers, she recalls. A young girl at the time, she grew up and married Richard D. Glass and lived in Kemper County. She also recalls going to the Church of God Camp meetings at the Campground in Cuba, Alabama.

Jimmy apparently had heart failure in 1914. By the fall of that year he was so ill that he had to sleep in a chair, as he couldn't breathe if he tried to lay down. Bob Stone, who lived between the store and the Lowe farm (his wife was Velma Lowe the daughter of Lon Lowe), was one of the closest neighbors and it fell his lot to 'sit up' with Uncle Jimmy Wright while he was critically ill. He lingered on for over three weeks, sleeping in his chair, with the family expecting him to go at any time. One morning Bob came home from his nightly vigil, tired, sleepy, and

He was so weary, he made the remark, "It looks like we're going to have to hit him in the head with something so he can go on and die and get it over with"

A few nights later, Uncle Jimmy told Mary Jane, "I just feel like tonights' the night. I feell llike I'm going to go on home tonight!"

He slept a while, then, waking, he called Mary Jane to his side.

"I believe I hear Jesus calling!" he said. "Sing to me, Jane, sing me on to Glory! Im about to cross over into the promised land!"

As Mary Jane Sang, Uncle Jimmy Wright passed away. Nobody had any doubt but that he was that night with his Lord and Savior. That was on Dec. 4, 1914. James Berrygrove Wright was 82 years old.

Although we do not know when Mary Jane died, it is said that she lived to be a very old lady. She went blind before she died. She outlived all her children.

One day as she was going out the back steps to her home, she used the door to guide her way. The door swung on its hinges and she fell out the steps, breaking her hip. She was in the bed with much pain for some time after that. The doctors gave her Laudenum to help ease her pain, and she became addicted. She told them to monitor her dose and to start giving her a little less of the medication each day. They followed her instructions and she was able to stop her additction. She was never able to walk again, but spent the rest of her life in a rolling chairs

There is no indication where the old couple were buried. If they were buried at Pine Springs, there was no marker and their graves have been lost.

Born in North Carolina, Frank came to Sumter County, Alabama in the wagon train with his family when he was about fifteen years old (1849). He marrried when he was 24 years old, to Martha Johnson, in Lauderdale County. It is believed that he lived near Lockhart, possibly near Martha's family, before the Civil War. They had one child, a daughter, born before he joined the Confederate Army and went off to fight for the South. His wife died during the war years, in 1862 and was buried at Hickory Grove Baptist Church, in the northern part of Lauderdale County.

Was married near the beginning of the war, her husband was either a draft-dodger or a deserter. He apparently didn't believe in fighting and hid out from the authorities.

One day they came to their house looking for him. He hid in a sweet-potato bank. Ann, with all the dignity she could muster, met them and told them that he was not there. She was very brave, but later she said that she was scared to death. Ann told Alfred that she never wanted that to happen again and that he had to leave and to not come back until the war was over. He left and she didn't see him until after the war. He hid out somewhere, but not at home.

Ann took the baby Sarah Francis, the daughter of her brother Frank, when the mother died and Frank was away fighting. Little Sarah thought that Ann was her mother. After the war, Alfred came back and they decided to move to Texas. She couldn't take Sarah with them, and the four year old girl followed their wagon, crying to go with Ann.

In 1912, Sarah, all grown up and married, went out to Texas to visit her Aunt Sarah. It was the only time she ever saw her aunt after she moved away.

He sold that 80 acres to Rev. Sammy Bozeman in 1905, after having bought the land across from the school that had the store on it from Sammy in 1904. In 1906 his dad sold him more land in the same quarter Section. He sold the store to L.L. Ratcliff in 1911 and the rest of the land to Ratcliff after his father died in 1914. It is believed that Joe Wright moved on to Meridian where he had a job.

from down the road. They attended the Holiness Campground at Cuba, Alabama, some summers, and enjoyed singing the old hymns. The old couple sang together, blending their voices in close harmony, and those that remembered them told how much they enjoyed their songs.

The Wrights endeared themselves to the community, where they came to be called 'Uncle Jimmy and Aunt Mary Jane Wright'. Their children that we have located are given below. Five more are unaccounted for.

1. James B. Wright, Jr., born 1850's? (May have been son of Uncle Jimmy's first wife.) He married Nealie Smith and they lived at Bethel, Kemper County, just over the Lauderdale Co. line. One daughter, Annie Leona Wright (b. 1896), married William Hughes and lived just north of Gumlog Baptist Church near Pine Springs. Mrs. Hughes said that she was one of four children. She said her father was buried at Bethel.
2. Joel T. "Joe" Wright, married Clara A. McDonald, moved to Pine Springs in 1903. ~~More on him later. He later moved to Pine Springs -~~
3. Harve (Harvey?) Wright - nothing is known of him. ^{LIVED IN TEXAS?}
4. William Wright married Fostina Annabelle "Teenie" Phillips (b. 1870) of Kemper Co. Her father was James Phillips, the bro. of Robert of Pine Springs. William Wright was murdered on his wedding night*. Teenie, a schoolteacher, married again in 1894, to Walter Scot Brown, son of David M. Brown and his second wife, Rebecca Richardson, of Drip Off.

- 5 & 6. Twin daughters, Lula ~~or Sula~~ and Lelia Wright, Born 1882. The story of these twins are all mixed up, with conflicting accounts of their spouses and whereabouts. Some say the twins were Sula & Lelia, but Miss Bernice Simmons of Kewanee said one of the twins, Sula ~~or Sula~~, became the 2nd wife of Joⁿ B. McDonald and moved to Texas, where Miss Bernice's mother visited her around 1912, shortly before World War I. Another account says that one of the twins died young.

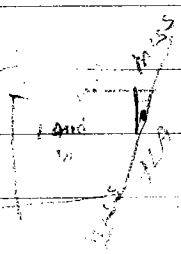
